PM addresses media before commencement of 1st session of the 18th Lok Sabha

"We believe that majority is required to run the Government but consensus is very important to run the country": PM

"I assure the countrymen that in our third term, we will work three times harder and achieve three times the results"

New Delhi, June 24 (PIB)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi addressed the media before the commencement of the 1st session of the 18th Lok Sabha today. The Prime Minister began his statement by calling today's occasion a proud and glorious day in parliamentary democracy as it is the first time after independence that the oath ceremony would take place in the new Parliament. "On this important day, I heartily welcome all the newly elected MPs and congratulate everyone", the Prime Minister said.

Terming the formation of this Parliament as a means



to fulfill the resolutions of the common man of India, the Prime Minister underlined that it is a critical opportunity to achieve new speed and height with new zeal. He said that the 18th Lok Sabha is commencing today to realize the goal of building a developed

India by 2047. The Prime Minister emphasized that the grand conduct of the world's largest election is a matter of pride for 140 crore citizens. "More than 65 crore voters participated in the electoral process", the Prime Minister said with delight as he noted

that it is only the second time after independence that the country has given its mandate to a Government to serve for the third time. "This opportunity has come after 60 years making it a proud event in itself", he added.

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi

expressed his gratitude towards the citizens for electing the Government for the third term and said that it puts a stamp of approval on the Government's intentions, policies and dedication towards the people. "In the last 10 years, we have tried to establish a tradition because we believe that a majority is required to run a Government but consensus is extremely important to run a country", the Prime Minister emphasized. He said that it has been the constant endeavor of the Government to serve Maa Bharati by achieving consensus and taking everyone along to fulfill the hopes

MoU inked between ANIBOCWWB and State Health Agency, UT of A&N Islands for providing access to AB-PMJAY to Building and Other Construction Workers

Port Blair, June 24

In a landmark move to enhance healthcare accessibility for building and construction workers, the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the State Health Agency, Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands today at Secretariat. The MoU ensures that eligible registered building and other construction



workers will receive coverage under the Ayushman Bharat (Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana- PMJAY), a flagship health insurance scheme of the Government of India.

Under this MoU, the

Andaman & Nicobar Islands Building and Other Construction Workers Welfare Board will bear the entire premium cost for PMJAY for all eligible registered building and other construction workers for

coverage of benefits under PMJAY. This initiative aims to provide comprehensive health coverage, ensuring that these workers and their families have access to quality healthcare services without financial strain.

The Ayushman Bharat- PMJAY scheme provides coverage of up to Rs. 5 lakhs per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization. With this initiative, the welfare of building and other

Mass Foot and Mouth Disease Vaccination Campaign in South Andaman

5576 cattle and buffaloes vaccinated against FMD, covering 1115 farmers so far

Port Blair, June 24

Mass Foot and Mouth Disease Vaccination Campaign is being carried out in South Andaman under the Centrally Sector Scheme, Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme (LH&DCP). The

Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services (AH&VS), A&N Administration, has launched the 29th Round (4th Phase of NADCP) of Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) mass vaccination. The vaccination campaign

began on June 1, 2024, targeting cattle and buffaloes across the villages of South Andaman. The Department constituted 10 specialized vaccination teams for this initiative consisting of vaccinators and animal handlers and

Senior Veterinary Officer as the team leader.

FMD is a highly contagious and infectious disease affecting cloven-hoofed animals such as cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goats and pigs. The disease

New mistletoe plant discovered in Long Island



Botanical Scientist: Dr. Lal Ji Singh

Dendrophthoe longensis L.J.Singh

Port Blair, June 24

Indian Botanical Scientist, Dr. Lal Ji Singh from Botanical Survey of India has discovered a new species of showy mistletoe family Loranthaceae from Long Island, one of the biodiversity hotspots under the Andaman group of Islands, which is a part of the Indo-Burma Hotspot. Mistletoe are relevant to several aspects and play important role in various ways such as ecologically important as keystone species, food for frugivorous birds, medicines.

The new species named as longensis in the name of geographical habitat (Long Islands of Middle Andaman) which is scientifically referred as Dendrophthoe longensis L.J.Singh. This species offered as Larval Food Influences Fecundity of Butterfly Larvae. The details of the scientific account have been published in an International Journal

of Botanical Taxonomy and Geobotany: Feddes Repertorium 134 (1):54-65.

The species found on the specific host plant (Mango; Mangifera indica L.) in edge of evergreen forest, low land area of the tropical forests. Despite them being a parasite, the new species is very important food resources for birds and butterflies. The leaves of new mistletoe species were observed severely fed by larvae of butterfly (Delias eucharis Drury) Adult butterfly lays eggs on other young parts and caterpillars develop on the host, but host tree (mango) was not attended by the butterfly larvae.

Dr. Singh said that hemiparasitic plant, Indian Dendrophthoe represented by 9 species among which four are from Andaman and Nicobar Islands of them two species are representing as the endemic taxa, D. longensis from

Andaman group of Islands and D. laljii from Nicobar Group of Islands.

Conservation status of the new species is assessed as "Endangered" based on the IUCN categories and criteria (IUCN, 20233).

The discovery of new species, D. longensis is highlighting the significance of the eco hotspot of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Besides, several novelties & botanical curiosities has been discovered from this Islands by Eminent Botanist, Dr. Singh which includes discovery of over 23 new species & one genus as new to science. One of his significant finding, reusable eco-friendly drinking straw from the Islands recently granted patent by Govt. of India. Presently, Dr. Singh is the Addl. Director & Regional Head of BSI, ANRC, Port Blair, a press release from BSI said.

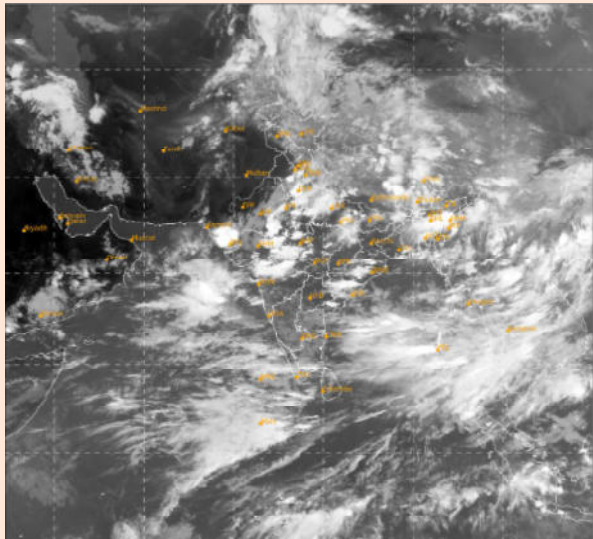

presents clinical signs such as high fever (104-106 degrees Fahrenheit), loss of appetite, dullness, excessive salivation, vesicles in the mouth (particularly on the gums and tongue) leading to ulcers, and wounds in the hoof, especially in the interdental space. Blisters may also appear on teats.

FMD results in significant economic losses due to reduced milk yield, decreased growth rate, and infertility. Transmission occurs through excretions and secretions from infected animals and can be spread mechanically by animals, humans, vehicles, and other contaminated objects. The World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) has classified FMD as a significant disease. The Department of AH&VS is committed to eradicate FMD from the Islands. In this round of mass vaccination, a total of 5576 cattle and buffaloes were vaccinated against FMD, covering 1115 farmers till date. Additionally, 1193 new cattle and buffaloes were ear-tagged and registered in the Bharat Pasudhan Portal. 416 pre-vaccination serum samples were collected for Sero-monitoring of FMD between June 1, 2024 and June 20, 2024.

The Department of AH&VS has requested all livestock owners to cooperate and ensure that their animals are ear-tagged and vaccinated against FMD to help make the Island FMD-free, a press release from Department of AH&VS said.

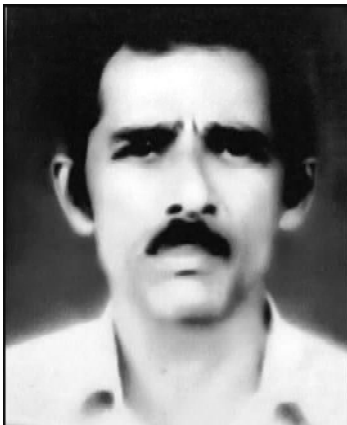
