


'You are the One' Campaign






behind ITF Ground in the presence of representatives of contesting candidate and the whole process is videographed.



A&N Police issues advisory on Infostealers via Fake Keygens & Cracks

Port Blair, Apr. 7

Information stealer or infostealer is a malware that is designed to gather information from a system, such as data relating to passwords, browser auto fill information, browser cookies, crypto wallets, and credit cards, which is sent to attackers system. A surge in number of cybercrimes involving infostealers has been noticed. The Infostealer malware is often distributed disguised as cracks and keygens of various unofficially downloaded programs which are used by cybercriminals to spread malware. Infostealers usually operate as malware-as-a-service (Maas), a business model in which the developers of malicious software lease their malware to others for a fee.

◆ Cybercriminals bundle malware with key generators and software cracks and make it available at various dubious sources, such as freeware download websites, free file hosting websites, peer-to-peer (P2P) networks, etc. In some cases, these tools are proliferated together with chosen software installation setups.

◆ Victims download these malicious software cracks and fake keygens to activate licenses for third-party software. Once the infostealer is executed by victims on their systems, sensitive information saved on the systems is collected and sent to a C2 server controlled by attackers.

◆ Infostealer attacks are typically financially motivated. The stolen data is analyzed, and valuable information is organized into a database, which can then be sold on the dark web or through private social media channels.

◆ The information is then used to commit various types of fraud, such as applying for bank loans or credit cards, purchasing items online, or making fraudulent health insurance claims, etc.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard the citizens against infostealers.

➤ Avoid downloading pirated software (and software cracks) from unverified sites and activating the software using any third-party key generators.

➤ Do not trust sources that promise free installation of software with premium features.


➤ Download software from official sources only, check legitimacy of the website before downloading.

➤ Keep your devices secured using a reputed antivirus and/or anti-malware solutions.

➤ Regularly update your browser, operating system, and other applications.

➤ Report any such incidents on the cybercrime.gov.in portal and follow @CyberDost on X, YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, Public, Koo and LinkedIn to know more about safety tips.

PS Kalighat dismantles illicit liquor production network in jungle

In a swift and efficient operation carried out on April 6, 2024, the Kalighat Police successfully confiscated a significant quantity of illicit lehan in Doctor Para jungle. Acting promptly on a tip off, SI Ashok Kumar Baghel, SHO, PS Kalighat, formed a specialized team. The team successfully seized a significant quantity of 400 liters of illicit lehan along with various utensils and timber materials used in the production process. PS CCS intensifies crackdown on illicit liquor; conducts raid in Caddlegunj & Ograbraj area

ORDER

1. Whereas, Section 61 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 provides that with a view to preventing personation of electors, so as to make the right of genuine electors to vote under section 62 of that Act more effective, provisions may be made by rules under that Act for use of Electors Photo Identity Card for electors as the means of establishing their identity at the time of polling; and
2. Whereas, Rule 28 of the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960, empowers the Election Commission to direct, with a view to preventing personation of electors and facilitating their identification at the time of poll, issue of Electors Photo Identity Card to electors bearing their photographs at State cost; and
3. Whereas, Rules 49H (3) and 49K (2) (b) of the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961, stipulate that where the electors of a constituency have been supplied with Electors' Photo Identity Card under the said provisions of Rule 28 of the Registration of Electors Rules, 1960, the electors shall produce their Elector Photo Identity Card at the polling station and failure or refusal on their part to produce those Elector Photo Identity Card may result in the denial of permission to vote; and
4. Whereas, a combined and harmonious reading of the aforesaid provisions of the said Act and the Rules, makes it clear that although the right to vote arises by the existence of the name in the electoral roll, it is also dependent upon the use of the Elector Photo Identity Card, where provided by the Election Commission at State cost, as the means of establishing their identity at the time of polling and that both are to be used together; and
5. Whereas, the Election Commission made an Order on the 28th August, 1993, directing the issue of Electors' Photo Identity Card (EPIC) to all electors, according to a time bound programme; and
6. Whereas, Electors' Photo Identity Card have been issued to approximate 100% electors in the country, and
7. Now, therefore, after taking into account all relevant factors and the legal and factual position, the Election Commission hereby directs that for the **current General Election to the Lok Sabha and Legislative Assemblies of Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha & Sikkim, 2024 and Bye-elections to 26 Assembly Constituencies in 13 States (as per Annexure-I) to be notified on 20.03.2024, 28.03.2024, 12.04.2024, 18.04.2024, 26.04.2024, 29.04.2024, 07.05.2024** all electors who have been issued EPIC are expected to produce the EPIC for their identification at the polling stations before casting their votes. Those electors who are not able to produce the EPIC shall produce one of the following alternative photo identity documents for establishing their identity: -

- (i) Aadhaar Card,
(ii) MNREGA Job Card,
(iii) Passbooks with photograph issued by Bank/Post Office,
(iv) HealthInsurance Smart Card issued under the scheme of Ministry of Labour,
(v) Driving License,
(vi) PAN Card,
(vii) Smart Card issued by RGI under NPR,
(viii) Indian Passport,
(ix) Pension document with photograph,
(x) Service Identity Cards with photograph issued to employees by Central/State Govt./PSUs/ Public Limited Companies,
(xi) Official identity cards issued to MPs/MLAs/MLCs, and
(xii) Unique Disability ID (UDID) Card, M/o Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India

8. In the case of EPIC, clerical errors, spelling mistakes, etc. should be ignored provided the identity of the elector can be established by the EPIC. If an elector produces an EPIC which has been issued by the Electoral Registration Officer of another Assembly Constituency, such EPIC shall also be accepted for identification provided that the name of that elector finds place in the electoral roll pertaining to the polling station where the elector has turned up for voting. If it is not possible to establish the identity of the elector on account of mismatch of photograph, etc. the elector shall have to produce one of the alternative photo documents mentioned in Para 7 above.

9. Notwithstanding anything in Para 7 above, overseas electors who are registered in the electoral roll under Section 20A of the Representation of the People Act, 1950, based on the particulars in their Indian Passport, shall be identified on the basis of their original passport only (and no other identity document) at the polling station.

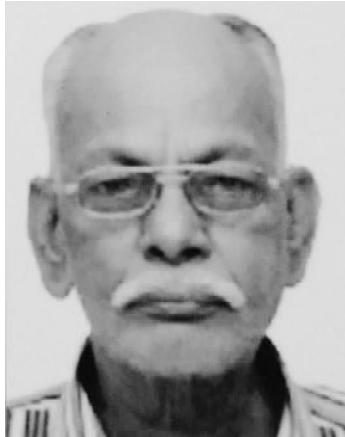
