President graces Convocation Ceremony of Officer Trainees of Indian Forest Service at Dehradun

Human society is making the mistake of forgetting the importance of Forests: President

New Delhi, Apr. 24 (PIB)

Human society is making the mistake of forgetting the importance of forests. Forests are life givers. The reality is that forests have preserved life on earth, said the President of India, Smt Droupadi Murmu while addressing the Officer trainees of Indian Forest Service (2022 batch) at their convocation ceremony at the Indira Gandhi National Forest Academy, Dehradun today.

The President said that today we talk about the Anthropocene Age, which is the period of human-centric development. During this period, disastrous results have emerged along with development. Unsustainable exploitation of resources has brought humanity to a point where the standards of development have to be re-evaluated. She stressed on the importance of understanding that we are not the owners of the earth's resources, but we are trustees. Our priorities should be ecocentric along with anthropocentric. In fact, only by being ecocentric we will be able to be truly anthropocentric, she stated.

The President said that in many parts of the world the loss of forest



resources has occurred very rapidly. Destruction of forests is in a way - destruction of humanity. It is a well known fact that conservation of earth's biodiversity and natural beauty is a very important task which we have to do very quickly.

The President said that human life can be saved from the crisis through conservation and promotion of forests and wildlife. We can repair the damage at a faster pace with the help of Science and Technology. For example, the

Miyawaki Method is being adopted in many places. Artificial Intelligence can help in identifying suitable areas for afforestation and area specific tree species. She stated that there is a need to assess various such options and develop solutions suitable to the geographical conditions of India.

The President said that the chariot of development has two wheels - tradition and modernity. Today human society is bearing the brunt of many environmental

problems. One of the main reasons for this is a special type of modernity, the root of which is the exploitation of nature. Traditional knowledge is neglected in this process.

The President said that tribal society has made the eternal laws of nature the basis of their life. People of this society conserve nature. But, under the impulse of unbalanced modernity, some people consider the tribal community and their collective wisdom primitive. Tribal society has no role in climate change but the burden of its ill effects is disproportionately more on them.

The President said that it is very important to understand the importance of the knowledge accumulated by tribal society over centuries and use it to improve the environment. She stated that their collective wisdom

One sentenced to 10 years rigorous imprisonment under POCSO Act

Shri Subhajit Basu, Hon'ble Special Judge under POCSO Act, North and Middle Andaman District, Mayabunder has delivered a significant judgment in the PS Kadamatala case FIR No. 16/2023 U/s 6 of POCSO Act, 2012, sentencing the accused Rupesh Beck to 10 years of rigorous imprisonment on 15.04.2024.

The Court's decision to impose a 10-year sentence of rigorous

imprisonment on Rupesh Beck reflects the seriousness of the offense and serves as a strong warning against such unacceptable acts. It sends a clear message to society that those who commit crimes against children will be held accountable and faces severe consequences for their actions.

The Investigating Officer in this case, Sub Inspector Silipi Singha worked diligently under the guidance of SI Abdul

Rehman, then SHO PS Kadamatala, with overall supervision by Smt. Geetanjali Khandelwal, IPS, SP (D)N&MA. Their exceptional investigative skills and tireless efforts in collecting evidence demonstrated a high level of professionalism in their duties. can help us move forward on an ecologically sustainable, ethically desirable and socially justifiable path. She stressed that we will have to unlearn many misconceptions and relearn from the ideals of a balanced lifestyle of the tribal society. We have to move forward with the spirit of climate justice.

The President said that the Industrial Revolution in the 18th and 19th centuries increased the demand for timber and other forest products. New rules, regulations and methods of forest use were adopted to cope with the demand. To implement such rules and regulations, the Imperial Forest Service, the predecessor service of the Indian Forest Service, was formed. The mandate of that service was not to protect the tribal society and forest wealth. Their mandate was to promote the objectives of the British Raj by exploiting India's forest resources to the maximum.

Referring to the mass hunting of wild animals during the British period, the President said that when she visits museums where animal skins or severed heads adorn the walls, she feels that those exhibits are telling the story of the decline of human civilization.

The President said that she was confident that the officers of the Indian Forest Service had become completely free from the colonial mentality and outlook of the former Imperial Forest Service. She stated that IFS officers not only have to conserve and augment India's natural resources but also use the traditional knowledge in the interest of humanity. They have to protect the forest wealth by synchronizing modernity and tradition and advancing the interests of the people whose life is based on forests. By doing this, they will be able to make a contribution that is truly inclusive and congenial to the environment.

The President said that the Indian Forest Service has given many officers to the country who have done unparalleled work for the environment. IFS Officers such as Shri P. Srinivas, Shri Sanjay Kumar Singh, Shri S. Manikandan have sacrificed their lives in the line of duty. She urged the Officer Trainees to make such Officers their role models and mentors and move forward on the ideals shown by them.

The President urged IFS Officers to spend time among the tribal people in the field and earn their affection and trust. She said that they should learn from the good practices of the tribal society. She also urged them to take ownership of their responsibilities and become a role model.

Extreme Heat/Heat wave

Do's
For general population

Stay hydrated:
Drink sufficient water whenever possible, even if you are not thirsty.
Thirst is not a good indicator of dehydration.
◆ Carry drinking water when travelling.
◆ Use Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS), and consume homemade drinks like lemon water, buttermilk/lassi, fruit juices with some added salt.
◆ Eat seasonal fruits and vegetables with high water content like watermelon, musk melon, orange, grapes, pineapple, cucumber, lettuce or other locally available fruits and vegetables.

Stay covered:
◆ Wear thin loose, cotton garments preferably light coloured.
◆ Cover your head: use an umbrella, hat, cap, towel and other traditional head gears during exposure to direct sunlight.
◆ Wear shoes or chappals while going out in the sun.

Stay alert:
◆ Listen to the Radio; watch TV; read the Newspaper for local weather news.
◆ Get the latest update on weather on India Meteorological Department (IMD) website at <https://mausam.imd.gov.in>.

Stay indoors/in the shade as much as possible:
◆ In well-ventilated and cool places.
◆ Block direct sunlight and heat waves: Keep windows and curtains closed during the day, especially on the sunny side of your house. Open them up at night to let cooler air in.
◆ If going outdoors, limit your outdoor activity to cooler times of the day i.e., morning and evening.
◆ Reschedule or plan outdoor activities during cooler parts of the day.

Don'ts
◆ Avoid getting out in the sun, especially between 12:00 noon and 03:00 pm.
◆ Avoid strenuous activities when outside in the afternoon.
◆ Do not go out barefoot.
◆ Avoid cooking during peak summer hours. Open doors and windows to ventilate the cooking area adequately.
◆ Avoid alcohol, tea, coffee and carbonated soft drinks or drinks with large amounts of sugar- as these actually, lead to loss of more body fluid or may cause stomach cramps.
◆ Avoid high-protein food and do not eat stale food.
◆ Do not leave children or pets in parked vehicles. The temperature inside a vehicle could get dangerous. (Source: State Health Society, UTHM)

A&N Police issues advisory on infostealers via fake keygens and cracks

Information stealer or infostealer is a malware that is designed to gather information from a system, such as data relating to passwords, browser auto fill information, browser cookies, crypto wallets, and credit cards, which is sent to attackers system. A surge in number of cybercrimes involving infostealers has been noticed. The Infostealer malware is often distributed disguised as cracks and keygens of various unofficially downloaded programs which are used by cybercriminals to spread malware. Infostealers usually operate as malware-as-a-service (Maas), a business model in which the developers of malicious software lease their malware to others for a fee.

⇒ Cybercriminals bundle malware with key generators and software cracks and make it available at various dubious sources, such as freeware download websites, free file hosting websites, peer-to-peer (P2P) networks, etc. In some

cases, these tools are proliferated together with chosen software installation setups.

⇒ Victims download these malicious software cracks and fake keygens to activate licenses for third-party software.

⇒ Once the infostealer is executed by victims on their systems, sensitive information saved on the systems is collected and sent to a C2 server controlled by attackers.

⇒ Infostealer attacks are typically financially motivated. The stolen data is analyzed, and valuable information is organized into a database, which can then be sold on the dark web or through private social media channels.

⇒ The information is then used to commit various types of fraud, such as applying for bank loans or credit cards, purchasing items online, or making fraudulent health insurance claims, etc.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard the citizens against

infostealers.

→ Avoid downloading pirated software (and software cracks) from unverified sites and activating the software using any third-party key generators.

→ Do not trust sources that promise free installation of software with premium features.

→ Download software from official sources only, check legitimacy of the website before downloading.

→ Keep your devices secured using a reputed antivirus and/or anti-malware solutions.

→ Regularly update your browser, operating system, and other applications.

→ Report any such incidents on the cybercrime.gov.in portal and follow @CyberDost on X, YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, Public, Koo and LinkedIn to know more about safety tips.

Disaster Management issues advisory on forest fire safety measures

Port Blair, Apr. 24

The A & N Islands are covered with 81% of tropical rain forests of its total geographical area and it is rich heritage of biodiversity having various eco-systems like marine, terrestrial, coastal, mangroves etc.

Extended summer season may cause forest fire as dry leaves are susceptible and works as good fuel. In past, few forest fires have caused damage of forest, wildlife and environment etc. The residents of rural areas surrounding forest have been requested to follow Do's and Don'ts of forest fire and to safeguard the eco-system of the territory.

Know your forest fire risk:
► Be aware of weather updates, emergency instructions of evacuation orders.
► Teach all household members the technique of

stop, drop and roll methods in case of fire.

► Create a safety zone by removing vegetation/articles that easily catches fire. Consult with local Fire & Forest Departments about making home fire-resistant.

► Keep evacuation checklist and emergency Kit (including a flashlight, mobile phone, batteries, cash, water bottle, dry fruits/snacks, first aid supplies etc.) ready before the fire season sets in.

► Breathe close to the ground preferably through moist cloth to avoid inhaling smoke.

► During any fire activity keep a shovel, water and fire extinguisher nearby to keep fires in check in dry seasons.

► Never leave a fire unattended without completely extinguishing, checking and re-checking the ashes near the

vegetation.

► Do not leave/throw cigarettes, matches, and other smoking materials from moving vehicles near forest area without completely extinguishing it.

► Do not leave behind flammables during outdoor camping in forest areas.

► Avoid any open burning in windy conditions in forest area.

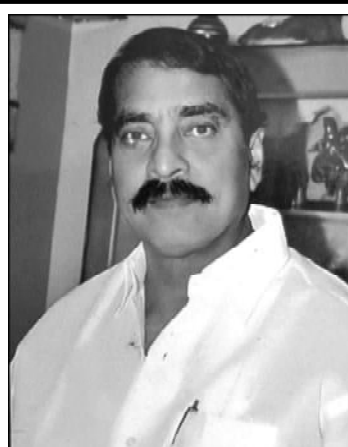
