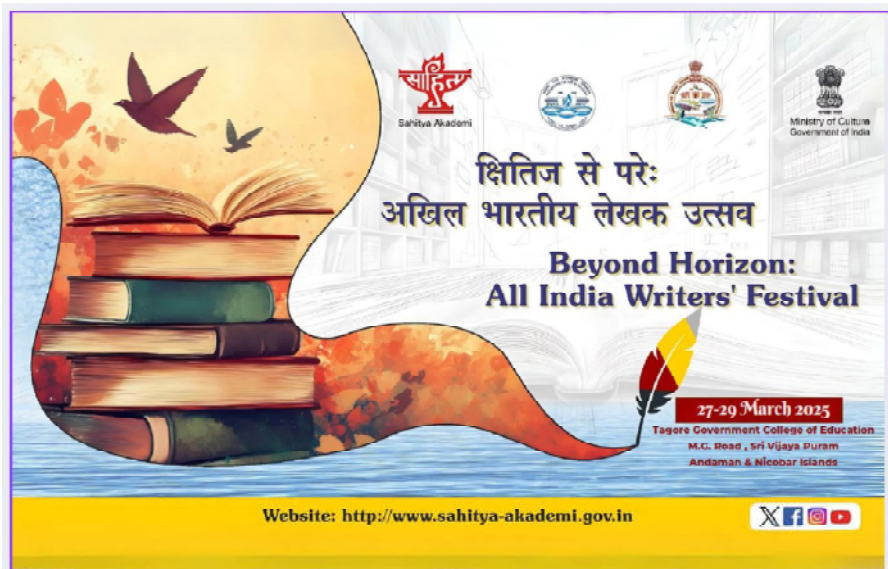

Dr. Dilip Kumar Srivastava, Deputy Commissioner (Seeds-QC) and Co-convenor of the UT Seed Sub-Committee, joined the meeting through hybrid mode. He highlighted a significant concern regarding the reliance of local farmers on seeds procured from the mainland. He expressed the need for locally sourced seeds to reduce the dependency on mainland imports, which could help in better accessibility and availability for farmers. Additionally, he raised an important issue regarding the availability and accessibility of breeder seeds, which are essential for ensuring the production of high-quality seeds.

The key highlight of the meeting was the proposal for the release of the Indian Bay leaf variety Dweep Tej-1, no varieties of Indian Bay leaf have been officially released so far. If approved by the Seed Sub-Committee, Dweep Tej-1 will be the first officially recognized variety of Indian Bay leaf, marking a significant milestone in its cultivation. The bay leaf is not only valued for its culinary use but also has health benefits and is in high demand locally, particularly in the hotel industry.

The Secretary (Agriculture) emphasized that if the Malabar tamarind and Bay leaf varieties are successfully implemented in the fields of the island, it could lead to significant export opportunities. With their unique characteristics and growing demand, both crops could play a key role in enhancing the region's agricultural exports, benefiting local farmers and the UT economy.
