PM inaugurates 32nd International Conference of Agricultural Economists

Challenges before sustainable agriculture and food systems can only be tackled under holistic approach of 'One Earth, One Family and One Future': PM

New Delhi, Aug. 3(PIB)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the 32nd International Conference of Agricultural Economists (ICAE) at National Agricultural Science Centre (NASC) Complex, New Delhi today. The theme for this year's conference is, "Transformation Towards Sustainable Agri-Food Systems." It aims to tackle the pressing need for sustainable agriculture in the face of global challenges such as climate change, natural resource degradation, rising production costs and conflicts. Around 1,000 delegates from around 75 countries took part in the conference.

Addressing the gathering, the Prime Minister expressed delight that the International Conference of Agricultural Economists (ICAE) is taking place in India after 65 years. He welcomed all the dignitaries on behalf of 120 million farmers, more than 30 million women farmers, 30 million fishermen and 80 million animal

keepers from India. "You are in the land which is home to more than 500 million livestock. I welcome you to the agricultural and animal-loving country of India", Shri Modi said.

The Prime Minister emphasized the longevity of ancient Indian beliefs and experiences about agriculture and food. He highlighted the priority given to science and logic in the Indian agriculture tradition. He mentioned the existence of whole science behind the medicinal properties of food.

The Prime Minister stressed that agriculture grew on the foundation of this thousands-year-old vision, mentioning 'Krishi Parashar', an almost 2000-year-old treatise on agriculture based on this rich heritage. The Prime Minister pointed to a robust system of agriculture research and education in India. "ICAR itself boasts of more than 100 research institutes", he said. He further informed that there are more than 500 colleges for agriculture



education and more than 700 Krishi Vigyan Kendras.

Prime Minister, Shri Modi reiterated India's commitment to global welfare as a 'Vishwa Bandhu'. He recalled India's vision for global welfare and mentioned various mantras put forward by India on various fora including 'One Earth, One Family and One Future', 'Mission LIFE', and 'One Earth One Health'. Shri Modi underlined India's approach of not viewing the health of humans, plants and animals in silos. "Challenges before sustainable agriculture and food systems can only be tackled under the holistic approach of 'One Earth, One Family and One Future'", he said.

"Agriculture is at the center of India's economic policies", the Prime Minister underlined as he mentioned that the 90 percent of small farmers of India who own little land make for the biggest strength of India's food security. He pointed out that a similar situation is prevalent in several developing countries in Asia making India's model applicable. Giving the example of natural farming, the Prime Minister said that the positive results of promoting chemical-free natural farming on a large scale can be seen in the country. He also mentioned a big focus on sustainable and climate-resilient farming in this year's budget as well as developing a complete

ecosystem to support India's farmers.

The Prime Minister also acknowledged the seriousness of the nutrition challenge along with water scarcity and climate change. He presented Shri Anna, Millet as a solution given the superfood's quality of 'minimum water and maximum production'. Prime Minister, Shri Modi expressed India's willingness to share India's millet basket with the world and mentioned the last year being celebrated as the International Year of Millets.

Mentioning the initiatives to link agriculture with modern technology the Prime Minister talked about Soil Health Card,

This initiative, aimed at enhancing TB detection and prevention, focused on high-risk groups including sanitary workers, vendors, and individuals with comorbid conditions. On this occasion, Shri. V. Vetrivelu, Councillor of



Ward No. 19, expressed his gratitude to the Deputy Commissioner (SA) / Chairman, District Health Society for organizing such camp for reaching out at community level for those who are most at risk.

The campaign screened a total of 84 individuals from the identified high-risk groups. It included informative sessions to raise awareness about TB symptoms-such as a persistent cough lasting

more than three weeks, coughing up blood or sputum, chest pain, unexplained weight loss, fatigue, fever and night sweats, and loss of appetite-prevention strategies, and the importance of early diagnosis. On-site screenings were conducted to identify potential cases, facilitate timely treatment, and distribute awareness pamphlets, a press release from DC, SA said.

the possession of IP&T Department. The DC (SA) directed the APWD officials to obtain an NOC from IP&T and prepare an estimated cost for making a parking lot.

During inspection, it was observed that the design of existing road divider at Bathubasti needs to be modified in order to get more space on road. The DC (SA) directed to conduct a field visit to ascertain the feasibility of modifying the existing Bathubasti divider and also to conduct a meeting with NHIDCL for execution of the work.

It was observed that congestion of traffic during school hours near Carmel Sr. Sec. School, K.V-I, Nirmala Sr. Sec. School and VKV at Lamba Line is at the peak. The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman directed that a meeting has to be conducted with the school authorities and a field survey may also be conducted to identify at least two schools to assess the feasibility of using public transport for picking up and dropping off students. Further, the school authorities should allow parents to drop & pickup children from their school campus by identifying separate space inside the campus.

The parking lot in front of VKV at VSI Airport shall be used for parking vehicles from 0700 to 1500 hrs. The DC (SA) directed the Dy. SP/Traffic to prepare a list of vehicles that are supposed to be parked during these times.

The Deputy Commissioner, (SA) directed PBMC officials to conduct meetings with the Principals of Carmel Senior Secondary School and KV-I to surrender a portion of the land and also obtain NOC to prepare an estimated cost for widening the road by approximately 2 meters along the 70-meter stretch and also the drainage in front of KV-1 main gate area and Carmel Senior Secondary School to be covered by concrete slabs that can be used for parking of vehicles.

For Ratnam Market, the Committee directed enhanced cleaning protocols and the creation of designated waste disposal areas. At Bathubasti Vegetable Market, daily cleaning is required, the provision of dustbins for each shopkeeper and clearly defined waste disposal zones. The need for urgent drain cleaning near KV School at DAG Colony was also emphasized to prevent health hazards.
