Each batch of drugs, after its receipt at the warehouses, is tested at laboratories accredited by 'National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories' (NABL). Only after passing the quality tests, the medicines are dispatched to Jan Aushadhi Kendras (JAKs). Any batch not meeting the quality parameters is returned back to the supplier. Only quality medicines are supplied through JAKs. 




