Port Blair, July 8

Port Blair city is among one of the clean cities in India. The Administration is committed to make it the cleanest city in the country. Accordingly, the Administration is working on the vision of zero tolerance to littering. The Chief Secretary has constituted 12 teams under Senior Officers to inspect existing Solid Waste Management facilities i.e. DRCs, Landfill site

and suggest various measures to improve their efficiency. The teams are also directed to inspect door to door collection mechanism and to identify vulnerable points where the garbage is dumped by the general public.

In pursuance of this, a team comprising of Shri B.S. Jaglan, IAS, Chief Electoral Officer and Ms Sapna Priya, DANICS inspected Ward No. 1, 2 & 3 in

Port Blair today. The team found Solid Waste lying on the sides of road and in the drains. Some vacant plots are also being used by public as a dumping ground. Garbage was also found lying in front of several shops, hotels and houses etc. The team observed that proprietors of some of the shops were not segregating the wet and dry waste properly. The team directed PBMC Inspector to

challan these shops on the spot. Nine challans of Rs 500/- each were issued on the spot. All the shopkeepers and house owners were advised to follow the guidelines of Solid Waste Management i.e. to keep separate bins for dry and wet waste.

The Administration remains dedicated to implement effective waste management strategies and will continue to monitor and

enhance these efforts to ensure a sustainable and clean environment to all the residents of Port Blair. The Chief Secretary appeals to the general public to participate proactively in this cleanliness drive and to keep their city neat, clean and garbage free thereby contributing their bit to make the city amongst the best in the country, a press release from A&N Administration said.

Insurance coverage to registered farmers under PMFBY towards crop loss

Cut-off date for enrolment under the scheme for Kharif is Aug.15, 2024 and Rabi is Jan.15, 2025

Port Blair, July 8

The Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) is one of the Flagship Schemes of the Govt. of India. The scheme is being implemented in these Islands since 2016. The scheme envisages providing insurance coverage to the registered farmers under PMFBY towards crop loss arising out of unforeseen events viz. drought, dry spells, flood, inundation, pests and diseases,

landslides, natural fire and lightning, storm, hailstorm, cyclone, typhoon, tempest, hurricane and tornado etc. The scheme ensures flow of credit to the agriculture sector and stabilizes the income of the farmers.

The PMFBY has been presently notified for implementation in A&N Islands for Kharif 2024 and Rabi 2024-25 seasons. Under the scheme, paddy is the notified crops for Kharif 2024 season and

pulses & vegetables crop have been notified under Rabi 2024-25 seasons for insurance coverage.

One cluster consists of all 3 Districts (South Andaman, North & Middle Andaman and Nicobar (Campbell Bay area only) has been formed for the implementation of Kharif 2024 and Rabi 2024-25 seasons under PMFBY. The indemnity level for all notified crops is 80% for both

South Andaman Police seizes
23.375 kgs of venison

Port Blair, July 8

The South Andaman District Police continues to demonstrate its unyielding attitude against the illicit trade and poaching of wildlife animals has achieved great success on seizure of 23.375 kgs of venison. On June 26, 2024, during patrolling near Tushnabad by SI Devanand Pathak, SHO PS Ograbraj along with ASI Suleman Beck, HC S. Vijay Kumar, HG(R)Sundra Bai and PC(D) Prokash Halder in Government vehicle, they noticed a lady with an

aluminium container in her hand rushing towards her house in a suspicious manner. Suspecting illegal activity, the lady was intercepted and during checking, it was found that the aluminium container was completely filled with venison packed in plastic polythene and one head of deer. Further, the venison and deer head were seized on the spot and the lady was detained after observing all codal formalities. Later, all the seized wildlife products and detained lady were handed over to Forest Officials for further

necessary action at their end.

The team of South Andaman, under the overall supervision of Smti Niharika Bhatt, IPS, SP South Andaman successfully conducted raids at various locations of South Andaman District, resulting in the confiscation of 158.375 kgs of venison from 1st January to 30th June, 2024. The primary goal is to ensure the safety and security of our citizens while preserving the rich biodiversity of these Islands, a press release from SP (SA) said.

PS Crime & Economic Offence seizes 1.025
kgs of ganja; two persons arrested

Acting on a specific intelligence received from a reliable source, in the night of July 1, 2024, a police team comprising of Inspector Girish Kumar, SHO, PS Crime & Economic Offence (C&EO), SI Parvash, HC/ K. Venkateshwar Rao, PCs N. Thangaraj and K. Rajendran, PC Amit Singh of PS C&EO led by Dy.SP (CID), conducted a raid at New Bimblitan near Periaswamy crusher. During the

operation, the team seized 1.025 kgs. of Ganja from the possession of one Tanmoy Roy, S/o Shri Hemendra Nath Roy, 29 yrs, Pvt. Carpenter, R/o New Bimblitan. He was promptly arrested on the spot following the due legal procedure as per the new criminal laws.

A case under relevant sections of NDPS Act- 1985 has been registered at PS C&EO. During investigation, the accused Tanmoy Roy was

put under sustained joint interrogation and on his disclosure, co-accused Sahil Hamid, S/o, Shri N. Shareef, 25 yrs, R/o Calicut junction was arrested on 03/07/2024. Previously, accused Sahil Hamid was arrested in a case under the Explosive Substances Act of PS C&EO. The entire operation was conducted under the overall supervision of Shri Rajeev Ranjan, IPS, SP (CID), a press release from SP CID said.

Total sum that can be insured against possible losses is arrived at by multiplying the scale of finance with the area covered.

All farmers (loanee or non-loanee) enrolled under PMFBY would be entitled for subsidy on the premium. Farmers will have to pay maximum or Actuarial premium rate, whichever is lower, for the notified crops under Kharif & Rabi seasons. As per revamped operational guidelines of PMFBY, farmer's premium share will be 2 % for paddy (Kharif season) and 1.5 % for pulses & 5 % for vegetables (Rabi 2024-25 seasons) of the sum insured is to be paid by the farmers as insurance premium for availing subsidy under the scheme. However, in the case of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, farmers need to pay only 0.5 % of the sum insured while the remaining amount is additionally borne as subsidy by the UT Administration.

PMFBY covers risks of losses arising from either of the possibilities of prevented sowing, sowing to harvesting (due to drought, dry spells, flood, inundation, pests and diseases, landslides, natural fire and lightening, storm, hailstorm, cyclone, etc), post-harvest losses up to a maximum period of two weeks from harvesting, for those crops which are required to be dried in cut and spread /small bundled condition depending on crops in that area, in the field after harvesting against specific perils of hailstorm, cyclone, cyclonic rains and unseasonal rains. It also compensates the farmers against localized calamities. Less than expected average yield due to mid season adversity viz. floods, prolonged dry spells and severe drought etc. is also compensated for under PMFBY.

All farmers including share croppers and tenant farmers growing the notified crops in the notified area are eligible for coverage. Such farmers are required to submit the necessary documentary evidence of land records prevailing in the UT (record of right, land possession certificate) or other document notified/permitted by the UT.

The cut-off date for the enrolment under the scheme for Kharif 2024 is 15.08.2024 and Rabi 2024-25 is 15.01.2025. The farmers have to approach the SBI or Co-operative Bank of concerned areas along with land records and enroll under the scheme or even register themselves in the National Crop Insurance Portal (NCIP) i.e. pmfby.gov.in.

After enrolment, in case of any losses to the crop arising out of risks may be intimated immediately (within 72 hours) by the insured farmer directly or through his own mobile or land line phone or any of his own means of communication or toll free numbers to the Implementing Agency (The Kshema General Insurance Limited), concerned bank, local Agriculture Department. For any assistance or queries, farmers are encouraged to contact Kisan Call Centre Help Line No. 243434/18003451145 or approach the Officers/Staff of Department of Agriculture in various zones. The farmers of Andaman and Nicobar Islands have been appealed to take maximum benefits of PMFBY, a press release from Directorate of Agriculture said.

Sponsored Advertisements featuring deep fake videos and images of prominent individuals are currently being disseminated across platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, and Google which are redirecting users to fraudulent WhatsApp/Telegram groups operated by cyber fraudsters, falsely presented as legitimate trading groups, investment advice platforms, or financial advisors. Within these groups, cyber fraudsters disseminate information regarding Stock Market, Stock Tips, Live Classes, and lure citizens to open Institutional Accounts with them to gain maximum profit through confirm Initial Public Offering (IPO) allotments. Cyber criminals share Play store / Appstore links or apk files of fake trading applications with potential victims for trading purposes. Indian mule bank accounts are given to potential victims for depositing money, initial payouts are made to gain trust, and after a significant amount is deposited, fraudsters stop communication and the citizens become victim of cyber financial fraud.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard yourself against Fake Stock Market Investment:

- Be extremely cautious of sponsored ads on Facebook, Instagram, or Google promoting



investment groups on WhatsApp or Telegram, as these may be fraudulent.

- Be alert to impersonation by fraudsters as FIIs/FPOs, financial advisors, or reputable institutions.
- Avoid sharing sensitive financial information like bank details or login credentials with unknown entities.
- Stay aware of common investment scams and remain sceptical of offers that seem too good to be true like promising unrealistically high returns.

'Be aware, Be Prepared, Be Safe' Directorate of Disaster Management issues advisory on Do's & Don'ts during Earthquake

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to geological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts (Zone -V) of the world and several great earthquakes have occurred in the past. The severe earthquake that occurred on December 26, 2004 caused horizontal and vertical shift of land mass in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which caused the loss of lives and property of this UT.

Considering the above, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has urged the general public of A&N Islands to adhere to the Do's & Don'ts of Earthquake to mitigate the impact of earthquake and save their precious lives.

Before Earthquake

- Consult a structural Engineer to make your house earthquake resilient.
- Fasten shelves securely to walls; place heavy/ large objects on lower shelves. Provide strong support to power and gas appliances.

- Prepare an emergency kit with essential items for safety and survival.
- Develop an emergency communication and evacuation plan for your family and community.
- Learn the technique of 'Duck-Cover-Hold'.
- Educate yourself and family members about earthquake risk by participating in earthquake safety programmes.

During Earthquake

- Stay calm do not panic. If you're indoors, stay inside. If you're outside, stay outside.
- Don't use matches, candles, or any flame. Broken gas lines and fire don't mix.
- If you are in a car, stop the car and stay inside until the earthquake stops.
- Duck under a table; Cover your head with one hand and hold the table till the tremors last.
- Stay away from mirrors and windows. Do not exit the building while the earth is still shaking.
- Move outside as soon as the tremors stop. Do not use a lift.

- When outside, move away from buildings, trees, walls and poles/ electric lines.
- When inside a vehicle, pull over in an open place and remain inside, avoid bridges.

After Earthquake

- Do not enter damaged buildings.
- If trapped in rubble:
 - ⇒ Do not light a matchstick
 - ⇒ Cover your mouth with a cloth
 - ⇒ Tap on a pipe or a wall
 - ⇒ Sound a whistle
- Use stairs and not lifts or elevators.
- Move cautiously and check for unstable objects and other hazards above and around you. Check yourself for injuries.
- Stay away from beaches. Tsunamis and seiches sometimes hit after the ground stops shaking.
- Do not spread and/ or believe in rumours.

- Avoid clicking on any link received in an SMS when dealing with such package deliveries.

- Avoid sharing your personal details such as address, email id,

phone number, etc. if not required.

- Avoid clicking on a link or calling back the number from an unexpected delivery notice via a SMS or email.

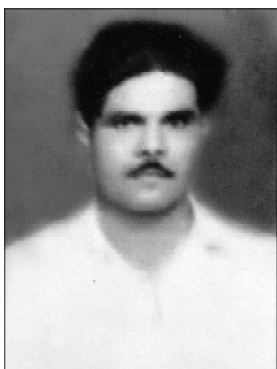
