District Administration, SA continues eviction drive against encroachment

The District Administration, as part of its ongoing efforts to protect Government land, has successfully carried out eviction operations against recent encroachments in Ferrargunj Tehsil.

In Bambooflat village, unauthorized occupation was removed, restoring Government land to its original status. A total area of 10 square meters of Government land was

reclaimed and returned to its rightful condition.

A team of Revenue officials also took swift action in Kanyapuram village, removing an unauthorized structure and restoring 500 sq. mtrs of Government land. In total, 510 sq. mtrs of Government revenue land have been successfully restored to their original condition in Ferrargunj Tehsil.

The District Administration remains

committed to safeguarding Government lands and ensuring their appropriate use for public benefit. Encroachments on Government property will be dealt with strictly in accordance with the law. Nicobar District Police apprehends 9 Burmese Nationals in Anti-Poaching Operation

Car Nicobar, Jan.20

Nicobar District Police acted swiftly on credible information received from the local people of Kamorta, regarding the sighting of a Burmese dinghy between Dering and Olinpow on Jan.19. A team led by the SHO of PS Nancowry, Sub-Inspector Calvin, along with police personnel, rushed to Dering village. A thorough search operation led to the discovery of the dinghy at Inkato Nalah, where six Burmese nationals were apprehended.

Upon interrogation, the detained individuals revealed that their group consisted of 09 members. The Police team immediately conducted an operation in the surrounding area and successfully apprehended the remaining 03 Burmese nationals from the sea shore at Inkato. All 09 detainees are currently held at PS Nancowry under proper watch, and further interrogation is underway. They will be handed over to PS C&EO for initiating appropriate legal action.

The entire anti-



poaching operation was led by Sub-Inspector Calvin, SHO, PS Nancowry, under the command of Shri Solomon Samuel, SDPO, Car Nicobar, and overall supervision of Shri Sunny Gupta, IPS, Superintendent of Police, Nicobar District.

Nicobar District Police has urged local fishermen and the public to report any

suspicious activities or the presence of foreign nationals to the nearest Police Station or over phone No.100, 112 & 03193-265999 for timely action. The identity of the informers will be kept secret and will also be suitably rewarded, a press release from SP (Nicobar) said.

ICAR-KVK CIARI Nicobar commenced a training session on 'Empowering SHGs through Agricultural Income Generation Activities' at Tapoim Village, Car Nicobar. The session was inaugurated by Shri Amit Kale, IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Nicobar District. The event witnessed active participation from a large number of Self-Help Group (SHG) members, progressive farmers, and local community leaders, who engaged in discussions and activities aimed at enhancing agricultural practices and promoting income-generating initiatives for SHGs.

In the region, where most farmers are small and marginal, challenges such as selling products at fair prices and lacking bargaining power are prevalent, SHGs and Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) can play a pivotal role in addressing these issues by uniting farmers, providing better market access, and securing improved prices. Additionally, SHGs support collective



supply, marketing, and securing loans, which can significantly improve farmers' incomes.

In his inaugural address, the Deputy Commissioner stressed the crucial role of SHGs in the socioeconomic development of the Nicobar District. He highlighted the vast potential of agriculture, particularly coconut oil production, in generating sustainable income for local communities. Awareness prog. on 'Waste Management, Climate Change and Environmental Hazards of Single-Use Plastics' conducted by ANPCC, Department of S&T

The Andaman & Nicobar Pollution Control Committee (ANPCC), Department of Science & Technology (DST) conducted an impactful awareness program on 16th January, 2025 on Waste Management, Climate Change and Environmental Hazards of Single-Use Plastics. The sessions were held at Government Senior Secondary School, Diglipur, and Government Senior Secondary School, Subhash Gram in North & Middle Andaman, with the presence of the respective School Principals.

Ms. R. Svathi Lakshmi, Law Officer, DST, delivered an in-depth presentation on various forms of pollution, including air, water, and land pollution. She highlighted the causes, sources, and preventive measures, emphasizing the harmful effects of plastic pollution on marine ecosystems and biodiversity. Videos showcasing advanced waste treatment technologies, such as incineration plants, the pyrolysis process, and applications of recycled products, were also presented. Additionally, she discussed legal frameworks for waste



management and the significance of the global plastic treaty.

Ms. Pavya, Junior Scientific Assistant at ANPCC, provided insights into regulatory initiatives undertaken by ANPCC to curb pollution. She discussed the monitoring of industrial units by the Pollution Control Boards, focusing on how these regulatory bodies assess compliance with environmental standards and shared recent examples of climate change impacts, including global warming and ozone depletion. She explained the concept of circular economy, emphasizing its potential for creating sustainable business opportunities.

Shri P. Senthil Kumar, Artist and Program Coordinator, DST engaged with students to raise

awareness about the ill-effects and dangers of Single-Use Plastic (SUP). During the session, he shared important information about proper disposal of single-use plastics and highlighted the environmental impact of improper disposal.

The program featured interactive sessions with over 70 students at each school. Cloth bags, pamphlets, and posters advocating eco-friendly practices and the adoption of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) were distributed to students, encouraging their active involvement.

WEF President predicts 7-8 % GDP growth for India with the help of reforms

Zero-tolerance against crime: PS Pahargaon arrests attempt-to-murder accused

In adherence to its zero-tolerance policy against crime, Police Station Pahargaon has apprehended an individual involved in a brutal attempt-to-murder incident at Shiv Colony, Dollygunj. On Jan.17, 2025, based on the complaint of Smti Pinki Biswas, a resident of Dollygunj, a criminal case has been registered at Police Station Pahargaon against her husband. As per the

complaint, the couple had been facing ongoing family disputes and frequent altercations. On Jan.16, 2025, a heated argument escalated, during which, her husband assaulted her brutally with a daav with the intention to kill her. The victim managed to escape and a PCR vehicle promptly reached the spot, took her to PHC Garacharma and from there she was referred to GB Pant Hospital for further

course of treatment.

Upon receiving the complaint, an attempt-to-murder case has been immediately registered at PS Pahargaon and a dedicated team immediately swung into action and arrested accused namely Prabhash Mondal, S/o Late Prohlad Mondal, 56 yrs, R/o Shiv Colony, Dollygunj and also recovered the weapon involved in the assault, a press release from SP (SA) said.

The terms and conditions of the e-Auction are given below: -

- Each prospective bidder shall be required to deposit an earnest money, which shall be 5% of the Minimum Reserve Price for the quarry area with the Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman before participating in the e-auction (drawn in favour of Assistant Commissioner, Settlement).
- The earnest money should reach to the Cashier, Office of the Assistant Commissioner, Settlement on or before **17.02.2025 at 1700 hours**.
- The EMD should be in the form of A/C Payee Demand Draft/FDR/ Bankers Cheque or Bank Guarantee from any of the Commercial bank drawn in favour of the Assistant Commissioner, Settlement and should be uploaded in <http://eauction.gov.in>. No prospective bidder shall be allowed to participate in the e-auction process if EMD is not deposited within stipulated time in the office.
- The earnest money deposited, except in case of declared highest bidder, shall be refunded to other bidders after the completion of the e-auction unless forfeited by the Deputy Commissioner/ Presiding Officer for reasons to be recorded in writing. In case of the declared highest bidder, however, the earnest money will be adjusted against the highest bid amount to be deposited within the period specified in the award letter i.e. before execution of lease deed. In the event of failure to do so, the earnest money and the security amount shall be forfeited and the quarry area may be assigned to the next highest bidder at declared highest bid.
- The Minimum Reserve Price has been fixed as **Rs.42.8 Lakhs (Rupees Forty-Two Lakhs Eighty Thousand-Only) for Explosive quarry for quarry block of 0.25 hectares and Rs.26.3 Lakhs (Rupees Twenty Six Lakhs Thirty Thousand-Only) for Non-explosive quarry block of 0.2050 hectares for 01(One) year for 12000 cbm.**
- Any quarry areas can be withdrawn from the e-auction without assigning any reason thereof.
- Only one quarry lease shall be permitted to a successful bidder in the District.
- No sub-lease/sublet or any types of agreement of the quarry shall be permitted.
- No bid which is below the minimum reserve price fixed for the quarry area shall be accepted.
- The period of lease shall be only for **01(One) year** from the date of executing the lease deed.
- No person shall be entitled to participate in the e-auction unless he furnishes:
 - An affidavit sworn before any Executive Magistrate/Notary Public to the effect that no amount of contract money, royalty in respect of any quarry lease/permit held by him earlier is outstanding against him/her.

NOTE: The document is to be submitted along with the Earnest Money Deposit.

- The prospective bidder shall produce proof of submission of EMD and the documents as above at the e-auction site (<http://eauction.gov.in>) prior to commencement of e-auction process. He/ She shall upload identity proof to establish his/her identity in the e-auction site (<http://eauction.gov.in>) failing which he/she shall not be allowed to take part in the e-auction.
- The Deputy Commissioner (SA) may direct the bidders at the end of e-auction to produce the amount considered reasonable by him or a bank instrument of such amount in case he feels that the amount of bid has gone unreasonably high and there is a possibility of the bidders trying to skip away or refuse to deposit the due bid amount as per terms and conditions of the e-auction notice.
- The highest bid received in the e-auction shall become a successful bid only after the approval of the Competent Authority.
- The Successful bidder shall be liable to deposit 25% of his bid amount as security of the highest bid with the Deputy Commissioner (SA) on acceptance of bid in the form of FDR/ Bankers Cheque from any of the commercial banks drawn in favour of Assistant Commissioner, Settlement immediately after receipt of acceptance.
- The lessee shall pay 5% of the bid amount as performance security in the form of A/c Payee Demand Draft, FDR, Bankers Cheque or Bank Guarantee from any of the commercial banks, which shall remain valid for a period of 60 days beyond the expiry of the lease deed and subject to compliance of other terms and conditions of the lease deed/quarry plan, which shall be released after the expiry of all contractual obligations. In the event of any breach of contract and conditions laid down in the lease agreement, quarry plan and Environment Clearance granted by the competent authority, the performance security shall be forfeited to the Government.
- The prospective bidder has to submit necessary copies of documents duly self-attested viz. quarry lease deed and (or) Consent to Operate (CTO)/ consent to establish (CTE) issued by any State/UT Govt. or other Govt. agencies of two (2) years in quarrying and (or) crushing activities from the year beginning 2012 to till date. The prospective bidders have to submit an affidavit duly sworn before the Executive Magistrate/Notary Public stating that the prospective bidders have the capabilities with respect to personnel, equipment's/ machineries and manufacturing facilities in handling of quarrying and crushing units in compliance to the rules and regulation in force. The prospective bidders have an average annual financial turnover of Rs.56.00 Lakhs during the last three years ending 31st March-2024 (balance sheet and profit & loss account of last three years ending 31st March-2024). The prospective bidders also submit IT returns of last three years for the said period.
- The successful bidder shall have to execute quarry lease deed before execution of quarry operation.
- The lessee shall pay residual bid amount before executing the lease deed.
- The lease holder shall be liable to pay advance income tax as per provisions of section 206(c) of income tax act in addition to bid amount, payable as per terms and condition of contract agreement before submission of royalty.
- The lease holder shall be liable to pay the rent for the quarry area, royalty as notified from time to time.
- The lease holder shall be liable to pay the GST as admissible from time to time on royalty paid, to GST Commissionarate and quarterly report to this effect shall be submitted to the competent authority along with supplementary documents specifically showing GST paid for the royalty of stone boulders.
- The lease holder shall have stacking place for proper storage of quarry products in such a way that measurement would be taken if required.
- The lease holder shall undertake the quarrying in the quarry area in terms of the quarry plan notified and in accordance with the responsibilities as laid down under Rule 13 of the A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012.
- No lease holder shall be entitled to raise any dispute with the reference to the survey and demarcation of the quarry permitted out to him after execution of the quarry lease deed.
- The lease holder shall be permitted to extract maximum of **12000 cbm** of minor mineral during **01(One)year** from the Quarry area leased out to him and he/she is expected to satisfy himself of the availability of minor mineral to this extent prior to participating in the e-auction. It is reiterated that it is for the prospective bidders to do the estimation with regard to the potential of quarry site prior to the bidding which shall be the sole responsibility of prospective bidders.
- The lease holder shall remit the royalty of Minimum 1/4th of the allotted quantity during the first month of every quarter irrespective of extraction of stone aggregate/boulder.
- Site inspection may be** carried out by the prospective bidders for physical verification of the site of his/her interest. The quarry sites as shown in the annexure are easily identifiable on the field. However, assistance may be obtained from the district office, if required.
- NO quarrying shall be permitted in a depression or below mean sea level.**
- Quarrying operation should not involve destruction of any tree and also should not violate other prohibited areas norms.**
- That the lease holder shall abide by the provisions of the Mines and Minerals (Regulation and development) Act, 1957, A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012 and the Rules and Regulations regarding Employment and Conditions of Service as for the time being in force and also the provisions of other labour laws as are applicable to the workmen engaged in the quarries and any other relevant laws for the time being in force.
- In case of any tree/ plantation** is removed during quarrying activity, the lease holder will plant a minimum of twice the number of such plants, which will be in addition to the plantation to be done otherwise as per quarry plan. Before removal of any tree permission of competent authority shall be obtained.
- Over burden** and other waste if any, should be dumped at identified sites using proper techniques and precautions. Dumps the stabilised suitably by formation of retaining wall/ check dams at outer periphery of dumping sites followed by plantation. Inactive dumps should be covered under the plantation wherever required as proposed under quarry plan. Garland drain should be constructed around the waste dump site inside area to prevent run off

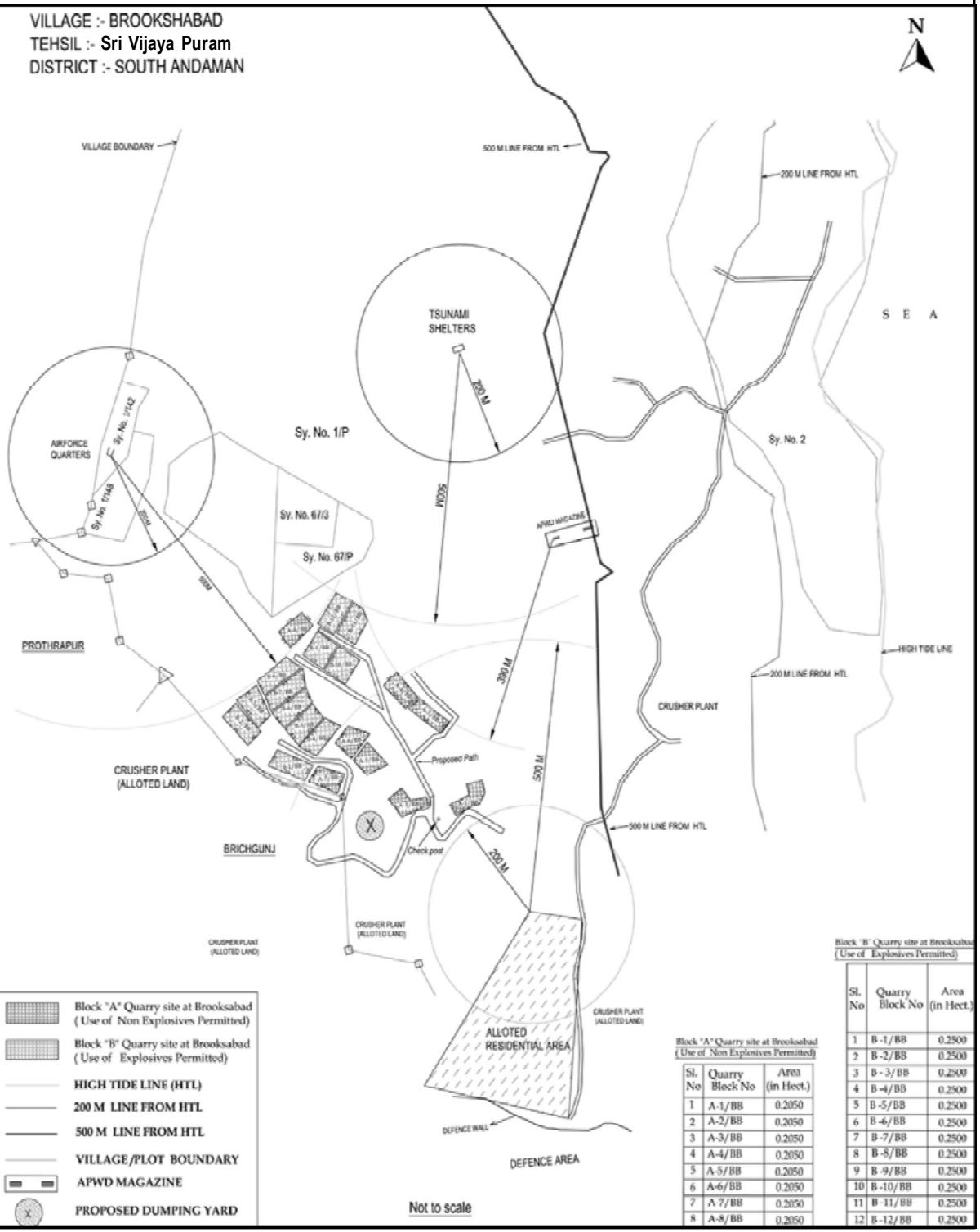
from the waste dump to arrest siltation.

- Regular sprinkling of water be carried out to ensure that the suspended particulate matter level does not exceed the ambient air quality standards, within the entire quarry leased area and the pathways leading to quarry area.
- Sampling of ambient air quality in the core zone for suspended particulate matter, respirable particulate matter sulphur dioxide, oxides of nitrogen should be carried out once in every six months in the consultation with the pollution control committee, Sri Vijaya Puram.
- The overall noise level in and around the quarry area will be kept well within prescribed limits of noise emissions as per Environment Protection Act, 1986 and rules framed there under.
- That the lease holder shall carry out quarrying in accordance with all other provisions applicable for undertaking quarrying including the provisions of Forest(Conservation) Act, 1980 and Environment(Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules made there under.
- The lease holder shall abide all the conditions laid down in the Environment Clearance granted by the competent Authority vide EC identification No. EC24C0108AN5721433N and EC24C01108AN5248734N and the lease holder shall comply/abide with any additional terms/conditions if any stipulated at any time and all environmental concerns and the safety of the workers are to be addressed.
- Apart from above, the provisions of Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and the rules and regulation under Public liability insurance act, 1991 shall also be enforced.
- That the lease holder shall without delay send a report of any accident, causing loss of life or serious bodily injuries or endangering life or property which may at any time occur at or in the said land during the course of operations undertaken under the lease, to the Tehsildar concerned and the Deputy Commissioner.
- That the lease holder shall submit returns and maintain requisite register and memorandums as prescribed under the A & N Islands Minor Minerals Rules, 2012.
- That on expiry or premature termination of the lease, the quarried materials, lying on the land from which they are extracted, shall become the absolute property of the administration.
- Force Majeure means such of the following factors which substantially affect the performance of the agreement, such as: natural phenomena, including but not limited to floods, draughts, earthquakes, Cyclones and Epidemics; acts of any Government, domestic or foreign, including but not limited to war, declared or undclared, quarantines, embargoes. Either party shall within fifteen (15) days from the occurrence of such a cause notify the other in writing of such causes.
- The Lessee or the Deputy Commissioner (South Andaman) shall not be liable for delays in performing their obligations resulting from any Force Majeure cause as referred to and/or defined above.
- However, if such an event lasts for a period of 90 days or more than either party shall have an option to terminate this Agreement forthwith without any liability after intimating the other party of the same and such event shall be governed by Rule 46 of ANIMMR, 2012.
