26,31,060/-, thus paving a benefit of Rs. 17,86542/- to the bank loan borrowers. A sum of Rs. 2,93,000/- was realized on the spot. Disposing of 23 BSNL cases the involved amount of Rs. 2,91,039/- was settled at Rs. 1,42,500/-. A sum of Rs. 1,02,500/- was realized on the spot. Disposing of 391 Criminal cases a sum of Rs. 1,99,700/- was realized as fine.

In Mayabunder, one bench was constituted and 24 pre-litigation cases including 85 pre-litigation BSNL recovery cases were referred out of which 13 pre-litigation bank cases and 11 pre-litigation BSNL recovery cases were disposed of. Disposing of 13 bank recovery cases, the involved amount of Rs. 28,76,980.50/- have been settled at Rs. 20,36,000/- thus paving a benefit of Rs. 8,40,980.50/- to the bank loan borrowers. A sum of Rs. 47,500/- was realized on the spot. Disposing of 11 BSNL cases the involved amount of Rs. 17,703/- was settled at Rs. 10,500/- which was realized on the spot. 143 cases pending in different courts were taken up out of which 92 criminal compoundable cases were disposed of and a fine amount of Rs. 2,16,550 was realized.

In Diglipur, one bench was constituted and 53 pre-litigation cases including 77 pre-litigation BSNL recovery cases were referred out of which 14 pre-litigation cases were disposed of and 07 pre-litigation cases were disposed. The involved amount of Rs. 6,02,124/- have been settled at Rs. 3,74,000/-. A sum of Rs.73,500/- was realized on the spot. 43 cases pending in court were taken up out of which 20 criminal compoundable cases were disposed of and a fine amount of Rs. 48,650/- was realized.

Squally weather with surface wind speed reaching 35 45 kmph gusting to 55 kmph is very likely over Andaman sea and Andaman Nicobar Island from 22/06/2025 to 24/06/2025. Sea condition is likely to be rough to very rough. Fisherman have been advised not to venture into the sea along and off Andaman Sea & Andaman & Nicobar Islands from June 22 to 24, 2025.

Swell waves in the range of 15.0 - 18.0 sec period with 1.6 - 1.7 m height have been forecasted till 20:30 hours on 23-06-2025. There is a possibility of surging of waves, boats have been advised to ply with utmost vigilance and recreation should be conducted with due care, a press release from Directorate of Disaster Management said.
