Flavours to folklore: Homestays in Andaman to redefine island tourism

Currently, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands are home to over 100 registered homestays, a number that continues to grow as interest in experiential and eco-conscious travel rises.

Travellers to the Andaman and Nicobar Islands may soon be treated to a more immersive cultural experience, as local homestays prepare to introduce traditional tribal cuisine and storytelling sessions that delve into the rich history of the archipelago, tourism officials have revealed. The initiative aims to transform homestays into holistic cultural hubs where guests can savour not only the natural beauty of the islands but its indigenous flavours and folk narratives. While much of the region's tribal culinary heritage has faded over time,



officials say a number of unique and flavourful dishes continue to thrive and will be included in curated experiences for visitors. "The whole idea is to promote homestays as a complete package where guests can have lifetime memories, starting from a comfortable stay, exotic cuisines, experience of the countryside, to clean sustainable tourism," an official from the Tourism Department told PTI. "It will also give

impetus to the local economy through community engagement. The islands have also gained national recognition, with 86 per cent of hotels in Sri Vijaya Puram receiving Swachhata Green Leaf Ratings. Storytelling sessions organised by the homestay owners for the tourists about the history of Andaman and Nicobar Islands would be a great value addition in the package," the official

added. The announcement was made during an orientation-cum-interaction programme for registered homestay owners, hosted by the Tourism Department on Friday. The event focused on enhancing the quality and appeal of homestays across the islands. Commissioner-cum-Secretary, Tourism, Ms Chanchal Yadav, who presided over the event, emphasised that

Multi-Specialty Health Camp conducted for Jarawa tribes of Kadamtala & Luis Inlet Bay

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 25 The Directorate of Health Services in collaboration with ANIIMS and AAJVS successfully conducted a Multi-Specialty Health Camp for the Jarawa tribes of Kadamtala and Luis Inlet Bay, North and Middle Andaman. The camp was conducted by Pediatrician, ENT Surgeon, Microbiologist, Dermatologist and other paramedical staff headed by Deputy Director (Tribal Health). The Multi-Specialty Health Camp was held from 18th August, 2025 to 21st August, 2025. The main objectives of the camp were to assess the



health and nutritional status among the Jarawa tribe and to detect the presence of any chronic illness among them and providing in-situ treatment. Altogether, 160 Jarawas were contacted, out of 250 populations at Kadamtala and Luis-in-

let Bay areas and thorough health check-up done, recorded the Anthropometric measurements, carried out a detailed clinical examination of all the Jarawas and blood samples were collected to find out the anaemia among the tribe. The screening and

sensitization of Sickle Cell Anaemia among the Jarawa tribe are done. Some common health issues identified included common cough and cold, Parotitis, ASOM, Tinea corporis/Scabies and Bronchopneumonia in children. Two adult and six children were referred to nearest PHC and GBPH for further investigations and management. Necessary medications were distributed to those in need. Though the weather condition was very adverse, the overall trip was significantly successful, a press release from DHS said.

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 25 The Department of Civil Aviation, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, convened a Pre-Application Meeting with Aviation Operators interested in commencing commercial helicopter services to major tourist destinations across the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The meeting was held at 1600 hrs on 20th August, 2025 at Sri Vijaya Puram and was attended by seven Aviation Companies. Valuable inputs and suggestions were received from the participating operators, which are under examination by the Administration. Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 25 It is for the information of all ration card holders registered in this UT that in compliance to the Targeted Public Distribution System Amendment Order, 2005 made by the Govt. of India implemented with immediate effect by the Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs and initiated the process of e-KYC which is mandatory to be done in every five years. No members shall be eligible to hold a separate ration card before attaining the age of eighteen years, Aadhaar number shall be captured for children below five years of age and e-KYC shall be performed for children

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Andaman and Nicobar Idol Immersion Rules 2018 were published in the Andaman and Nicobar Gazette No. 23 dated 05-03-2018 in compliance of Hon'ble National Green Tribunal order dated 06-10-2017 in O.A 51/2016/EZ. The Rules framed covers the general guidelines idol making, ban on use of synthetic colors, height of super structures and idols. In this connection, all the Idol makers and Puja Committees are hereby directed to follow the guidelines for idol immersion as mentioned below:

- ◆ Idols should be made from natural materials as described in the holy scripts. Use of traditional clay for idol making rather than baked clay, Plaster of Paris (POP) etc. shall be encouraged, allowed and promoted.
- ◆ There shall be a complete ban on the use of POP in idol making till it is established that the POP has no negative impact on the water quality and aquatic bio-diversity.
- ◆ Painting of idols should be discouraged. In case idols are to be painted, water soluble and non-toxic natural dyes are to be used.
- ◆ There shall be a complete ban on the use of synthetic colour for painting of idols that would require immersion as part of final ritual of the festival.
- ◆ The height of the super structure of the idol shall be less than 40 ft. and the idol also shall not exceed 20ft in height.
- ◆ Materials used in worship like flowers, vastras(clothes), decorative materials (made of paper and plastic) etc. should be removed before immersion of idols. Biodegradable materials should be collected separately for recycling or composting at designated sites whereas the non-biodegradable materials should be collected separately for disposal in sanitary landfills or as prescribed by the local Municipal Authority or local body. Clothes may be sent to local orphanage(s).
- ◆ Idol Immersion should be done between low tide line and high tide line(irrespective of its depth) in a identified places with permission of District Administration only.
- ◆ Single use plastic should not be used during celebration.
