



Prime Minister to Release 19th Instalment of PM-KISAN at Bhagalpur, Bihar on Feb.24

Over 9.8 Crore Farmers to Benefit from Direct Transfers Exceeding Rs. 22,000 Crore

New Delhi, Feb. 22 (PIB)

Union Minister for Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare addressed the media on Friday regarding the upcoming release of the 19th instalment under the PM-KISAN scheme. PM Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN) Yojana, a Central Sector Scheme launched on 24th February 2019, provides annual financial assistance of Rs. 6,000/- per eligible farmer family. So far, more than Rs. 3.46 lakh crores have been disbursed to more than 11 Cr. farmer families in the country through 18 instalments.

Union Minister, Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan mentioned that Farmer welfare is the top priority of the Modi Government. The aim is to increase production, reduce the cost of production, ensure fair prices for produce, compensate for crop losses, diversify agriculture, and reduce costs through important schemes like the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme, which was

Centre secures Rs.1.56 Cr Refund for 600 students from Coaching Institutes

New Delhi, Feb. 22

The Centre has facilitated 1.56 crore rupees in refunds to students from coaching centres, providing relief to aspirants and students. The Department of Consumer Affairs successfully facilitated these refunds for over 600 students. These students, enrolled in coaching centres for civil services, engineering courses,

and other programs, were previously denied refunds despite following the terms and conditions set by the coaching institutes.

The relief was made possible through grievances filed by the students via the National Consumer Helpline, which facilitated a streamlined process for dispute resolution. Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Ministry

said the swift action by the Department has helped students receive compensation for unfulfilled services, late classes, or cancelled courses, ensuring they do not bear the financial burden of unfair business practices.

The Department of Consumer Affairs has instructed all coaching centres to adopt a student-centric approach, mandating

Deptt. of CS&CA regularly monitoring replenishment of LPG in far flung areas of Isles CCS Ltd. to dispatch adequate consignment of domestic LPG cylinders required in Little Andaman in next few days

Sri Vijaya Puram, Feb. 22

LPG consumers of Little Andaman have been informed that the Department of Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs is regularly monitoring the replenishment of LPG in all far flung areas of the UT of A&N Islands. However, it is the sole responsibility of the Indian Oil Corporation Ltd. (IOCL) to ensure timely replenishment of LPG cylinders through their authorized LPG

distributors.

It is further brought to the notice of LPG consumers of Little Andaman that on intervention of the Department of CS&CA, on Feb. 14, 2025, a transhipment consisting of 1300 domestic LPG cylinders was delivered to Little Andaman via MV Ebrahim Ali Hussain cargo vessel, as part of ongoing efforts to ensure the steady supply of LPG across the region. Unfortunately, due to

limited storage capacity on the vessel, the full demand for LPG in Little Andaman could not be met, leaving a shortfall in the supply required to cater to all the LPG consumers in the area. In response to the situation, the CCS Ltd. has assured that adequate consignment of domestic LPG cylinders required for the month of February, 2025 will be dispatched to Little Andaman aboard MV Bay Island in the next few

days.

The Department of Civil Supplies and Consumers Affairs in association with IOCL will closely monitor and ensure that the distributor namely CCS Ltd. fulfils its obligation to provide sufficient number of LPG cylinders to the residents of Little Andaman in order to alleviate current challenges, a press release from Deptt. of CS&CA said.

Training on 'Preparation and uses of various organic inputs including compost, Bio fertilizer & Bio pesticides' organized at Diglipur

Diglipur, Feb. 22

The Union Territory Agriculture Technology Management Agency (UTATMA), Diglipur in association with the Department of Agriculture, Diglipur organized a two-days training programme on 'Preparation and uses of various Organic inputs including compost, Bio fertilizer and Bio pesticides' at Nischintapur village under Gram Panchayat Kalighat at Diglipur Block on Feb. 21 & 22, 2025.

Nischintapur village is one of the remotest villages under Gram Panchayat Kalighat, where 16 farmers were settled during the year 1955-56 and 2.02 ha land allotted to each farmer which is now divided into approximately 42 families. During the training programme, Smti Arti Singh, Assistant Director (Agri), Diglipur briefed



about the importance of using various organic inputs including Vermicompost, farm yard manure, bio fertilizers and bio pesticides for organic cultivation of crops.

During the training, Smti Seena Pillai, Agriculture Officer(I/c) briefed about the method of vermicomposting using Vermibed being supplied by the Department on 20% subsidy and the precautions to be taken during preparation of vermicompost. application were also detailed among the participants of the training programme by Smti Kamrun Nisa, Agriculture Assistant. Hands-on demonstration were given to the participants on preparation of Neemashttra, Jeevamrit and Vermicomposting by Shri Riktik Baroi, JAA and Shri Satinder Prasad, AFA.

The team also urged farmers to register in the Departmental market outlet-VATIKA at Sri Vijaya Puram for selling the value added products produced by them, a press release from AD (Agri.), Diglipur said.

Awareness prog. on 'Direct Seafood Export' held for local fish exporters of South Andaman

The Department of Fisheries, A&N Administration, in collaboration with the Marine Products Export Development Authority (MPEDA), Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Govt. of India, conducted an awareness programme for local fish exporters and traders of South Andaman District. The session focused on the procedures for certification and registration required for direct seafood exports from the Islands to international markets.

The programme was presided over by Dr. K. Gopal, Joint Director (Fisheries), Shri A. Sakthivel, Assistant Director, MPEDA, Kochi, and Shri S. U. Maheswar Rao, Governing Body Member, NFDB. The programme witnessed active participation from key seafood exporters and traders of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

The Assistant

Director of MPEDA shared valuable insights into promoting direct seafood exports, covering export procedures, quality standards, and MPEDA's support programs. He also explained about the concept of a Common Chilled Fish Handling Unit, which would enable the processing of fish catch for export in live, chilled, or dry forms to foreign destinations with less capital investment as compared to a conventional Processing Plant. The stakeholders present raised few queries regarding the export licensing process, laboratory testing, and the establishment of chilled fish export units, cost involved etc. which were duly clarified by the Official of MPEDA. The exporters expressed their willingness to embark on direct seafood exports under the technical guidance of MPEDA and the

Department of Fisheries.

Dr. K. Gopal, Joint Director (Fisheries), informed the participants that the Andaman & Nicobar Administration is taking active steps in collaboration with various authorities, including the Ministry of Fisheries, Govt. of India, Airport Authority of India, Customs Department, MPEDA, and EIA to facilitate the commencement of direct seafood exports. Shri S.U Maheswar Rao, Governing Body Member, NFDB briefed the participants on various schemes of Govt. of India such as PMMSY which can be availed by the local fish traders and exporters to improve the value chain of the fish and fishery products.

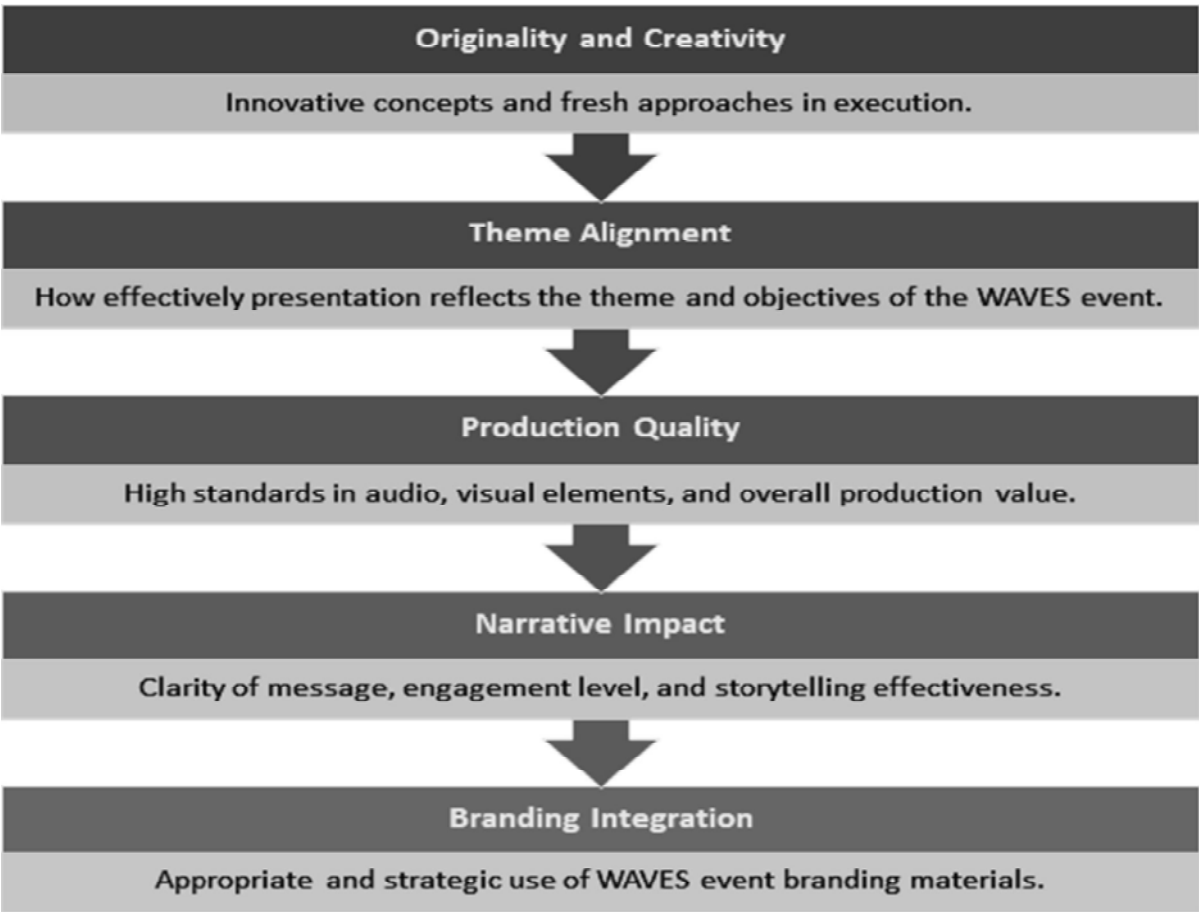

Novel technique unearthed to enhance next-generation lighting

An innovative method to minimize anion migration in perovskite nanocrystals, thereby reducing their sensitivity to heat and moisture, as well as colour instability, paving the way for efficient, durable optoelectronic devices.

Lighting consumes nearly 20% of global electricity, and advancements in lighting technology have significantly improved energy efficiency. From the incandescent and fluorescent lamps of the past to the invention of LEDs in the 1960s, lighting has come a long way.

A pivotal breakthrough occurred in 1993 when Shuji Nakamura and his team members developed high-brightness blue LEDs, enabling energy-efficient white LEDs (WLEDs), a feat recognized with the 2014 Nobel Prize in Physics. Today, LEDs lead the market in efficiency and lifespan.

Currently, emerging light related technologies like OLEDs that offer vibrant colors, QLEDs that provide precise colour control and durability and micro/mini-LEDs that deliver high brightness and stability, are shaping the future of lighting.

While thin and flexible OLEDs (Organic LEDs) are costly and have shorter lifespans, QLEDs (Quantum Dot LEDs) are toxic and their production is challenged by resource scarcity and Micro/Mini-LEDs are limited in their application due to high production costs.

Perovskite (class of compounds which have the same type of crystal structure as CaTiO3 - Calcium Titanate) LEDs (PeLEDs) combine the advantages of OLEDs and QLEDs, positioning them as an excellent choice for next-generation lighting. However, their widespread application is limited by challenges such as sensitivity to heat and moisture, as well as colour instability caused by anion migration (which occurs when halide ions -- chloride, bromide, or iodide move between quantum dots in mixed layers).

To tackle this issue, researchers at the Centre for Nano and Soft Matter Sciences (CeNS) in Bengaluru, an autonomous institute under the Department of Science and Technology (DST), have developed an innovative method to minimize anion migration in CsPbX3 perovskite nanocrystals.

The team, led by Dr. Pralay K. Santra, synthesized green light emitting cesium lead bromide (CsPbBr3) perovskite nanocrystals using a hot injection method, where oleylamine serves as the passivating ligand. To enhance stability, they applied argon-oxygen (Ar-O2) plasma treatment, which immobilizes the surface ligands by creating a cross-linked, hydrophobic layer. This approach effectively stabilizes the ligands and slows anion exchange, significantly improving colour stability by several orders.

This breakthrough published in the journal Nanoscale, provides valuable insights into stabilizing perovskite nanocrystals, paving the way for efficient, durable optoelectronic devices.(Source:PIB)
