## PM chairs 9<sup>th</sup> Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog; 20 States and 6 UTs attended the meeting

### Collective efforts of the Centre and States will lead to realizing the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047: PM

#### PM emphasizes on skilling and training of youth to make them employment ready



New Delhi, July 27 (PIB)

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi chaired the 9<sup>th</sup> Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog earlier today. The Meeting was held at the Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi. It was attended by Chief Ministers/Lt. Governors representing 20 States and 6 UTs.

Prime Minister emphasised on cooperation and collective effort of all States and the Centre to work together in order to achieve the vision of Viksit Bharat @2047.

Prime Minister observed that India has achieved steady growth in the past ten years. Indian economy, which was ranked 10<sup>th</sup> largest economy in the world in 2014, has risen to become the 5<sup>th</sup> largest economy by 2024. He added that now the collective aim of the Government and all citizens is to become the third largest economy in the world.

Prime Minister stressed that our country has already made a lot of progress in the past ten years by strengthening social and economic infrastructure. From being a predominantly import-driven country, India now exports many products to the world. The country has made its mark on the world stage in wide ranging sectors like defence, space, start-ups and sports. He appreciated the confidence and enthusiasm of 140 crore citizens, which is the driving force behind the progress of our country.

Prime Minister said that this is the decade of change which brings a lot of opportunities across sectors. He encouraged States to utilise these opportunities and make policies and initiate governance programmes that are conducive for development through innovative approaches

in policy making and execution.

He observed that the vision of Viksit Bharat can be realized through Viksit States, and that the aspiration of Viksit Bharat should reach the grassroot level i.e. to each district, block, and village. For this, each State and District should create a vision for 2047 so as to realise Viksit Bharat @ 2047.

Prime Minister appreciated the Aspirational Districts Programme anchored by NITI Aayog, and observed that the key to its success was continuous and online monitoring of measurable parameters, which led to healthy competition among districts to better their performance in different Government schemes.

Prime Minister emphasized skilling and training of youth to make them employment ready as the world looks favourably towards

India for skilled human resource.

He encouraged States to provide an investor-friendly environment. He directed NITI Aayog to prepare an 'Investment-friendly Charter' of parameters which would include policies, programmes and processes to be put in place for attracting investments. The States may be monitored on the achievement in these parameters to promote healthy competition among them for attracting investments. He also underscored the importance of law and order, good governance and infrastructure as vital for attracting investments, rather than just incentives.

Prime Minister encouraged the creation of River Grids at State level for effective utilization of water resources.

He suggested that we must target Zero Poverty as a priority for a Viksit Bharat. He

emphasized that we need to tackle poverty on an individual basis rather than just at a programme level. He observed that removing poverty from the grassroots would bring about a transformational effect in our country.

Prime Minister encouraged all States to increase productivity and diversification in agriculture and provide market linkages to farmers. He further emphasised on spreading the adoption of Natural Farming practices which can improve soil fertility, ensure better and quicker returns to farmers due to low costs, and also provide a global market for the products.

Prime Minister encouraged States to initiate Demographic Management Plans to address the issues of population ageing in future.

Prime Minister asked the States to take up

capacity building of government officials at all levels and encouraged them to collaborate with the Capacity Building Commission for the same.

Chief Minister/Lt. Governors gave various

suggestions for the vision of Viksit Bharat @ 2047 and also discussed steps being taken in their States. Some of the key suggestions and best practices highlighted were in the field of agriculture, education

and skill development, entrepreneurship, drinking water, reducing compliances, governance, digitalisation, women empowerment, cyber security, etc. Several States also shared their


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## PM Modi to share his thoughts in 'Mann Ki Baat' Programme today

follow the league of PMRBP awardees. The recipients of the award shall be declared on 26<sup>th</sup> December on 'Veer Bal Diwas'. The maximum number of awards would be 25. However, any relaxation to this maximum number may be permitted at the discretion of the National Selection Committee. The Award in each category shall carry a Medal, a Certificate and Cash Prize of Rs 1,00,000/-.

These awards aim to give due recognition to young hearts who have done selfless acts of exceptional abilities and outstanding achievements. Child Bravery Award is given to a child to acknowledge her/his selfless service in the face of risk to her/his own life; and/or an act of outstanding courage and daring, against an act of mental strength, quick wit and presence of mind in the face of grave danger to self and society.

The Child Excellence Award is given to children with exceptional abilities and outstanding achievements in Sports, Social Service, Science & Technology, Environment, Arts & Culture and Innovation, which deserve due recognition at the national level. These awards are conferred by the Hon'ble President of India in a special ceremony at New Delhi.

Any child, who is an Indian citizen and residing in India, and not exceeding 18 years (as on the last date of receipt of application/nomination) may apply for the award. The act/ incident/achievement should have been within 2 years of the last date of receipt of application/nomination for the year of consideration in the website i.e. <https://awards.gov.in>. The applications for the PMRBP 2024 will be received only on the online portal <https://awards.gov.in> upto 31.07.2024, designed for this purpose. There are two options on the portal i.e. either the applicant child himself/herself can fill the form or anyone else parents/officials/teachers etc can nominate the child.

The applicant should not be a previous recipient of the same award earlier in any category (including National Child Award for exceptional Achievement as were awarded by the Ministry earlier).

If any applicant has applied in more than one category, it will be at the discretion of the National Selection Committee to accept only one application, a press release from Directorate of Social Welfare said.

immediate attention.

Hepatitis can manifest in both acute and chronic forms. Acute Hepatitis may present with symptoms like jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eyes), dark urine, pale stools, abdominal pain and flu-like symptoms. Chronic Hepatitis, which develops over time, may initially be asymptomatic but can lead to severe complications such as liver cirrhosis, liver failure, and liver cancer. Tattoos on body has become a popular form of self-expression and art, however, getting a tattoo involves certain risks, including the potential transmission of infectious diseases such as Hepatitis.

Diagnosis typically involves blood tests to detect the presence of viral antigens, antibodies, or viral RNA. Imaging tests like ultrasound or liver biopsy might be used to assess liver damage.

Hepatitis A is usually self-limiting and supportive care is generally sufficient. For Hepatitis B, antiviral medications can manage chronic infections and regular monitoring is necessary. In Hepatitis C, modern antiviral medications can cure many cases, often with a high success rate. Whereas, Hepatitis D is managed by treating with antiviral medications and Hepatitis E generally resolves on its own, but severe cases may require supportive care.

Preventing Hepatitis involves a combination of vaccination, safe practices, and good hygiene. Vaccination is available for Hepatitis A and B and is highly effective. For Hepatitis C, preventive measures include avoiding high-risk behaviours and ensuring blood products are screened. Government of India is providing free vaccination for Hepatitis B to the infant after at the time of birth.

Public health initiatives focus on improving education about Hepatitis, increasing access early diagnosis treatment, and supporting efforts to reduce the stigma associated with the disease.

Hepatitis remains a significant global health challenge, but understanding its various forms, symptoms, and preventive measures can greatly reduce its impact. By promoting vaccination, safe practices, and early treatment, we can work towards controlling and eventually eliminating the threat posed by hepatitis, a press release from DHS said.




