# Andaman and Nicobar seeks UNESCO World Heritage status for four sites, including India's only active volcano

## Andaman proposes 4 sites, including India's only active volcano, for UNESCO tag to boost geo-heritage tourism and global recognition

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration is making significant strides to elevate the islands' natural heritage by proposing four of its remarkable landmarks for inclusion in the Tentative Lists of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Chief Secretary, Dr. Chandra Bhushan Kumar announced this development on July 28, 2025, emphasizing the Government's commitment to preserving and promoting the region's unique geological and ecological treasures.

Speaking to PTI, Shri Kumar revealed that the Administration is working closely with



the Geological Survey of India (GSI) to develop these sites as geo-heritage tourism hotspots. Among the proposed sites is Barren Island, notable for being India's only active volcano, a rare natural wonder drawing scientific interest and adventure travelers alike. Another significant site is Narcondam Island, famed for harboring the rare and endemic Narcondam Hornbill, making it a haven for bird watchers and nature enthusiasts.

The mud volcanoes of Baratang, a geological rarity with promising potential to become

wellness and eco-tourism destinations comparable to South Korea's famed Jeju Island, form the third site. Complementing these natural wonders is the striking natural rock bridge at Shaheed Dweep, a unique formation that already attracts thousands of visitors annually.

Shri Kumar highlighted the broader vision behind this initiative, stating, "We have taken several new initiatives to promote tourism across the Islands. This includes tapping into our heritage sites, those that reflect our history, biodiversity, and way of life." While these



landmarks are currently drawing tourists, Shri Kumar explained, "We now aim to develop them in a more structured, sustainable, and internationally recognised manner."

To achieve these goals, the Administration has partnered with the GSI to ensure comprehensive scientific documentation, infrastructure development, and responsible tourism planning. Shri Kumar underscored the dual objective of the project: "The goal is to bring global attention to these geological treasures while uplifting the local economy and strengthening conservation

efforts."

He further added, "Through this effort, not only will tourists gain deeper insight into our natural heritage, but local communities will also benefit economically. This is a unique, integrated initiative that broadens the scope of tourism in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands."

With this ambitious push, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands stand poised to become a globally recognized geo-heritage destination, offering visitors unparalleled natural wonders while fostering sustainable growth and conservation in the region. (Source: www.moneycontrol.com)

# Andaman To Get Five Luxury Eco-Tourism Resorts, Including One At Uninhabited Aves Island

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration has decided to build five-star resorts at five locations, including the uninhabited Aves Island, which will be opened for tourism for the first time, officials said on Wednesday.

The eco-tourism properties will come up at Shaheed Dweep, Megapode Resort in Sri Vijaya Puram, and Aves Island, Long Island and Smith Island in North and Middle Andaman, they said.

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands Integrated Development Corporation Limited has invited bids for developing the resorts on a public-private partnership basis on a design, build, finance, operate and transfer mode, they added.

The pre-bid meeting will be held on August 14, while the bidding will take place on September 15, officials said.

It is for the first time that the Aves Island will be opened for tourism. It is known for the acres of coconut plantation.

After the resort comes up, the Administration believes that Aves Island will become the most sought-after destination in the Andamans after Swaraj Dweep.

It is close to the Mayabunder town and has live and dead coral flat



The eco-tourism properties will come up at Shaheed Dweep, Megapode Resort in Sri Vijaya Puram, and Aves Island, Long Island and Smith Island in North and Middle Andaman.

A trek through the picturesque coconut plantations will take one to the lighthouse on the southern tip of the island, they said, revealing the plans being prepared to develop the destination.

A land parcel of 2.75 hectare is owned by the Administration, which will be handed over to ANIIDCO on lease for the development of the project, they said.

The property will involve an investment of nearly Rs 36 crore, and will have 50 rooms, officials said.

Various facilities, such as a shopping arena and a wellness centre, and recreational activities like scuba diving, fishing, trekking and camping will be available, they said.

The proposed resort at Lalaji Bay in Long Island would cost about Rs 391 Cr and have 220 rooms. The one at Smith Island would be set up at a cost of Rs 60 crore and have 70 rooms, while the property at Shaheed Dweep will be developed at Rs 172 crore and have 120 rooms.

The objective of the projects is to build a world-class and sustainable tourism infrastructure with low environmental impact, officials said. (Source: www.ndtvprofit.com)

### DC(SA) holds DLCC meeting to review preparatory arrangements for National De-worming Day observance

The District Level Coordination Committee (DLCC) Meeting was held today under the Chairmanship of Shri Arjun Sharma, IAS, Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, to review the preparatory arrangements for the observance of National De-worming Day (NDD) on 8<sup>th</sup> August, 2025. The program will be implemented by the Health Department in coordination with the Education Department and the Department of Social Welfare- ICDS. A Mop-Up Day is scheduled for 16<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 to cover

children who miss the initial round.

This initiative is part of the Government of India's flagship public health program aimed at eliminating intestinal worm infections by administering Albendazole tablets to all eligible children and adolescents aged 1 to 19 years at schools and Anganwadi Centres.

The DC (SA) directed the officials of line Departments to ensure that health workers, anganwadi workers and school teachers are adequately trained and mobilized for the successful implementation of the programme. During the administration of the de-worming medicine, Medical Officers In-charge of health centres

Shortage of 5 MW power due to closure of NVVN plant at Chatham to facilitate vacation of site for upcoming installation of new 10 MW power plant at same location  
General public, commercial establishments, Govt. establishments & hoteliers urged to judiciously use power during evening hours

Sri Vijaya Puram, July 30  
It is to bring to the kind notice of the general public that there is a shortage of 5 MW power due to closure of NVVN plant at Chatham to facilitate vacation of site for the upcoming installation of new 10 MW power plant at same location in addition to already prevailing shortage of 3-4 MW. As a result of the same overall paucity of 8-10 MW in Sri Vijaya Puram and adjoining areas of South Andaman is being experienced. To bail out from the present power crisis to some extent, it is appealed to all general public and consumers, c o m m e r c i a l establishments, Govt. establishments and hoteliers to judiciously use the power during evening peak hours from 5 PM to 11 PM. In addition, all commercial establishments shall switch off their ACs, hoteliers shall operate their DG sets and Industrial units shall close their operation from 1700 Hrs to 2300 Hrs. during peak hours for extending their kind cooperation to the Department, a press release from Electricity Department said.


GBPH hosts specialized training on infection control & antimicrobial resistance for sanitation staff

Sri Vijaya Puram, July 30  
G.B. Pant Hospital recently conducted a comprehensive training session on infection prevention and control practices with a focus on Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR), aimed at empowering its frontline sanitation staff with vital skills and knowledge for maintaining hospital hygiene and safety. The training was inaugurated by Dr. M.K. Saha, Medical Superintendent of G.B. Pant Hospital, and Dr. Arpita Saha, Additional Medical Superintendent. They emphasized the pivotal role of sanitation workers in infection control and public health protection. Organized jointly by the Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) Cell and the Kayakalp Team of the Hospital, the session aimed to reinforce awareness and best practices related to infection control protocols within healthcare facilities, the growing threat and impact of antimicrobial resistance, surveillance mechanisms to monitor infection trends and safety measures for healthcare workers. The training was led by Dr. Shahina Mustaqim, Nodal Officer (AMR), and Dr. Rohit Das, Nodal Officer (Kayakalp), who engaged the participants through practical demonstrations and discussions aligned with national health guidelines. The event concluded with a group interaction session and a collective pledge to uphold infection prevention as a shared responsibility in safeguarding patient and worker safety, a press release from GBPH said.



Infestation of Mealy bug and Rugose Spiralling Whitefly in coconut, fruits & vegetables  
Strategies to address the issue through biological control measures being undertaken in villages of Car Nicobar

Sri Vijaya Puram, July 30  
The presence of Mealy Bug and Rugose Spiralling Whitefly in Coconut, Fruits, and Vegetables has been observed to be proliferating in certain areas within various villages of Car Nicobar. In response, awareness campaigns are being organized across all villages of Car Nicobar, targeting the farming community with a particular focus on identifying symptoms, understanding infestation, and implementing management practices against Mealy Bug and Rugose Spiralling Whitefly in Fruits, Vegetables, and Coconut plantations. As part of a collaborative initiative, the District Administration, Tribal Council, Agriculture Department, CIPMC, and KVK-CIARI have developed both short-term and long-term strategies to address the issue through environmentally friendly methods and biological control measures. Farmers are being encouraged to implement cultural practices such as forced water spraying, appropriate spacing, regular inspections, pruning, and maintaining proper sanitation to prevent the accumulation of pests and diseases, while also promoting the use of Organic Pesticides to mitigate further pest and disease spread. In the affected areas, specifically Perka and Malacca village, the team consisting of KVK and departmental officials has undertaken the spraying of Neem-based pesticides. The village Headmen in Car Nicobar have been informed regarding the pest and disease infestation and are urged to remain vigilant and report any findings to the Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Car Nicobar and Agriculture Department, a press release from Agriculture Department said.

Animal infertility intervention drive conducted across 83 villages in Isles  
Initiative aimed to enhance livestock productivity by addressing reproductive health & nutrition

The Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS), A&N Administration conducted an animal infertility intervention drive from July 16 to 29, 2025, covering 83 villages across the Islands' rural regions. The initiative aimed to enhance livestock productivity by addressing reproductive health and nutrition, supporting farmers' livelihood and food security. During the drive, veterinary teams examined 2,299 cows out of 4,548 breedable animals. The camps provided multiple interventions in which 1,411 cattle were dewormed to improve digestion and overall health, 1,405 animals received mineral mixture supplementation to address nutritional deficiencies and support fertility and 1,044 cattle were administered targeted reproductive and health treatments, including hormonal and nutritional support, to improve conception rates and milk production. In addition to clinical services, the AH&VS Department organized farmer awareness programs to educate livestock owners on best practices for animal husbandry. These sessions covered balanced feeding regimens, disease prevention strategies, and reproductive care techniques to ensure sustainable calving cycles and enhanced milk yields. The training equipped farmers with knowledge to maintain healthy livestock and improve farm productivity. The initiative underscores the AH&VS Department's commitment to strengthening the rural economy through improved livestock health and productivity in the A&N Islands. By addressing infertility and nutritional challenges, the Department aims to enhance farm incomes and contribute to the Islands' agricultural development. The Department plans to continue such targeted interventions to ensure all breedable animals contribute effectively to the livestock sector, aligning with the A&N Administration's vision of promoting sustainable rural livelihoods and food security, a press release from Deptt. of AH&VS said.

Whereas, inputs have been received that Anti-national elements might carry out unlawful acts in South Andaman District which might endanger both, persons and property.  
And whereas, these Anti-national elements may stay in Hotels, Guest houses, Bed & Breakfast (Home Stays), Lodges, etc. while doing preparation, reconnaissance, and actual execution of these unlawful acts.  
And whereas, it is necessary to take speedy measures in this behalf, to protect property and prevent danger to human life and safety, thwart/prevent terrorist activities, which may affect and disturb Public Order and Tranquility in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.  
Now, therefore, I Arjun Sharma, District Magistrate, South Andaman, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by virtue of Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023 do hereby make the written order for strict compliance of following Conditions by the Owners of all such establishments in the jurisdiction of South Andaman District, of Andaman & Nicobar Islands:-  
1. Only those Hotels, Guest Houses, Bed & Breakfast (Home Stays), Lodges, etc. which possess valid licences, shall be allowed to function.  
2. All such establishments shall have sufficient number of CCTV cameras which shall cover the entry and exit of persons and selected critical locations of the premises. All the cameras installed at all the entry and exit locations shall be in working condition and their coverage shall be preserved for not less than 30 days.  
3. All such Hotels, Guest Houses, Bed & Breakfast (Home Stays), Lodges, etc. shall maintain a Register having complete details of persons staying in the said premise. A copy of the valid ID proof of such persons shall be kept for record.  
4. All such Hotels, Guest Houses, Bed & Breakfast (Home Stays), Lodges, etc. shall ensure that details relating to Form-C (Arrival Report of Foreigners in Hotel) are submitted to the Registering Authorities within the prescribed period. All procedures/guidelines shall be followed in respect of any Foreign National staying in the said premise.  
This order shall come into force w.e.f zero hours of 30.07.25 and shall remain in force for a period of 60 days unless withdrawn earlier.  
All such Hotels, Guest Houses, Bed & Breakfast (Home Stays), Lodges, etc. which contravene this order, shall be liable to be punished in accordance with the provision of Section 208 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023.  
As this order cannot be served individually upon all concerned, this order is hereby passed Ex-Parte. It shall be published for the information of the general public through the press and by affixing copies on the Notice Boards in the offices of all SSp, DySPs, Tehsildars, Patwaries and all Police Stations.

Whereas, it has been made to appear to me that there is an apprehension that anti-social elements may make their hideous clandestinely in the residential/commercial areas of the South Andaman District. If suitable measures to prevent the same are not taken, the unlawful activities of these people can cause breach of peace and tranquility besides posing grave danger to human life and safety and injury to public property.  
Now, therefore, I, Arjun Sharma, IAS, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, am of the opinion that some check vigil is necessary on landlords/owners/managers of the residential/commercial establishments while renting out or sub-letting the premises so that anti-social elements in the guise of ordinary tenants, domestic servants & Paying Guest may not cause harm to the citizen and that immediate action is necessary for prevention of the same.  
Now, therefore, I, Arjun Sharma, IAS, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by virtue of Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023, do hereby order as an emergency measure that no landlord/owner/manager of the residential/commercial etc establishment shall let/sublet/rent out any accommodation to any person unless and until he/she has furnished the particulars of the said tenant(s) or Paying Guest to the local Police Station concerned. Similarly, no landlord/owner/manager or the residential/commercial etc establishment shall employ any servants/house help/unless and until he/she has furnished the particulars of the said servants (s) to the local Police Station. All the persons who intent to offer accommodation on rent or employ any servant/house help shall inform in writing the particulars of tenants, paying Guests & Servants to the Station Officers concerned in whose jurisdiction the premises falls. Any breach of this order would invite action Under Section 208 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023.  
In view of above the emergent nature of the order, it is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general.  
This order shall come into force w.e.f zero hours of 30/07/2025 and shall be effective for a period of Sixty days and is applicable to those also who already have domestic servants/maids and has not informed the Police yet when order is in force.  
This order shall be promulgated by affixing copy thereof at the notice board of the office of the undersigned as well as the District Court, Port Blair and publication in News Paper having circulation in the areas through Office of the Information & Publicity, A&N Administration.
