

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation inaugurates 10,000 newly established M-PACS, Dairy & Fisheries Cooperative Societies in New Delhi

Historic milestone also celebrated in A & N Islands; Kisan RuPay Credit Cards distributed to members of M-PACS

New Delhi/Sri Vijaya Puram, Dec. 25

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah, inaugurated 10,000 newly established Multipurpose Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (MPACS), along with Dairy and Fisheries Cooperative Societies, in New Delhi today. The event witnessed the presence of several dignitaries, including Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry, and Dairying, Shri Rajiv Ranjan Singh, alias Lalan Singh, Union Ministers of State for Cooperation, Shri Krishan Pal and Shri Murlidhar Mohol, as well as the Secretary of the Ministry of Cooperation.

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation announced the launch of 10,000 new Multipurpose Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (MPACS), along with Dairy and Fisheries Cooperative Societies, coinciding with the birth centenary of Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee. He emphasized that this milestone is deeply symbolic, as it was during Atal Ji's tenure that the



97th Constitutional Amendment was enacted, highlighting his commitment to revitalizing the long-overlooked cooperative sector. Shri Amit Shah highlighted that on September 19, 2024, an SOP was established, and within just 86 days, the registration of 10,000 PACS was successfully completed. He noted that Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, upon establishing the Ministry of Cooperation, introduced the motto 'Sahkar Se Samridhhi' (Prosperity through Cooperation). Shri Shah emphasized that

achieving this vision requires the presence of cooperatives in every Panchayat, actively contributing in some capacity. He explained that primary cooperative societies are the foundation of India's three-tier cooperative structure, which is why the Modi Government has set an ambitious target to establish 2 lakh new PACS.

Union Minister of Cooperation acknowledged the crucial role of NABARD, NDDB, and NFDB in facilitating the registration of 10,000 PACSs. He highlighted that one of

the most significant initiatives after the establishment of the Ministry of Cooperation was the computerization of all PACS. This modernization has enabled the integration of PACS with 32 diverse activities, including storage, manure, gas, fertilizer, and water distribution, making them more versatile and effective. Shri Amit Shah noted that these advancements require skilled manpower, which led to the launch of a comprehensive training module. This module aims to equip PACS members and employees with the necessary knowledge and skills. He emphasized that district cooperative registrars must take responsibility for implementing the training program effectively, ensuring the secretaries and executive members of PACS receive quality training.

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation also distributed the RuPay Kisan Credit Cards and Micro-ATMs to 10 cooperative societies, marking a significant step towards empowering farmers. He stated that

Office-cum-Retail Fish outlets inaugurated at Coop. Vegetable Market Complex, Phoenix Bay

As part of development of entrepreneurship among fisher women communities and for promotion of seafood value addition and marketing in A&N Islands, Office-cum-Retail Fish outlets of Dhanalaxmi Women Fisheries Coop Society Ltd. and Swastik Fisherwomen Coop. Society was inaugurated by Shri S Raju, DANICS on Dec. 21 in the allotted rooms of Coop. Vegetable Market Complex, Phoenix Bay. The newly opened Coop. Society rooms were allotted by RCS Department to promote hygienic vending of seafood and its value addition.

During the inaugural address, the Director of Fisheries emphasized need of Cooperatives in Fisheries sector in light of recent developmental proposals of Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying



and 'Sahkar Se Samridhhi Scheme' of Ministry of Cooperation, Govt. of India. He congratulated the members of Cooperative Society for their initiatives of joining hands in commencing their own establishment. He advised the Society for exploring various ready to cook and ready to eat products from fishes and shellfishes and to develop branding of the products with novel packaging technologies.

The newly opened shops will have facility of retail vending of chilled/ frozen fishery products including processed shrimps, squid, cuttlefish and lobsters. In addition to this, the society will also supply Insulated Ice Boxes and other subsidised fishing materials. The separate office in the newly opened retail outlet will function as e-service point for the Fishermen community for assisting them in filling of various online applications related to Fisheries Department and for enrolling to various financial assistance schemes of Govt. of India and A&N Administration. This will be the first of its kind initiative of Women Cooperatives involving post-harvest management and marketing of fish and shell fish, a press release from Fisheries Deptt. said.

Transforming Governance, One Clean Space at a Time

At Kandla Port in Gujarat, heaps of old cooling tower scrap were auctioned and cleared, freeing up significant space.
