BJP led NDA secures absolute majority in Lok Sabha Elections by winning 292 seats; BJP emerges as single largest Party with 240 seats

New Delhi, June 5

The BJP- led NDA has secured absolute majority in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections by winning 292 seats. Results of all 543 Lok Sabha seats have been declared. The BJP alone has won 240 seats. Telugu Desam Party has secured 16 seats and JD (U) 12. The I.N.D.I.A bloc has bagged 233 seats. Others have won 18 seats in the lower house of Parliament. The Congress secured 99 seats. Samajwadi Party got 37 seats while Trinamool Congress 29. DMK managed to win 22 seats.

Prominent candidates who have won include Prime Minister and BJP leader Shri Narendra Modi from Varanasi, Union Ministers Shri Amit Shah from Gandhinagar, Shri Om Birla from Kota, Shri Arjun Ram Meghwal from Bikaner, Shri Gajendra Singh Shekhawat from Jodhpur and Shri Jyotiraditya M. President dissolves 17th Lok Sabha



New Delhi, June 5

The President Smti Droupadi Murmu has dissolved the 17th Lok Sabha on Wednesday after the recommendation of the Union Cabinet. "The President accepted the advice of the Cabinet on June 5, 2024, and signed the Order dissolving the 17th Lok Sabha in the exercise of the powers conferred upon her by Article 85 of the Constitution," a statement issued by the Rashtrapati Bhavan said on Wednesday. Earlier in the day, a meeting of the Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi recommended the dissolution of the 17th Lok Sabha, whose term ends on June 16. Following the meeting, PM Shri Sub-Clause (2) of Modi tendered his Article 85 of the

Port Blair, June 5

The forecast for the next five days indicates cloudy and light to moderate rainfall is expected in Andaman and Nicobar Islands. The maximum temperature is projected to range between 30.0 and 32.0 degrees Celsius, while the minimum temperature is expected to be within the range of 25.0 to 26.0 degrees Celsius. Additionally, the forecast suggests that the maximum relative humidity will fall between 77 % and 82 %, and the minimum relative humidity will be in the range of 76 % to 80 % in the Andaman and

Nicobar Islands. Wind speeds are expected to range from 20.0 to 39.0 kmph, predominantly from the South Westerly direction.

Weather based agro advisories for Andaman and Nicobar Islands:

➤ Prepare the nursery field of paddy and before final preparation of nursery field apply farm yard manure @ 2 t/ha and neem cake @ 500 kg/ha.

➤ Transplant already grown vegetable seedlings of brinjal and chilli in upland area or BBF with well drainage facility.

➤ South westerly monsoon has

set, transplanting of coconut can be taken up.

➤ For transplanting arecanut seedlings, make pits of 45X45X45 cm and fill the pits with compost and top soil.

➤ Do breeding of IMC carps during rainy days and breed 1:2 (female : male) ratio of body weight and inject ovaprim @ 0.5 ml/kg for female and 0.2-0.3 ml/kg for male during evening hours in hapa.

➤ Cloudy weather will prevail and advised to keep the day old chicks under light preferably 40 watt bulb and provide clean drinking water.

A&N Police issues public advisory on fraudsters sending fake job offer SMSs to perpetrate Cyber Crime

A new trend in financial cyber fraud has been observed where fraudsters send fake job offer SMSs to perpetrate Cyber Crime. Fraudsters place online advertisements claiming that they can give jobs where one can make large amount of money working from home with little time and effort. A job scam occurs when a fraudster poses as an employer or recruiter, and offers attractive employment opportunities, which require job seekers to pay some money in advance. The SMSs sent by fraudsters offer high-paying

part-time jobs to siphon off victims' money and their personal information.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard the citizens:


➤ Avoid tempting job offers sent via text messages or emails by unknown senders.
➤ Scrutinize the job offering company online (use words like 'scam', 'fraud' or 'complaint' with company name to online search & verify if similar scams are happening).
➤ Avoid making any payment without

authenticating the employer for registration or other purposes.

➤ Securitize the SMS-Headers to confirm the authenticity of a job offer.

➤ Fraudsters typically show urgency in their requests. Scrutinize properly, if a request seems too urgent.


