PS Ograbraj arrests offenders for attacking on-duty Forest Officials

On the night of 16th January, 2025, an alarming incident took place during a night patrolling operation in Port Mout, Brindaban R F - B l o c k - 1, Caddlegunj, when a team of Forest officials, a p p r e h e n d e d individuals engaged in illegal sawing down of a Padauk tree.

During the operation, one of the offenders, identified as Deepak Singh (known as Shilbu) attempted to resist arrest by wielding a machete which resulted in an injury to one of the Forest Workers. As the situation escalated, Shilbu's brother, Ghan Shyam Singh (known as Deepu), who was armed with a machete arrived on the scene and verbally threatened the Forest Officials to kill them and demanded the release of his brother. In the ensuing chaos, the offenders managed to escape under the cover of darkness, taking advantage of the night hours.

In response to the seriousness of the attack and the threats posed to the Government Officials on duty, a formal complaint was lodged by Range Officer, Tushnabad with PS Ograbraj, leading to the registration of a case under relevant section of law at PS Ograbraj.

The search and arrest of accused persons. On 17th January, 2025, the accused persons were apprehended and brought to PS Ograbraj for interrogation. The weapons used in the crime were recovered and seized. Later, the arrested offenders were produced before the Hon'ble Court from where they were sent to Judicial Custody.

The entire operation was conducted under the leadership of SI Devanand Pathak, SHO, PS Ograbraj under the command of Shri Brij Mohan Meena, SDPO, Bambooflat and overall supervision of Shri Manoj Kumar Meena, IPS, Sr. Superintendent of Police, South Andaman District, a press release received from SP (SA) said.



Exponential Growth in Digital Transactions


A Transformative Shift towards a Cashless Economy

In recent years, India has witnessed an unparalleled rise in digital transactions, marking a significant milestone in its journey towards becoming a cashless society. At the forefront of India's digital payment revolution is UPI with a record hit of 16.73 Billion transactions in December 2024. In addition to this, Immediate Payment Service (IMPS), and NETC FASTag have emerged as pivotal players, making financial transactions faster, more accessible, and secure.


Unified Payments Interface (UPI) is a system that powers multiple bank accounts into a single mobile application (of any participating bank), merging several banking features, seamless fund routing & merchant payments into one hood. It has not only made financial transactions fast, secure, and effortless, but also empowered individuals, small businesses, and merchants, driving the country's shift toward a cashless economy.



As of recent data from the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), UPI has set a new record by processing over **16.73 billion transactions**, with a staggering transaction value of **Rs 23.25 lakh crore**. This is a notable jump from **Rs 21.55 lakh crore in November**. In 2024, UPI processed around **172 billion transactions**, marking a **46% increase from 117.64 billion in 2023**. This rise underscores a broader cultural shift toward financial inclusivity, with UPI being a central pillar.



While UPI has dominated the mobile transaction space, IMPS has long been a trusted service for instant payments between accounts. Launched in 2010, **Immediate Payment Service (IMPS)** is a real-time, 24x7 electronic funds transfer service that facilitates quick transactions across banks and financial institutions. Its versatility in supporting transactions through multiple channels, including mobile, ATM, SMS, and the internet, has made it an essential tool for businesses and individuals alike. Recent data indicates that IMPS transactions have surged, with **441 million transactions** recorded in **December 2024**, compared to 407.92 million in November 2024. The transaction value also saw a notable increase, touching **Rs 6.01 lakh crore in December**, up from **Rs 5.58 lakh crore** the previous month.



Another important digital payment method that has grown in significance is the NETC FASTag. National Electronic Toll Collection (NETC) FASTag offers a seamless, cashless way to pay for tolls on national highways, eliminating the need for vehicles to stop at toll plazas. By linking a FASTag to a bank account (be it savings, current, or prepaid), drivers can pay their tolls while on the move, saving both time and fuel. FASTag transactions grew in volume to **381.98 million in December, against 358.84 million in November**. The value also increased to **Rs 6,642 crore against Rs 6,070 crore in November**.

The surge in digital transactions through UPI, IMPS, and NETC FASTag is a testament to India's growing embrace of a digital-first economy. These technologies have not only made financial transactions easier but also more secure, ensuring that users can engage in commerce without the fear of fraud or theft. As India continues to expand its digital infrastructure and enhance its payment systems, the future of financial transactions looks brighter than ever. (Source:PIB)


Ayurveda provide new hope for Alzheimer's Disease

A new study that provides a multipronged approach to treatment of several neurodegenerative diseases, offers hope for Alzheimer's Disease, Dementia, and related diseases.

Amyloid proteins and peptides play a pivotal role in various **neurodegenerative diseases**, including **Alzheimer's disease** (AD). Synthetically designed small molecules/ show promise towards inhibition of various kinds of **amyloidosis**.

Professor Anirban Bhunia and his team at the Bose Institute in Kolkata, an autonomous institute of Department of Science and Technology, employed two distinct strategies. First, they utilize chemically synthesized peptides to combat amyloid beta aggregation. Second, they repurpose a drug called Lasunadya Ghrita (LG) from Ayurveda, the ancient traditional Indian medicine, which has previously shown efficacy in treating depression-related mental illnesses.

The non-toxic compounds of LG and their components were characterized and repurposed for use against amyloid beta 40/42 (A β) aggregation. The water extract of these compounds, referred to as LG_{WE}, not only disrupted the fibrillation process during the elongation step but also inhibited the formation of oligomers in the initial stages of the fibrillation pathway. Remarkably, these compounds demonstrated greater efficacy in breaking down of amyloid aggregates into non-toxic smaller degradable molecules compared to the chemically designed peptides, suggesting its novel role in disaggregating amyloid-prone proteins.



In a recent paper published in the prestigious journal Biochemistry (ACS), Professor Bhunia from Bose Institute, along with his collaborators from the Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics (SINP) Kolkata and IIT-Guwahati reported that the chemically designed peptides are non-toxic, serum-stable, and effective in inhibiting as well as disaggregating amyloid proteins, particularly A β 40/42. Additionally, Professor Bhunia, in collaboration with Ayurveda expert Professor Dr. Sanjeev Rastogi from the State Ayurvedic College and Hospital at Lucknow University, along with other researchers from the Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics, demonstrated how natural compounds can enhance the inhibition and breakdown of amyloid beta more effectively than the chemically designed peptides. Their findings were published in the esteemed journal Biophysical Chemistry (Elsevier).

This research offers hope to individuals suffering from Alzheimer's disease and highlights the potential of Ayurveda, or ancient Indian traditional medicine, as a viable solution to complex neurodegenerative disorders like Alzheimer's. It may inspire further exploration into natural remedies, improving the quality of life for those affected by dementia. (Source:PIB)


