Hon'ble MP raises issue with Hon'ble Minister of Shipping on urgent reconstruction of Panighat Jetty & Slipway Dredging

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 11 Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, has taken up with the Union Minister of Ports, Shipping & Waterways the long-pending issues of Reconstruction of Panighat Jetty and Extension/Dredging of the Slipway at Panighat to address the difficulties faced by the

residents and fishing community residing under the jurisdiction of Hope Town Panchayat.

The MP stated that the Panighat Jetty, built during the British era, collapsed in 2023 and urged the Ministry to initiate necessary immediate steps for reconstruction of the jetty. He also stated that the existing slipway at Panighat, meant to

support local fishermen, has become inaccessible during low tide, forcing fishermen to undertake costly and physically exhausting methods to bring boats ashore for repairs. Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has also requested an urgent technical survey and suitable measures either by extending the slipway or dredging the area to ensure year-

round access, safeguarding the livelihood of the fishing community.

The MP emphasized that swift action by the Ministry will restore vital infrastructure, improve connectivity, and relieve the prolonged suffering of residents and fishermen in the region, a press release from MP Office said.

There's more clarity now on Andaman Nicobar tourism infra development: Jaikar Singh

The second-generation hotelier and director of Symphony Hotels, Resorts & Spas, is among the prominent voices in the island. Jaikar Singh spoke of the evolving tourism landscape shaped by what he calls a "visionary approach" of the Administration.

Govt. launches 'Pashu Aushadhi Kendras' to provide affordable & Generic Veterinary Medicines

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 11 The Government of India has launched a new scheme to improve animal healthcare across the country by opening Pashu Aushadhi Vikray Kendras - medicine stores that will sell affordable, generic veterinary drugs to livestock owners. This

move, under the Livestock Health and Disease Control Program, aims to make quality animal medicines easily available in rural and remote areas and reduce treatment costs for farmers.

These Kendras can be opened by registered Pradhan Mantri Kisan

Samridhi Kendras (PM-KSKs) and Cooperative Societies. To qualify, the applicant must have at least 120 square feet of space (owned or rented), employ a registered pharmacist with a B. Pharma or D. Pharma degree, and hold a drug sale license from the State Drug Control Authority. Only one

Kendra will be allowed per revenue block, with priority given to areas with large livestock populations.

The Government is providing strong financial support. Store operators will get a 20% margin on the selling price (excluding tax) of each medicine. A one-

seizing the opportunity. His pioneering hospitality group owns and operates three island resorts along with a city hotel in Sri Vijaya Puram.

The group's portfolio includes The Shompen in Sri Vijaya Puram - the first private hotel in the capital. Symphony Palms Beach Resort in Swaraj Dweep, Symphony Samudra in Sri Vijaya Puram, and Summer Sands Beach Resort in Shaheed Dweep.

Recently, they secured the rights to operate a shack-cum-restaurant at the popular Corbyn's Cove Beach in an open bidding. The beach restaurant was previously managed by the administration. The venue is now being redesigned ahead of the upcoming tourist season.

"We will transform it into an upscale dining destination with the right entertainment and culinary experiences" said Singh, a graduate of Les Roches International Hospitality School, adding that the goal was to set a benchmark for future developments leased by the island administration.

The company was also expecting to make more breakthrough announcements in the coming months.

As a local stakeholder, Singh emphasised the importance of sustainability, saying, "For us, growth is more about quality than quantity. I take immense pride in being from the Andamans, so every project is personal. We're making bold moves to create immersive experiences rather than simply expanding".

He praised the administration's proactive support. "If your vision is right, they help you make it happen. I would say we now have the most supportive administration," Singh noted, adding that strong measures are in place to ensure infrastructure growth is responsible and sustainable.

Improved logistics, easier access to sustainable building materials, and growing environmental awareness among new-age developers are also helping the cause, he said.

Connectivity to Sri Vijaya Puram has steadily improving, with direct flights from Delhi, Kolkata, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, and Visakhapatnam, as well as seasonal services from Mumbai.

Singh revealed that talks were also underway for charter flights from Italy and other European destinations, calling the development a "potential gamechanger" for Andaman tourism.

"Andaman is not just about diving and snorkelling. We have birding, game fishing, and even the only active volcano in India at Barren Island. The region is vast - even ten days aren't enough to explore it fully. No other destination offers this level of ease for both Indian and international travellers," he said. While several hospitality projects are in the pipeline, Singh was unfazed by the entry of large mainland brands.

"Bigger players will only create more opportunities for islanders, raising living standards and attracting premium travellers with higher spending power," he said.

time incentive of Rs.1.5 lakh is available for Kendras opened in this UT. In addition, a monthly incentive of up to Rs. 20,000 will be given based on how much stock the Kendra maintains and how many medicines it purchases and sells.

Only medicines supplied by the Pharmaceutical and Medical Devices Bureau of India (PMBI) can be sold at these centres. Billing must be done using the official Point-of-Sale (PoS) system. Ethno-veterinary products and certified animal feeds can also be sold. The scheme is jointly implemented by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Ministry of Cooperation, and PMBI. Applicants must apply online through the DAHD portal and pay a fee of Rs. 5,000, which is waived for stores in aspirational areas.

This initiative not only helps farmers by cutting veterinary costs but also supports employment and entrepreneurship through cooperative societies and rural retail outlets. Those running or associated with PM-KSKs or cooperatives are encouraged to apply and take part in improving animal health in their communities. (Source: Deptt. of AH&VS)

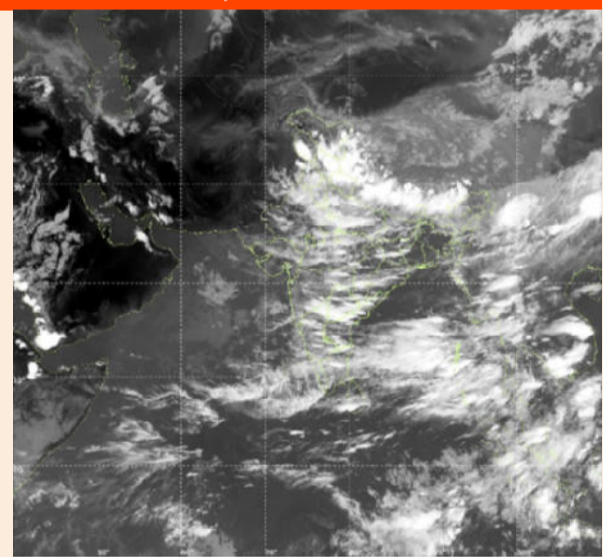
