Hon'ble Lt. Governor accords approval to simplify various High Volume Services of Revenue Department

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 5

The general public of Andaman and Nicobar Islands have been informed that the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, Andaman & Nicobar Islands has accorded approval to simplify the following High Volume Services of Revenue Department, A&N Administration on the line of ease of doing:

> **No Dues Certificate and Non-Encumbrance Certificate:** The revenue receipt is issued by the Revenue Department every year and the same has to be verified at the time of Registration by Sub-Registrar i.e. SDM to check the revenue dues, if any. Hence, there is no need for the separate "No Due Certificate" and "Non-Encumbrance Certificate". The same shall be discontinued with effect from 09.06.2025. In case of any dues from any bank, same has to be verified by the buyer through Record of Right (RoR) and local inquiry. However, a self-declaration may be given by the parties for this on the line of ease of doing.

> **Valuation Certificate:** The practice of issue of Valuation Certificate shall be discontinued as this practice does not exist in States and UTs. Value of property to be calculated as per the notification of Circle Rate based on various factors. It shall come into effect from 09.06.2025.

> **Licensing under Petroleum Act, 1934 read with Petroleum Rules, 2002 and other relevant provisions:** ANIIDCO to open new petrol pumps as per the demand wherever required after taking

Deptt. of E&F pays tribute to former Chief Forest Officer, Durgaprasad

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 5

In first of its kind acknowledgement of contribution of a Forest Officer in India's Independence struggle, the bust of Durgaprasad was unveiled in Chatham Saw Mill by Shri A. K. Biswal, IFS, PCCF, in the presence of Shri Sanjay Kumar Sinha, IFS, PCCF (ANI) honouring his contribution in saving the Mill in the aftermath of the departure of British from the Islands during World War II. As the Chief Forest Officer, he defied the order of destroying the Mill citing importance of Mill as the only source of building material and major employment hub for the Islanders.

Durgaprasad demonstrated rare courage, foresight, and deep patriotism, preserving not only infrastructure but the very spirit of the Islands during one of its darkest hours. He also held the



post of Vice-President of the Andaman Chapter of the Indian Independence League (IIL), an organization founded by Rash Behari Bose to mobilize local resistance against colonial rule, because of which, he was arrested and tortured by both the Japanese and British authorities, who sought to force him to confess to false charges of espionage. Despite enduring brutal torture, he never succumbed to the pressure, consistently denying the charges against him. He was eventually released after the formation of the Azad Hind

Government but was re-arrested by the British after their re-occupation of the Islands.

As a punishment for this resilience, he was removed from the service when British returned to the Island, however, was reinstated after independence. He continued working for the betterment of Island and the Saw Mill till his last breath on 30 May, 1973. His courage and contribution would be remembered for the long time in history of Chatham Saw Mill, A&N Islands and the country, a press release from Forest Department said.

Speaking as chief guest, the Director, CIARI i/c, Dr. Jai Sunder, thanked the Tourism Depтт. for organizing such an important event at CIARI which is very relevant in taking forward tourism promotion in Isles in a big way.

The Agro Eco Walk offers a unique opportunity for visitors to explore the scenic and research-rich agricultural landscapes of the Islands, while promoting awareness about sustainable farming and biodiversity conservation. Dr. Chandra Bhushan Kumar, IAS, Chief Secretary of Andaman and Nicobar Administration, inaugurated the Agro-Eco Walk at Sippighat farm, ICAR-CIARI, Sri Vijaya Puram on 18th March, 2025.

At Sippighat Farm, visitors can enjoy a walk through the serene natural surroundings, walk through the spice-based plantation area, and explore the unique World Coconut Germplasm Centre, which conserves a vast collection of coconut varieties. The Spice Processing Unit gives insights into value addition and post-harvest technologies. The Mangrove Viewpoint provides a picturesque glimpse into the Island's coastal ecosystems, while the Farm Sale Point offers fresh and locally grown produce for purchase. The Agro Eco Walk is open from Monday to Saturday, between 9 am and 5 pm. Entry tickets are available at the Sale Point on the respective farm premises.

Ticket for adult person is Rs. 100 and children is Rs. 50 (below 18 years age) for individual farm either at Sippighat farm or Garacharna farm. If combined both farm then Rs. 175 for adult and Rs 75 for children. The ticket is inclusive of one complementary drink.

Speaking on the topic 'Agro Eco Tourism with Special Reference to Horticulture', Dr. Raj Narayan, Head, Division of Horticulture and Forestry, CIARI gave an overall picture of Horticulture in A&N Islands and the role of CIARI in its further propagation in A&N Islands. He said, Agro-Tourism is another way to generate income from the land and a way to introduce your farm as a brand to the consumers, which could open the door to developing a loyal consumer base for other products, he added.

In his address, Dr. Ramakrishna, Principal Scientist & Head, KVK-South Andaman enlightened the students on the topic 'Rare and Wild Indigenous Flowers, Fruits and Medicinal Plants of A&N Islands'. There are about 2000 species of flowering plants, of which, nearly 215 are endemic to these Islands. Nearly 110 Orchids species are naturalized here and a total of 47 new Orchids were described in the previous two decades, he said. He suggested incorporating 'Andaman Flower Festival' in the calendar of events, which will be an added attraction for the tourists and the islanders alike. He also answered queries regarding the commercial viability of floriculture by the prospective entrepreneurs.

Rally & Nukkad Natak organized by FTI as part of World Environment Day celebration

On the occasion of World Environment Day, the Forest Training Institute organized a Rally to raise awareness about ending plastic pollution depicting placards and banners, highlighting the significance of plastic free environment. The Rally which started from Forest Training Institute, passed through the local fish market, ration shops and vegetable markets, where the trainees distributed cotton carry bags to the locals and briefed them about the benefits of using biodegradable materials instead of plastic.

Many local residents, including youngsters, activists, Panchayat representatives and senior citizens,



participated in the program enthusiastically. The street play was performed by a team of 14 Forester Trainees of Forest Training Institute. They depicted the consequences of plastic pollution, burning waste, dumping garbage in water bodies, and excessive use of plastic harms the environment. A&N Police busted digital payment fraud racket; seven persons arrested

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 5

In a major breakthrough, the Cyber Crime Police Station of the Andaman & Nicobar Police has successfully busted a digital payment fraud racket involving the use of counterfeit mobile applications. Seven individuals have been apprehended for their role in orchestrating scams using fake versions of the popular "PhonePe" payment platform.

The fraudsters specifically targeted shopkeepers, auto-rickshaw drivers, and other unsuspecting members of the public. By showing fabricated transaction confirmation screens, they misled victims into believing payments had been successfully made, resulting in significant financial losses.

The operation was spearheaded by a dedicated team led by Inspector Sahil Shamsuddin, SHO, Cyber Crime Police Station.

The team conducted a thorough investigation, collecting critical digital evidence and executing coordinated field operations that led to the swift apprehension of

seven accused namely Reehan Rabbani (19) Yrs, Muhammed Shariq (19) Yrs, Rohit Kumar (20) Yrs, Bhodesh Singh (20) Yrs, D. Nagamahendra (23) Yrs, Hemant Rao (29) Yrs, Mohd. Arbaz (21) Yrs, incriminating articles including fake phone pay app was found in the mobile phones seized from the possession of apprehended accused.

The entire operation was conducted under the guidance of Shri Manish Kumar, DySP (Cyber Crime) under the overall supervision of Shri Jeetendra Kumar Meena, IPS, Senior

Superintendent of Police (CID).

A case has been registered under FIR No. 23/25 dated 02/06/2025 under Sections 318(2) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023.

The Andaman & Nicobar Police has urged all citizens to exercise caution when accepting digital payments. It is strongly recommended to independently verify transactions via personal mobile banking apps or official notifications, rather than relying solely on screenshots provided by customers, a press release from SSP(CID) said.
