## Aerial Pathways: Helicopter Services Set to Revolutionize Andaman Islands' Connectivity

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration is seeking interest from Indian aviation companies to launch helicopter services connecting Sri Vijaya Puram with 11 islands. The initiative aims to bolster tourism and provide more travel options, leveraging existing infrastructure without government subsidies, and ensuring efficient and flexible transportation.

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration has issued a call for Expressions of Interest (EOI) from Indian aviation companies to introduce commercial helicopter services spanning 11 islands from Sri Vijaya Puram. This monumental move



could redefine connectivity in the archipelago, benefiting both tourism and local travel.

This initiative aims mainly at islands like Shaheed Dweep and Swaraj Dweep, with strategic stops including the Barren Island volcano. It is also set against robust existing infrastructure around Veer Savarkar International Airport, reflecting a significant step in regional transport advancement.

Envisioned as a purely commercial project, the plan excludes government subsidies, placing responsibility on operators for full aviation compliance. (Source: www.devdiscourse.com)

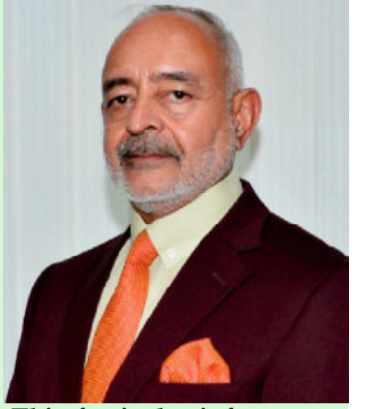
On the auspicious occasion of Raksha Bandhan, I extend my heartiest greetings and best wishes to all residents of our Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

### District Administration, SA imposes fines against illegal extraction and dumping of Earth

During a recent field inspection by the revenue staff at Austinabad village, revenue officials detected unauthorized activities involving the

extraction, transportation and dumping of earth, carried out without the necessary permission. A fine of Rs. 1,00,000 has been imposed on the violators.

### District Administration cracks down on illegal stone crusher operation in South Andaman

Acting on a complaint regarding the illegal functioning of a crushing unit and excavator without valid clearance from the Pollution Control Board, a team of revenue



officials conducted a surprise inspection. The stone crusher unit, located in Prothrapur village, was found to be operating in violation of environmental norms. The unit was immediately sealed, and both the stone crusher and the

excavator found at the site were seized. Additionally, the structure housing the crushing unit was demolished.

**Veterinary Health and Infertility Camp conducted at Ranchi Basti**

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS), Andaman and Nicobar Administration, conducted a Veterinary Health and Infertility Camp on August 7, 2025, in Ranchi Basti, Ward No. 15, under the jurisdiction of the Veterinary Hospital, Junglighat. The initiative aimed to address infertility issues in cattle and provide essential healthcare services to enhance livestock productivity and support farmers' livelihoods.

A number of cattle, including adult cows, heifers, and calves, were examined and treated. Veterinary teams diagnosed one case of pyometra (metritis) and provided targeted treatment. To support animal health and productivity, 3 kg of Growmin Forte (mineral supplement), 1 kg of MilkUp (milk production enhancer), and 1200 ml of dewormer were distributed. These interventions addressed reproductive and health challenges, ensuring improved outcomes for local livestock.



The camp was held at farmers' premises, facilitating direct access to veterinary services for the Ranchi Basti community. Veterinary experts provided guidance on animal care, emphasizing the importance of timely treatments and proper nutrition to enhance fertility and milk production. The initiative equipped farmers with resources and knowledge to sustain healthy livestock populations. This effort reflects the AH&VS Department's commitment to improving livestock health and supporting rural economies in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The active participation of farmers in Ranchi Basti underscores their dedication to adopting veterinary best practices. districts of the A&N Islands. While officers from South Andaman attended the session physically, participants from North and Middle Andaman and Nicobar districts joined the programme virtually.

Ms. Jagtap Kalyani Rajendra, Director of Fisheries inaugurated the programme. Speaking on the occasion, she emphasized the importance of sensitizing fisheries officials on coastal security matters and highlighted the crucial role played by the Department of Fisheries in maintaining vigil along the coastline. She also underlined the importance of coordination between multiple stakeholders like Police, Fisheries, other coastal security agencies and coastal communities to build an integrated coastal surveillance network. She urged all officers to remain alert, proactive, and responsive in identifying and reporting any suspicious activity during their field visits and interactions with fishermen.

Further, Shri M K Shukla, Deputy Superintendent of Police (DySP), Police Marine Force, Sri Vijaya Puram, addressed the participants and elaborated on the role of the Police Marine Force in ensuring coastal security. He stressed the importance of field-level awareness and quick response, stating that many untoward incidents could be prevented through timely alertness and effective inter-agency coordination. He urged officials to remain alert and promptly report any suspicious activities or potential threats encountered during their field duties, particularly in and around Fish Landing Centres and harbours and inform found suspicious activities to the Police Marine Force. He also informed the Department that thorough verification of Fishermen ID Cards will be carried out at Fish Landing Centres to enhance the security of the Islands. Additionally, he recommended that officials to encourage fishermen venturing into distant waters to operate in pairs to ensure greater safety during fishing activities. Shri Gireesh Kumar, Inspector (PMF) also spoke on the occasion.

The programme also included an interactive session where officials shared field-level challenges related to coastal surveillance. The prominent ground issues of Fish Landing Centres such as lack of monitoring infrastructure and the need for better community engagement were discussed in detail with the police team. Suggestions were made to strengthen security through regular joint patrols, community sensitization drives, and improved communication channels between fisheries officials and the police marine force.

The awareness programme ended on a positive and constructive note, with all participants reaffirming their commitment to safeguarding the maritime boundaries of the Islands, a press release from Department of Fisheries said.

**Illegally sawn timber seized by Swaraj Dweep Forest Division**

During routine joint patrolling operation, the forest officials of John Lawrence Range and Swaraj Dweep Range under the Swaraj Dweep Division successfully detected and seized illegally sawn timber of Berrya Ammonilla tree (locally known as Saal) on Aug. 6, 2025.

The operation was led by Dy.Ranger, Shri Simasalam, supported by Forest workers. The team conducted an intensive combing operation, leading to discovery of 43 pieces of illegally sawn Saal timber measuring 0.404 Cum. On witnessing the

offenders escaped deep into the forest and could not be apprehended. Further, during a month long patrolling operation carried out by the Mobile squad team led by Dy.Ranger, Shri Simasalam and Shri. Eswar Hemrom, Forester in various islands under Swaraj Dweep Forest Division, a total of 487 nos of plastic traps laid by poachers were destroyed and saved precious lives of wildlife by releasing of 3 nos. Spotted Deer and 2 Nos. Wild Boar that got trapped in the traps which was laid in the forest area, a press release from DFO, Swaraj Dweep said.

# India well-equipped to tackle evolving online harms and cyber crimes; Government to Parliament

## India's Multi-Layered Cyber Response System Combines Laws, Institutions, and Public Outreach to Tackle Cyber Crimes and Deepfakes

### Backed by IT Act, BNS, and Key Agencies, India Stands Prepared to Counter Evolving Digital Threats

New Delhi, Aug. 8 (PIB)

Government is conscious of the threats posed by deepfakes powered by Artificial Intelligence (AI), including synthetic audio, video and text. Such content can seriously impact a person's dignity, reputation, and right to privacy. It also raises concerns about platform accountability.

With an aim to ensure an open, safe, trusted and accountable cyberspace for users, Government of India has enacted the following laws that address various aspects of the deepfake challenge:

**The Information Technology Act, 2000 ("IT Act")**

Covers offences like identity theft (section 66C), impersonation (section 66D), privacy violations (section 66E), publishing or transmitting obscene or sexually explicit content (sections 67, 67A)

Provision to issue blocking orders to intermediaries for blocking access to specific information/ link (section 69A)

Provisions to issue notice to intermediaries for removal of information being used to commit unlawful act (section 79)

**Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 ("IT Rules, 2021") - Ensuring Platform Accountability:**

- Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology ("MeitY"), after extensive consultations with relevant stakeholders, notified the IT Rules, 2021 (amended in 2022 and 2023) to address emerging harms from misuse of technologies, including AI.

- The Rules mandate intermediaries to exercise due diligence and prevent hosting or transmission of unlawful content by themselves or their users.

**Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 ("DPDP Act")**- Ensures that personal data is processed lawfully by the Data Fiduciaries (including AI companies) with user consent and reasonable security safeguards. Deepfakes using personal data without consent can attract penalties under this Act.

**Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 ("BNS")**- Section 353 aims to curb the spread of misinformation and disinformation by penalizing the act of making false or misleading statements, rumours, or reports that can cause public mischief or fear. Organised cybercrimes involving deepfake content can also be prosecuted under section 111.

These Acts and Rule-making thereunder, as applicable, remains technology-neutral - as the provisions are applicable irrespective of whether the content is AI-generated or not. So, AI-based harms are also actionable under current laws.

Government actively engages with stakeholders and social media platforms to ensure strict implementation of existing laws, including in cases involving AI-generated harms.

- In this direction, Advisories dated 26.12.2023 and 15.03.2024 were issued through which intermediaries were reminded about their due-diligence obligations outlined under IT Rules, 2021 and advised on countering unlawful content including malicious 'synthetic media' and 'deepfakes'.

These advisories include inter-alia the following directions that-

- Intermediaries should identify and remove misinformation or information that impersonates another person, including those created using deepfakes.
- Users must also be made aware that such content may be inaccurate or misleading.
- Intermediaries must comply with the orders of the Grievance Appellate Committee within the timeline mentioned in the order and publish a report.
- Unreliable or under-tested AI models or algorithms, etc. should be available for use in India only after appropriately labelling the possible inherent unreliability of the output and users must be explicitly informed about such unreliability.

India's multi-layered cyber response ecosystem includes institutional, regulatory, reporting, and public awareness mechanisms to address cyber crimes, user grievances, and unlawful content, including deepfakes:

- **GACs** - Provide an appellate forum at the Central level to challenge decisions of intermediaries.
- **Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C)** - Coordinates actions related to cyber crimes across States. Empowers agencies to issue notices for removal or disabling access to unlawful content including deepfakes under the IT Act read with IT Rules, 2021.
- **SAHYOG Portal** (managed by I4C) - Enables automated, centralized removal notices to intermediaries. All authorised agencies across India use it to request removal of unlawful content.
- **National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal** - Citizens can report incidents through this portal at <https://cybercrime.gov.in> which has special focus on cyber crimes against women and children. Deepfakes, financial frauds, and content misuse are all reportable. A helpline number 1930 is also functional.
- **CERT-In** - The Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In) regularly issues guidelines on AI-related threats and countermeasures, including deepfake. CERT-In has published an advisory in November 2024 on deepfake threats and measures that need to be followed to stay protected against deepfakes.
- **Police** - Police officers investigate the cyber crimes.
- **Awareness campaigns** - MeitY observes the Cyber Security Awareness Month (NCSAM) during October of every year, Safer Internet Day on 2nd Tuesday of February every year, Swachhta Pakhwada from 1st to 15th February of every year and Cyber Jagrookta Diwas (CJD) on 1st Wednesday of every month by organising various events and activities for citizens as well as the technical cyber community in India.

India's cyber legal framework, backed by the IT Act, BNS, and institutions like GAC, CERT-In, and I4C, is well-equipped to tackle evolving online harms and cyber crimes.

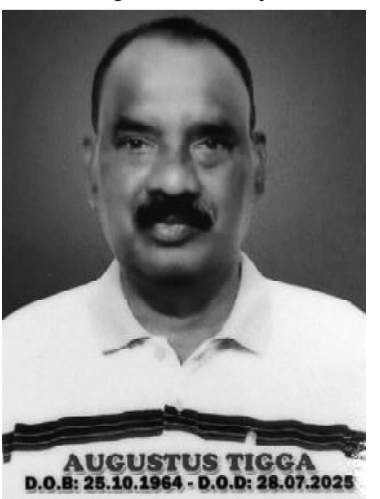

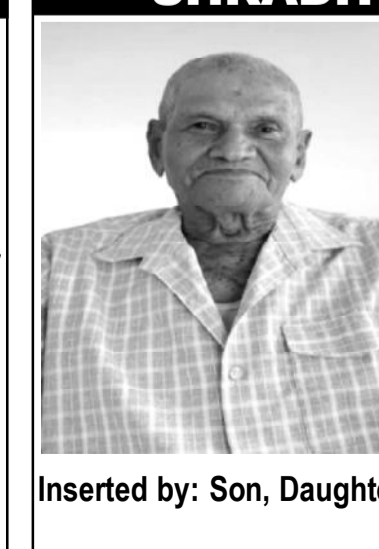
