IV boats plying from Aberdeen Jetty asked to shift to Junglighat Jetty on Dec. 25 in connection with observance of Tsunami Anniversary

Sri Vijaya Puram, Dec. 22 In connection with the observance of Tsunami Anniversary on Dec. 26, 2024, all IV boats, plying from Rajiv Gandhi Water Sports Complex have been directed to shift from Aberdeen Jetty to Junglighat Jetty on Dec. 25, 2024 positively. No vessel is

permitted to anchor in the area between Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Dweep and Aberdeen Jetty off Marina Park on Dec. 26, 2024. Normal ferry service thereafter can be resumed as per normal practice. All owners of Jetski/ Sport vessels

have also been directed to park their Jetski/ scooters vessels at their designated place by 1700 hrs on Dec. 25, 2024. No water sports activities will be permitted on Dec. 26, 2024 from Aberdeen Jetty, a press release from Harbour Master, PMB said.

in local media on many previous occasions. The Autorickshaw Permit holders have been informed once again to refrain from such practices as repeated violations will warrant actions for cancellation of Permits. Enforcement drives will be carried out to ensure the strict compliance of the permit conditions.

STA with the approval of Hon'ble Lt. Governor vide Notification dated 11-01-2023 has revised the Autorickshaw fares applicable for A&N Islands and the Auto-rickshaw permit holder/drivers were asked to get their fare meter calibrated and stamped as per the notified Fares from Legal Metrology, Directorate of Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs and also the Autorickshaw owners were asked to display the fare chart issued by STA in their Autorickshaw.

Fare should be charged strictly as per the Fare Meter. Exorbitant or Overcharging of Auto fares, refusal to ply autorickshaw as per the request of passengers and misbehavior with passengers shall be viewed seriously. Enforcement drives would be conducted and actions would be initiated against those Autorickshaw owners found not exhibiting the fare chart or driving with defective/faulty & not calibrated & unstamped Faremeters.

General public have also been advised to send their complaints regarding refusal to ply Autorickshaw, refusal to put on the fare meter before commencement of the trip and excessive charging etc. to the Secretary (STA), Directorate of Transport, Sri Vijaya Puram mentioning the registration number of Autorickshaw with details of complaint or register their complaints in helpline No.03192-240059/240062/230259, Traffic Section 243812, a press release from Secretary (STA) said.

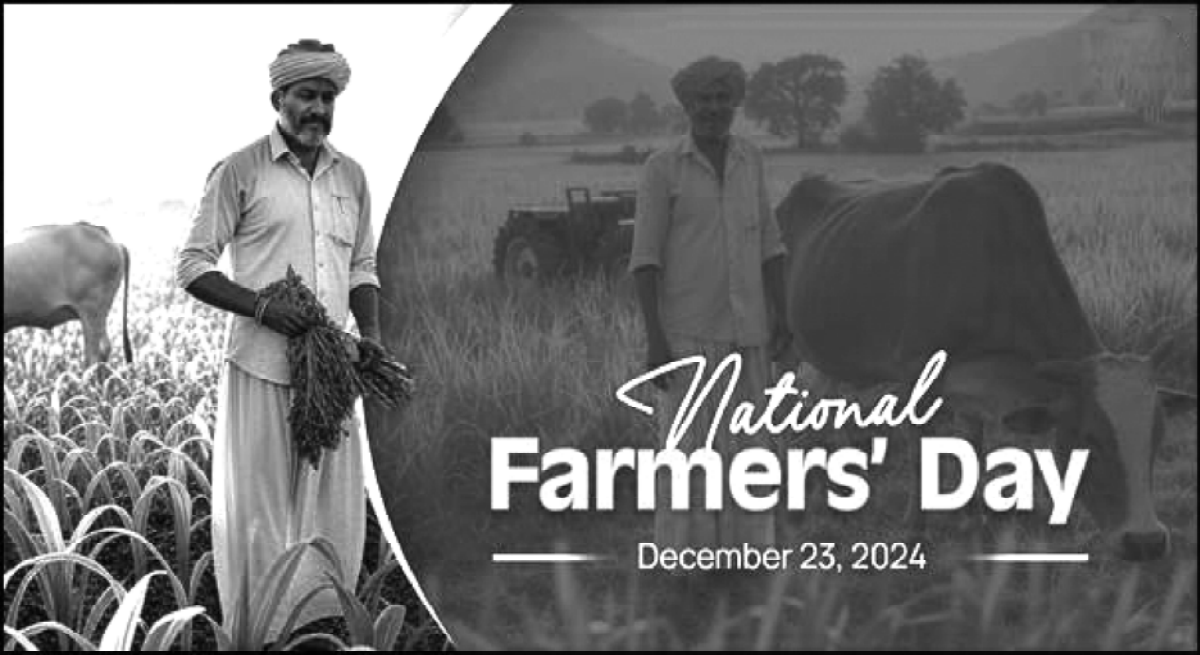

National Farmers' Day

Empowering 'Annadatas' for a Prosperous Nation

Introduction

Farmers, the lifeblood of the nation and revered as 'Annadatas', are the foundation of India's prosperity. Their relentless toil feeds the nation, sustains the rural economy, and ensures the strength of every household. National Farmers' Day, observed on 23rd December, celebrates their invaluable contribution. Recognising the vital role of farmers, the Government of India has introduced a suite of initiatives designed to support their socio-economic upliftment and ensure sustainable agricultural growth. These programmes, including the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN), Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY), and Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana (PM-KMY), are aimed at providing financial security, risk mitigation, and long-term social security for farmers. By addressing both immediate challenges and long-term needs, these schemes underscore the government's commitment to nurturing the backbone of the nation and fostering a sustainable agricultural future.

Role of Farmers in Nation-Building

India's agricultural sector, employing nearly half of the nation's population, remains a cornerstone of the country's economy and a key driver of nation-building. It contributes 17.7% to the Gross Value Added (GVA) at current prices in FY 2023-24. With approximately 54.8% of the country's 328.7 million hectares classified as agricultural land and a cropping intensity of 155.4% (as per the Land Use

Statistics for 2021-22), farmers are the bedrock of this essential sector. Their role extends far beyond mere cultivation; they are the architects of rural development and nation-building, providing food security and sustaining the livelihoods of millions. Through their hard work and innovation, they play a pivotal role in shaping a resilient and prosperous India.

In 2023-24, the country achieved a record total foodgrain production of 332.2 million tonnes, surpassing the previous year's output of 329.7 million tonnes. This remarkable growth is a testament to the resilience and unwavering dedication of Indian farmers, who have continuously strived to ensure food security for the nation. Their efforts go beyond mere crop cultivation; they are the bedrock

of rural livelihoods, shaping the economic landscape of countless communities. The success of Indian agriculture is deeply intertwined with the wellbeing of these 'Annadatas', who embody the spirit of hard work, innovation, and sacrifice.

approach to addressing the diverse needs of the agricultural sector. These schemes aim to provide financial assistance, insurance, affordable credit, and infrastructure development, empowering farmers with the resources needed for sustainable agricultural practices and economic security.

Unprecedented Budget Allocation

Since 2014, the government has significantly bolstered its commitment to agriculture by substantially increasing the budget allocation. In the 2013-14 fiscal year, the Department of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare had a budget of Rs. 21,933.50 crore. Over the years, this allocation has been raised more than five and a half times, reaching a remarkable Rs. 1,22,528.77 crore for the fiscal year 2024-25.

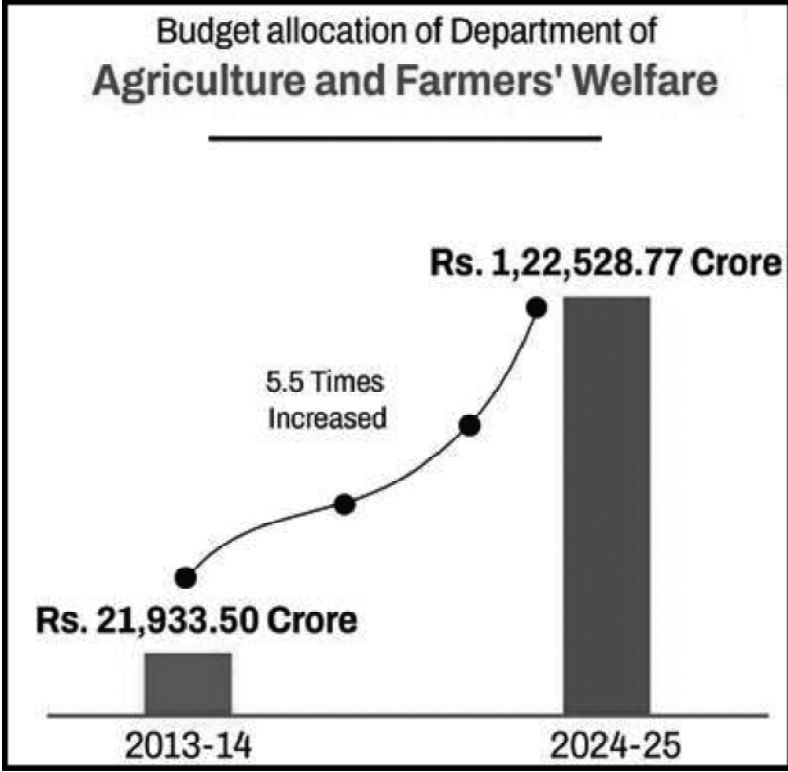
This unprecedented increase reflects a strategic shift towards prioritizing the agricultural sector, addressing challenges faced by farmers, and ensuring sustainable development. The enhanced budget

aims to improve rural infrastructure, promote modern farming techniques, facilitate access to credit, and provide financial support for various agricultural schemes and initiatives. Such a substantial allocation not only fosters farmer welfare but also aims to bolster agricultural productivity and rural prosperity, highlighting the government's unwavering commitment to the growth and development of the agricultural sector.

Other Notable Initiatives

Namo Drone Didi: The Namu Drone Didi Scheme, approved for 2024-25 to 2025-26 with an outlay of Rs. 1,261 crore, aims to empower 15,000 Women Self-Help Groups (SHGs) by providing drones for agricultural rental services, including fertiliser and pesticide application. The scheme offers 80% Central Financial Assistance of the cost of drones, accessories, and ancillary charges, up to a maximum of Rs. 8 lakh. As of December 3, 2024, Rs. 141.41 crore has been released for Kisan drone promotion.

Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana (PM-KMY)	Launched on 12th September 2019, PM-KMY provides security to vulnerable farmer families by offering a monthly pension. Farmers between the ages of 18 to 40 contribute monthly to the scheme, which is matched by the government. The Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) manages the pension fund. As of 25th November 2024, over 24.66 lakh farmers have enrolled in the scheme, offering a financial safeguard during their old age.
Modified Interest Subvention Scheme (MISS)	The Modified Interest Subvention Scheme (MISS) provides concessional short-term agri-loans with a 7% interest rate on loans up to ₹3.00 lakh, plus an additional 3% subvention for timely repayment, reducing the effective rate to 4%. Since 2014-15, institutional credit flow to agriculture has nearly tripled from ₹8.5 lakh crore to ₹25.48 lakh crore by 2023-24. The disbursement of easy and concessional crop loans has more than doubled, with the interest subsidy through KCC increasing 2.4 times to ₹14,252 crore in 2023-24.
Kisan Credit Card (KCC)	Introduced in 1998, the Kisan Credit Card (KCC) scheme provides farmers with easy access to agricultural inputs and cash for their production needs. In February 2019, RBI extended the KCC facility to Animal Husbandry and Fisheries for their working capital requirements. As of 31st March 2024, there are 7.75 crore operative KCC accounts .
Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF)	The Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF) Scheme, launched in 2020 under the Atmanirbhar Bharat Package, supports sustainable agriculture by financing infrastructure projects across India. It provides loans up to ₹2 crore with a capped interest rate of 9%, along with a 3% annual interest subvention and reimbursement of credit guarantee fees for up to seven years, ensuring affordability for beneficiaries. As of 24th November 2024, ₹51,448 crore has been sanctioned for 84,333 projects under AIF.



Kisan Kavach: On 17th December, 2024, Union Minister, Dr. Jitendra Singh unveiled Kisan Kavach, Bharat's first anti-pesticide bodysuit, designed to protect farmers from the harmful effects of pesticide exposure. This groundbreaking innovation is a major step forward in ensuring farmer safety and empowers the agricultural community through science and technology. The event also marked the distribution of the first batch of Kisan Kavach suits to farmers, emphasizing the importance of safeguarding farmers.

Clean Plant Programme: The Union Cabinet approved the Clean Plant Programme (CPP) on 09.08.2024 with an outlay of Rs. 1,765.67 crore. The CPP aims to enhance the quality and productivity of horticulture crops by providing disease-free planting material, benefiting the dissemination and adoption of climate-resilient varieties with yield enhancement.

Digital Agriculture Mission: The Union Cabinet approved the Digital Agriculture Mission on 2.9.2024 with an outlay of Rs. 2,817 crore, including the central share of Rs. 1,940 crore. This mission is conceived as an umbrella scheme to support digital agriculture initiatives, including creating Digital Public Infrastructure, implementing the Digital General Crop Estimation Survey (DGCEs), and other IT initiatives by the Central Government, State Governments, and academic and research institutions.

Credit Guarantee Scheme for e-NWR Based Pledge Financing (CGS-NPF): The Government of India launched the Credit Guarantee Scheme for e-NWR Based Pledge Financing (CGS-NPF) on 16 December 2024, providing a Rs. 1,000-crore corpus to support post-harvest financing for farmers. Under this scheme, farmers can access credit by pledging their produce stored in Warehousing Development and Regulatory Authority (WDRA) accredited warehouses, backed by electronic negotiable warehouse receipts (e-NWRs).

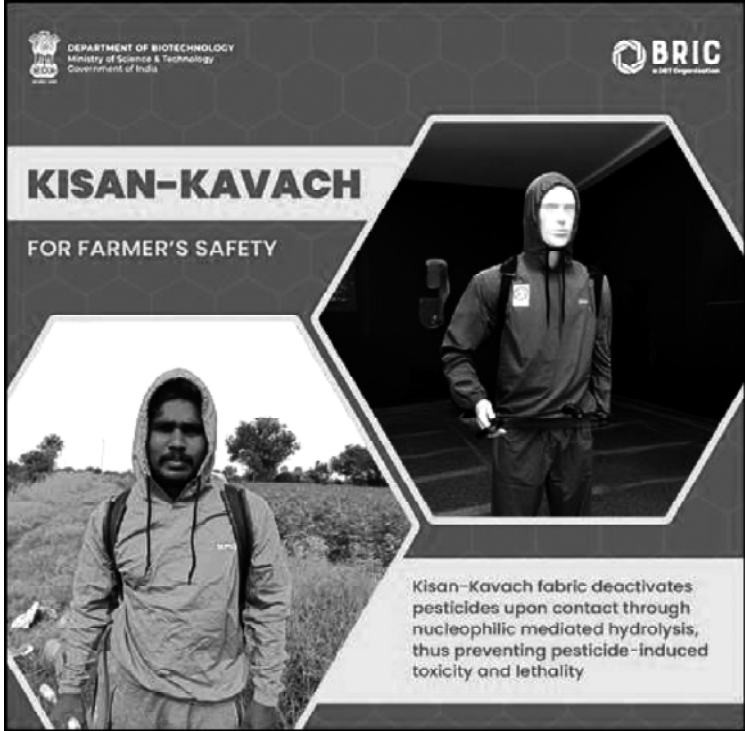
National Mission on Edible Oils - Oilseeds (NMEO-Oilseeds):

The Union Cabinet approved the National Mission on Edible Oils - Oilseeds (NMEO-Oilseeds) on 3.10.2024 with a total outlay of Rs. 10,103 crore. The mission aims to boost domestic oilseed production and achieve self-reliance in edible oils, to be implemented over a seven-year period from 2024-25 to 2030-31.

National Mission on Natural Farming: The Union Cabinet approved the National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF) on 25.11.2024 as a standalone Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The scheme has a total outlay of Rs. 2,481 crore (Government of India share - Rs. 1,584 crore; State share - Rs. 897 crore), focusing on promoting chemical-free, natural farming practices across the country.

Conclusion

The initiatives and schemes introduced by the Government of India are a testament to the unwavering commitment to farmers' welfare and the sustainable growth of the agricultural sector. Through schemes like PM-KISAN, PMFBY, and the Namu Drone Didi, the Government not only ensures financial security but also enhances productivity and market access for farmers. The remarkable achievements in foodgrain production, coupled with the expansion of infrastructure and digital initiatives like the Digital Agriculture Mission and the Clean Plant Programme, are setting a strong foundation for a resilient and prosperous agricultural ecosystem.
