A&N Administration to organize an attempt to set multiple underwater Guinness World Records at Radha Nagar Beach in mid of March, 2026

Registration invited from certified divers; last date for submission of filled-in Registration Form is Dec. 15

The A&N Administration is organizing an attempt to set multiple underwater Guinness World Records at Radha Nagar Beach, Swaraj Dweep in A&N Islands in mid of March, 2026. The records include:

1. "Largest Flag unfurled underwater"
2. "Tallest human stack underwater"
3. "Longest Human chain underwater"

To participate in the attempt to set the record for "Longest human chain underwater", recreational and certified Scuba Divers are invited.

The event is tentatively scheduled from March 20 to 30, 2026 at Radha Nagar Beach No. 7, Swaraj Dweep, A&N Islands.

Selection Criteria:

- ▶ Only Indian nationals are eligible for this opportunity.
- ▶ Minimum Certification required: Open Water Diver from any recognized WRSTC Training Agency.
- ▶ Minimum logged dives required: 10 or more.
- ▶ Participants need to submit the WRSTC Medical Form with a Doctor's 'Fit to dive' approval on page 3. (The WRSTC Medical Form and Physician's Guide document will be provided upon registration.)
- ▶ Participants must be above 18 years of age.

Preference will be given to:

- ▶ Certified divers with certifications higher than Open Water Diver and more than 10 logged dives.
- ▶ Divers with their own equipment.
- ▶ The A&N Administration will provide diving equipment as required by participants who do not have their own gear, except for Prescription masks, if needed.
- ▶ **Note:** Divers needing Prescription Diving

Masks must bring their own diving masks.

Selection process:

- ▶ A panel of Dive Professionals and ANC will select the final participants. Selected participants will be informed through email about further processes.
- ▶ Participants above the age of 50 years must provide a Medical Fitness certificate.
- ▶ The last date for submitting the Registration Form for selection is 15th December, 2025 by 05.00 PM to email ID: andamantourismscuba@gmail.com.

Operation Castle Bay: Joint ANC & Police operation apprehend six poachers at Tillangchong Island

Andaman & Nicobar Command (ANC), acting on specific intelligence inputs, launched Operation Castle Bay on Nov. 9, 2025 in the remote and uninhabited Tillangchong Island, approximately 320 km from Sri Vijaya Puram. The operation witnessed seamless joint participation of the Indian Army, Indian Navy, Indian Air Force, Indian Coast Guard and Andaman & Nicobar Police, exemplifying exceptional inter-service coordination and unity of effort.

Over six demanding days, ANC & Police personnel conducted intensive

ground and maritime surveillance supported by air assets. The joint team carried out systematic area domination, extensive search operations and close tracking using a sniffer dog, steadily compressing the search zone through persistent action and precise coordination. On Nov. 15, 2025, following sustained ground pressure and aerial reconnaissance, six foreign poachers were successfully apprehended.

Their capture underscores the high operational capability, professionalism and mission-oriented determination of ANC personnel and

collaborating agencies. The operation remains in progress as intelligence suggests the possible presence of additional suspects on the Island. ANC forces continue the mission with renewed momentum to ensure complete sanitization of the area and protection of Tillangchong Island's fragile ecosystem.

15-Day Handicrafts Training for Divyangjan being organized by CRC A&N and Directorate of Industries
