

detailed the recently launched PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana that aims at installing rooftop solar and providing free electricity up to 300 units every month for one crore households. He highlighted that the scheme will play a pivotal role in greening the Islands.

Ms. Madhuri Shukla, Superintending Engineer, Electricity Department impressed upon the need for increased deployment of rooftop solar and highlighted the importance of capacity building of consumers, installers and creating opportunities for entrepreneurship for scaling up rooftop solar uptake in Islands.




