# A&N Administration invites Expression of Interest for Commercial Helicopter Services in A&N Islands

## Helicopter Service to boost tourism & connectivity across the Islands

Sri Vijaya Puram, Aug. 4

The Department of Civil Aviation, A&N Administration, in its endeavour to enhance connectivity to major tourist destinations in A&N Islands, has invited Expression of Interest (EOI) from registered Indian aviation operators for the introduction of commercial helicopter services across Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

This initiative aims to provide reliable air transport facilities for tourists visiting popular destinations across the Andaman group of Islands, thereby improving accessibility and enhancing the overall visitor experience. The helipad infrastructure at key locations-Swaraj Dweep, Shaheed Dweep, Baratang, Rangat, Mayabunder, Diglipur, Long Island, Smith Island, Little Andaman, Chidyatapu and Wandoor will be made available to the



selected operator(s) for operating commercial services from Sri Vijaya Puram. The services will also be available to local residents.

As a unique offering, tourists will also have

the opportunity to enjoy the aerial view of India's only active volcano 'Barren Island', along with breathtaking aerial view of pristine beaches, emerald forests, and the Island's rich

biodiversity.

The services are proposed to be introduced on a No-Cost-No-Commitment (NCNC) basis. Based on the inputs and interest received through this EOI, a Request for Proposal (RFP) shall be issued to finalize operators for launching this service on identified routes ahead of the upcoming tourist season.

Interested operators are encouraged to participate in this ambitious initiative aimed at strengthening last-mile connectivity and promoting sustainable tourism in Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The EOI document is available under the 'Announcement' section of the A & N Administration's website [www.andaman.gov.in](http://www.andaman.gov.in). The last date for submission of EOI is 19<sup>th</sup> September, 2025 by 1500 hrs. The camp, held at farmers' premises, was led by Dr. Ramakrishnan, Senior Veterinary Officer, with supporting



staff from the Veterinary Hospital. The initiative aimed to address infertility issues in cattle and provide general healthcare services to enhance livestock

productivity and support the farming community.

A total of 31 cattle were examined and treated, including 20 adult cattle, 10 calves, 27

# Andaman Launches Project To Revive Spice Route, Boost Local Cultivation

## A total of 1.25 lakh spice saplings are set to be planted between August and September

In a significant move toward revitalising the centuries-old spice route and boosting Indigenous production, the Andaman and Nicobar administration has launched an ambitious project titled 'Spice Pravah', a top official said on Saturday.

In an interview with PTI, Chief Secretary, Dr. Chandra Bhushan Kumar said, 'As we know, spices are deeply woven into our culture and gastronomic traditions. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands-historically connected to the global spice trade route since the Chola Empire and later leveraged by colonial powers-are now capitalising on their natural advantages to expand spice



cultivation.' With an average annual rainfall of 3,400 mm spread across 130 days and a climate highly conducive to spice production, the region offers ideal conditions for growing a wide variety of spices, he added.

Highlighting the

underutilization of this potential, Dr. Kumar said, 'Though spices like cinnamon, clove, and black pepper have been grown here, they were cultivated in limited quantities primarily for local use. This new initiative marks a strategic shift towards large-scale

production to meet both domestic demand and reduce dependency on imports'. Under the Spice Pravah' protect (Spice Promotion by Integrated Cultivation & Enhancement - Spice, Promotion of Resilient Aromatic Value Chains & Holistic Farming-Pravah), the administration has outlined a comprehensive, long-term plan that integrates both government agriculture farms and enthusiastic private, farmers.

A total of 1.25 lakh spice saplings are set to be planted between August and September. The breakdown includes 70,000 cinnamon trees, 50,000 black pepper plants and around 1,000

enrolment campaign, led by Anganwadi and ASHA workers, aims to reach out to all eligible pregnant and lactating women and ensure their timely registration under the scheme. PMMVY provides financial assistance to support nutritious diets and

improve health seeking behaviour amongst the Pregnant Women & Lactating Mothers (PW&LM), along with promoting positive attitudes toward the girl child.

The PMMVY offers cash incentives as partial compensation for wage

loss to enable mothers to rest before and after delivery of the first child. Since the scheme's inception and up to 31<sup>st</sup> July, 2025, more than 4.05 crore beneficiaries have been paid the maternity benefit (at least one instalment) amounting to

female cattle, and 1 heifer. Veterinary teams diagnosed and treated specific conditions, including one case each of Cervicitis, Metritis, Anoestrus, and Mastitis. Treatments included administration of medications such as Buserelin Acetate injection, Amoxycillin with Sulbactam injection, Meloxicam, Albendazole Liquid Dewormer, and Oxytocan Liquid Dewormer. Additionally, digestive and mineral powder supplements were provided to improve animal health, and milk production enhancement powder was distributed to support dairy output.

The camp emphasized the importance of targeted veterinary interventions to address reproductive challenges and improve livestock health, enabling farmers to achieve better economic returns. By providing on-site treatments and supplements, the initiative addressed immediate health concerns while promoting sustainable animal husbandry practices.

This effort underscores the AH&VS Department's commitment to enhancing livestock health and productivity in the A&N Islands. The active participation of farmers in Delanipur highlights their dedication to improving animal welfare. The Department plans to continue such outreach programs across other wards to ensure access to veterinary services, aligning with the A&N Administration's vision of supporting rural livelihoods and sustainable agricultural development, a press release from Deptt. of AH&VS said.

Oval Test: India beats England by thrilling 6 runs to level Anderson-Tendulkar Trophy Series 2-2

London, Aug. 4

India today pulled off a thrilling six-run win against hosts England in the final Cricket Test of the Anderson-Tendulkar Trophy at the Oval in London to level the five-match series 2-2. Chasing a target of 374 set by India, the Hosts were all out for 367 in their second innings on Day 5 as Visitors began the day on the offensive with Mohammed Siraj striking twice and Prasidh Krishna bagging another wicket to put the game on a knife's edge. Ultimately, it was Siraj who picked



up the last wicket as India won the game. Siraj was the star of the match with a nine-wicket haul, including five in second innings. Earlier, the hosts had resumed their second innings at 339 for 6.

Team India had posted an impressive

396 in their second innings. In the first innings, England were bowled out for 247 in reply to India's 224. Mohammed Siraj was declared the player of the match. Shubman Gill and Harry Brook were both named the players of the series.

nutmeg trees. All saplings will be cultivated in government nurseries to ensure quality and uniformity.

The initiative has received technical and Institutional support from the Central Island Agricultural Research Institute (CIARI), the Botanical Survey of India, and other government research bodies. The administration also plans to implement intercropping strategies by utilising available space within existing coconut plantations for spice cultivation, he said.

'Over the next four years, we expect significant spice yields that will not only support local consumption but also contribute to the national supply chain,' the Chief Secretary added. The future interventions under 'Spice Pravah' is to establish eight Spice Collection Centres across eight agricultural zones to support processing and value-added product development, provision of training and technical support to farmers.

A dedicated core team has already undergone a five-day Intensive training at the Indian Institute of Spices Research (IISR), Kozhikode. Focus on branding, GI tagging, and developing a robust marketing network to help Island-grown spices gain recognition in international markets.

With the 'Spice Pravah' project, the Andaman and Nicobar Administration aims to reclaim its historical legacy in the spice trade, promote agricultural self-reliance, and generate economic opportunities for local communities, he added. Rs.19,028/- Cr. through direct benefit transfer in their bank/post office accounts. The Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana is a centrally sponsored scheme under Mission Shakti's sub-scheme 'Samarthya', providing direct financial assistance through the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) mode. Under PMMVY, a cash incentive of Rs.5,000 is provided in two installments for the first child, and Rs.6,000 is provided in one installment post-birth for the second girl child, in accordance with Mission Shakti Scheme Guidelines. The scheme aims to improve health-seeking behaviour among Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers and ensure better maternal and child health outcomes across the country.

The implementation of the Scheme is done by officials of States and UTs through their field functionaries using the new Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana Software (PMMVYSoft) that was launched in March, 2023. Under PMMVYSoft, Aadhaar authentication through UIDAI is done digitally and National Payment Corporations of India (NPCI) verification is ensured so that funds are directly transferred to their DBT-enabled Aadhaar-seeded bank or post office accounts. A number of reforms have been introduced in the PMMVY portal, to ensure smoother delivery and greater coverage of the scheme, such as introduction of Integrated Grievance Module, Multi-lingual and Toll-free PMMVY Helpline (14408), Aadhar-based biometric authentication using Facial Recognition System (FRS) and Due-list of potential PMMVY beneficiaries.

So that the supply of these medicinal plants can be made accessible. Wherein, both the parties identify common areas of cooperation to harness their respective

# Scientists use nanoscale geometry for colors shift, making way for wearable tech

Scientists have now found a way to harness a property known as structural coloration to create tunable color-shifting materials using tiny plastic beads that can be used for wearable sensors, anti-counterfeit tags, display technologies and even eco-friendly paints. The colour of the peacock's feathers change depending on how you look at it, varying between shimmering blues and greens. Similar effect is observed in the radiant wings of a butterfly. These are not colors made from paint or pigment, but from the structure of the surface itself.

Researchers at the Centre for Nano and Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS), Bengaluru, an autonomous institute of Deptt. of Science and Technology (DST), have uncovered how structural colors arising from nanoscale geometry can be finely tuned by varying both the size of colloidal spheres and the angle of light incidence.

At the heart of this breakthrough are polystyrene nanospheres, each about 400 nanometers wide-roughly a thousand times smaller than a grain of sand. These spheres naturally arrange themselves into a flat, hexagonal pattern when floated on water-a bit like a molecular-level jigsaw puzzle. This self-assembly, driven by simple surface forces, results in what the scientists call a close-packed monolayer.

Once this tiny layer is formed, the researchers use a precise method called reactive ion etching-a kind of nano-scale sandblasting-to gently shrink the spheres without disturbing their neat arrangement. This size reduction leads to a "non-close-packed" layout. Light behaves differently as it hits the altered surface.

When light reflects off this nanostructured layer, its interaction with the tiny spheres causes certain wavelengths (colors) to be amplified or diminished. By tilting the surface or changing the viewing angle, the reflected color shifts-typically towards blue. This phenomenon is predictable and tunable due to the way in which the spacing and size of the spheres affect light's path.

Unlike ordinary colorants, which fade over time or under sunlight, structural colors are durable and vibrant. This makes them ideal for a host of futuristic applications.

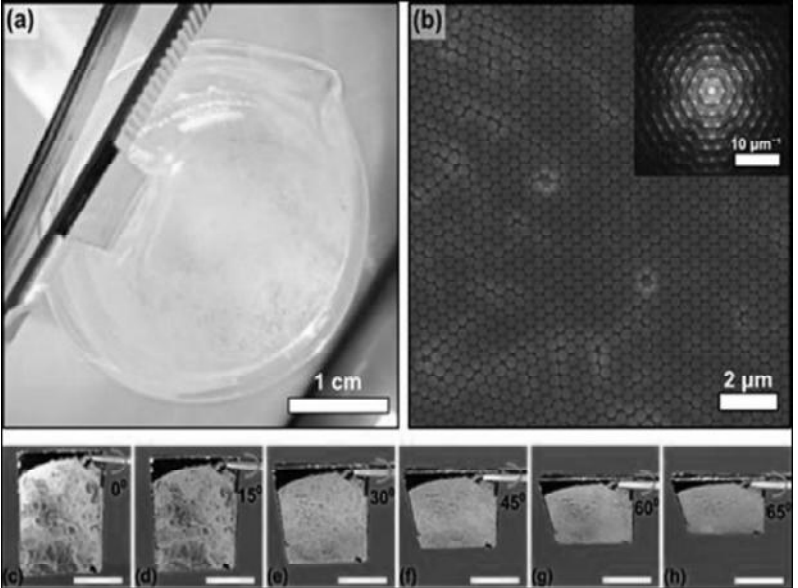

The research stands out for its scalability. The scientists used a cost-effective, "bottom-up" technique-letting nature carry out the self-assembling of the tiny particles organize. A little etching unlocks their ability to dance with light.

This work helps understanding and manipulating the fundamental ways in which light interacts with matter. By showing how slight changes in geometry can lead to dramatic visual effects, the CeNS team has opened the door to custom-designed optical materials that don't rely on harmful dyes or complex fabrication processes.

Their study, recently published in the Journal of

Applied Physics, explores how size-reduced monolayers of self-assembled polystyrene (PS) nanospheres exhibit angle-dependent optical properties due to collective light-matter interactions within the monolayer.

This research underscores the efficacy of colloidal self-assembly at the air-water interface, combined with reactive ion etching, in fabricating large-area, size-tunable monolayers of polystyrene nanospheres.

It provides an approach for developing advanced materials with customizable optical characteristics by elucidating the relationship between structural parameters and optical response. (Source: PIB)

# New pocket-sized sensor can detect a silent threat in the air

A new low-cost sensor can help detect toxic sulfur dioxide ( $\text{SO}_2$ ) gas responsible for respiratory irritation, asthma attacks, and long-term lung damage, at extremely low concentrations.  $\text{SO}_2$  is a toxic air pollutant commonly released from vehicles and industrial emissions, and even minute exposure can cause serious health issues and long-term lung damage. It is hard to detect before it has an adverse effect on health. Monitoring  $\text{SO}_2$  levels in real-time is crucial for public safety and environmental protection, yet existing technologies are often expensive, energy-intensive, or unable to detect the gas at trace levels.

To overcome this, scientists from Centre for Nano and Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS), Bengaluru, an autonomous institute of Deptt. of Science and Technology (DST), fabricated a sensor by combining two metal oxides -- nickel oxide (NiO) and neodymium nickelate ( $\text{NdNiO}_3$ ), through a simple synthesis process. While NiO acts as the receptor for the gas,  $\text{NdNiO}_3$  serves as the transducer that efficiently transmits the signal, enabling detection at concentrations as low as 320 ppb, far surpassing the sensitivity of many commercial sensors.

To demonstrate the capabilities of this material, the team led by Dr. S. Angappane developed

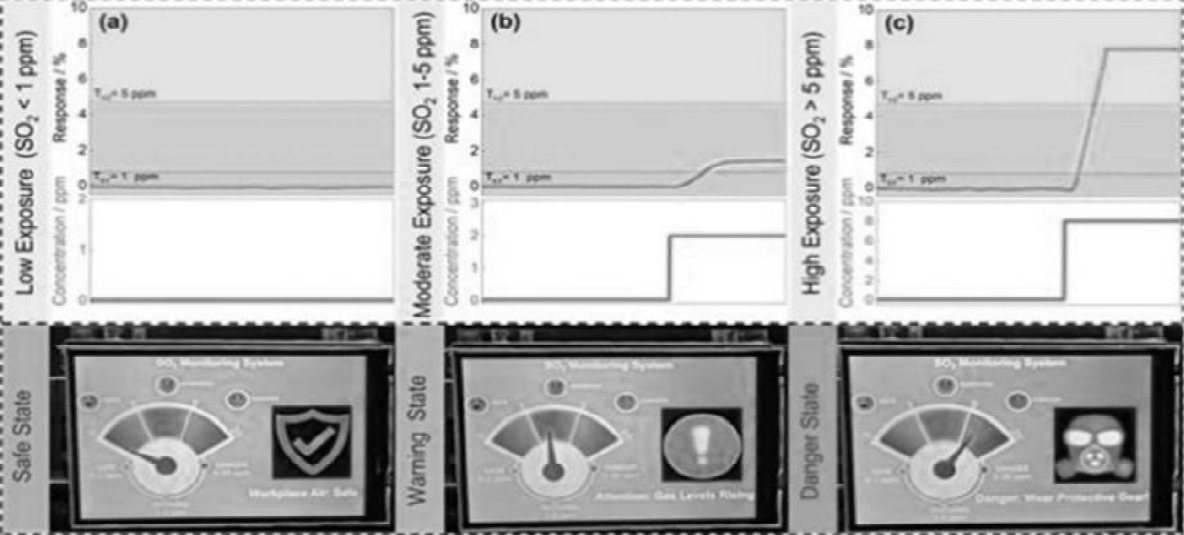

The prototype features a straightforward threshold-based alert system that activates visual indicators, green for safe, yellow for warning, and red for danger, allowing easy interpretation and response, even by users without scientific expertise. Its compact and lightweight design makes it suitable for use in industrial areas, urban locations and enclosed spaces where continuous air quality monitoring is necessary. With its high sensitivity, portability, and user-friendly operation, this sensor system offers a practical solution to monitor and manage  $\text{SO}_2$  pollution, supporting public health and environmental safety. This work demonstrates the potential of material science to create accessible technologies for real-world challenges.


The sensor was designed by Mr. Vishnu G Nath, with contributions from Dr. Shalini Tomar, Mr. Nikhil N. Rao, Dr. Muhammed Safer Naduvil Kovilakath, Dr. Neena S. John, Dr. Satadeep Bhattacharjee and Prof. Seung-Cheol Lee. The research has been published in the journal Small. (Source: PIB)
