## Hon'ble Lt. Governor chairs 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting of stakeholders to review modalities to create a proposed SCUBA Diving World Record by Divers in A&N Islands

### Collective efforts of all stakeholders will be instrumental in achieving the objective: Hon'ble Lt. Governor

Admiral D K Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.), Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A&N Islands and Vice-Chairman, Islands Development Agency chaired the second Interactive Meeting at Raj Niwas today to review modalities to create a proposed SCUBA Diving World Record by Divers in A&N Islands to promote the Islands as a premium Diving and Tourist destination in the Indian Ocean Region.

Addressing the stakeholders, the Lt. Governor at the outset expressed his happiness on the enthusiasm shown by the stakeholders on the conduct of the event in A&N Islands. The Lt. Governor underlined the need for adhering to the timeline set for staging the event i.e. in the month of Oct-Nov., 2024. ## Zero tolerance towards encroachment on Govt. land

### District Administration, South Andaman conducts encroachment eviction drives



Port Blair, Apr. 25

The District Administration, South Andaman District carried out extensive eviction drive at Port Blair and Ferrargunj Tehsil. Encroachments done over an area measuring 500 Sq. Mtrs upon Government land at village Bambooflat and 1500 sq. mtrs of land situated at

Dhanikhari village wherein 5 tin structures were constructed have been removed and the land has been restored to Government Khata at Ferrargunj Tehsil.

Similarly, encroachment drives were carried out in Port Blair Tehsil and an area of 60 sqmts at Dollygunj village has been restored to the Government Khata. The encroachment

Do's

For general population

Stay hydrated:

Drink sufficient water whenever possible, even if you are not thirsty.

Thirst is not a good indicator of dehydration.

- ◆ Carry drinking water when travelling.
- ◆ Use Oral Rehydration Solution (ORS), and consume homemade drinks like lemon water, buttermilk/lassi, fruit juices with some added salt.
- ◆ Eat seasonal fruits and vegetables with high water content like watermelon, musk melon, orange, grapes, pineapple, cucumber,lettuce or other locally available fruits and vegetables.

Stay covered:

- ◆ Wear thin loose, cotton garments preferably light coloured.
- ◆ Cover your head: use an umbrella, hat, cap, towel and other traditional head gears during exposure to direct sunlight.
- ◆ Wear shoes or chappals while going out in the sun.

Stay alert:

- ◆ Listen to the Radio; watch TV; read the Newspaper for local weather news.
- ◆ Get the latest update on weather on India Meteorological Department (IMD) website at <https://mausam.imd.gov.in>.

Stay indoors/in the shade as much as possible:

- ◆ In well-ventilated and cool places.
  - ◆ Block direct sunlight and heat waves: Keep windows and curtains closed during the day, especially on the sunny side of your house. Open them up at night to let cooler air in.
- If going outdoors, limit your outdoor activity to cooler times of the day i.e., morning and evening. Reschedule or plan outdoor activities during cooler parts of the day.

Don'ts

Avoid getting out in the sun, especially between 12:00 noon and 03:00 pm.

Avoid strenuous activities when outside in the afternoon.

Do not go out barefoot.

Avoid cooking during peak summer hours. Open doors and windows to ventilate the cooking area adequately.

Avoid alcohol, tea, coffee and carbonated soft drinks or drinks with large amounts of sugar- as these actually, lead to loss of more body fluid or may cause stomach cramps.

Avoid high-protein food and do not eat stale food.

Do not leave children or pets in parked vehicles. The temperature inside a vehicle could get dangerous. (Source: State Health Society, UTHM)

# Precautionary measures during Tsunami

Port Blair, Apr. 25

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to Geological and Hydro-meteorological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts of the world and vulnerable to earthquake and tsunami disasters. Tsunamis are powerful and dangerous natural disasters that can cause devastating damage and loss of life. The Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has requested the general public of A&N Islands to follow the Do's & Don'ts of Tsunami, if it occurs.

- DO's:**
- Pay attention to tsunami warnings: If you live in a coastal area or are visiting one, make sure to be aware of any tsunami warnings issued by the authorities.
  - Move to higher ground: If a tsunami warning is issued, move to higher ground immediately. Do not wait for official instructions or for the wave to arrive.
  - Follow evacuation orders: If authorities issue an evacuation order, follow it immediately. Do not delay or hesitate.
  - Stay tuned to local news: Stay tuned to local news and radio stations for updates on the situation.

► Be prepared: Have an emergency kit ready, including food, water, medications, and important documents.

- DON'Ts:**
- Don't stay in low-lying areas: If you are in a low-lying area and a tsunami warning is issued, do not stay there. Move to higher ground immediately.
  - Don't go to the coast to watch the wave: Tsunamis are not a spectator sport. Stay away from the coast and do not go there to watch the wave.
  - Don't use the beach as a shelter: Do not use the beach or shoreline as a shelter during a tsunami. The wave can be much higher than the normal tide level and can quickly flood the area.
  - Don't use elevators: If you are in a building during a tsunami, do not use the elevators. Use the stairs instead.
  - Don't return to the area until it is safe: After a tsunami, do not return to the area until authorities declare it safe to do so.

# Do's & Don'ts during Earthquake

Port Blair, Apr. 25

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to geological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts (Zone -V) of the world and several great earthquakes have occurred in the past. The severe earthquake that occurred on December 26, 2004 caused horizontal and vertical shift of land mass in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which caused the loss of lives and property of this UT.

Considering the above, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has urged the general public of A&N Islands to adhere to the Do's & Don'ts of Earthquake to mitigate the impact of earthquake and save their precious lives.

**Before Earthquake**

- ⇒ Consult a structural engineer to make your house earthquake resilient.
- ⇒ Fasten shelves securely to walls; place heavy/ large objects on lower shelves. Provide strong support to power and gas appliances.

- ⇒ Prepare an emergency kit with essential items for safety and survival
- ⇒ Develop an emergency communication and evacuation plan for your family and community.
- ⇒ Learn the technique of 'Duck-Cover-Hold'.
- ⇒ Educate yourself and family members about earthquake risk by participating in earthquake safety programmes.

**During Earthquake**

- ⇒ Stay calm do not panic. If you're indoors, stay inside. If you're outside, stay outside.
- ⇒ Don't use matches, candles, or any flame. Broken gas lines and fire don't mix.
- ⇒ If you are in a car, stop the car and stay inside until the earthquake stops.
- ⇒ Duck under a table; Cover your head with one hand and hold the table till the tremors last.
- ⇒ Stay away from mirrors and windows. Do not exit the building while the earth is still shaking.
- ⇒ Move outside as soon as the tremors stop. Do not use

- a lift.
- ⇒ When outside, move away from buildings, trees, walls and poles/ electric lines.
- ⇒ When inside a vehicle, pull over in an open place and remain inside, avoid bridges.

**After Earthquake**

- ⇒ Do not enter damaged buildings.
- ⇒ If trapped in rubble: Do not light a matchstick Cover your mouth with a cloth Tap on a pipe or a wall Sound a whistle
- ⇒ Use stairs and not lifts or elevators.
- ⇒ Move cautiously and check for unstable objects and other hazards above and around you. Check yourself for injuries.
- ⇒ Stay away from beaches. Tsunamis and seiches sometimes hit after the ground stops shaking.
- ⇒ Do not spread and/ or believe in rumours.

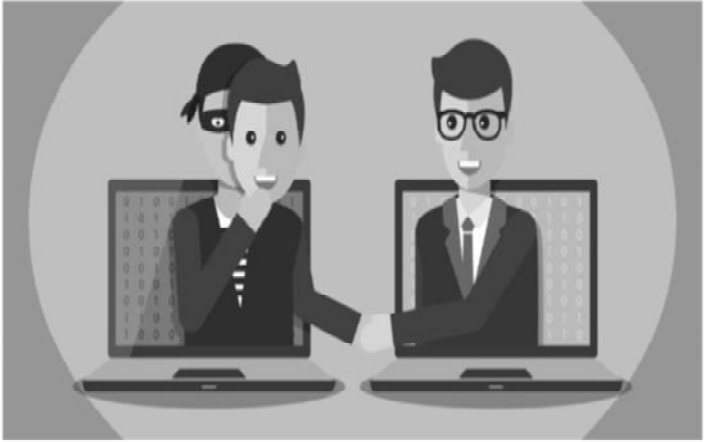
# A&N Police issues public advisory on how fraudsters using armed forces personnel details to perpetrate financial cyber frauds

Port Blair, Apr.25

A new trend in financial cyber fraud has been observed where fraudsters impersonate Indian army personnel to exploit the goodwill associated with the armed forces to siphon off money from innocent victims who have advertised to put their property (House, Flat, Rooms, etc. on rent) on the popular house renting websites/ apps, real estate database website or social media websites, etc.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard the citizens.

- Always remember that entering OTP is a requirement for sending money, not for receiving it.
- If an unknown person makes contact for renting your house, flat, or rooms, etc., try to confirm his/her identity from other available methods/sources.
- Fraudsters typically show urgency in their requests. Scrutinize, if a



request seems too urgent.

- Avoid relying on conversations and identity details provided by unknown people on messaging apps, house renting platforms, etc.
- Scrutinize every transaction request made to you from people unknown to you.
- Captiously perform transactions on various online transaction platforms, aware yourself with all the features a payment gateway.

Port Blair, Apr. 25

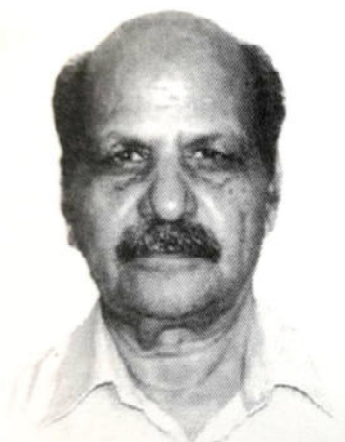

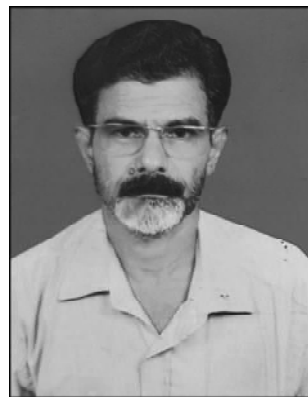
