Precautionary measure for movement of heavy vehicles over Chatham bridge revised

In exercise of the powers conferred under the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 (Act No. 59 of 1988), read with the Administration's Notification No./2008/ F.No.32-95/2008-TR dated 10th March, 2008, and this office Notification No. F .No. 9-170/LS/2018/PF-I/ 2687 dated 23rd May, 2025 the District Magistrate, South Andaman has notified for the information of all concerned that the precautionary measure for the movement of heavy vehicles over the Chatham bridge has been revised with immediate effect with the following restrictions:
➤ Heavy vehicle should not be allowed for load limit of 30 to 40MT on the Bridge as the bridge is deck slab and beams are in dilapidated condition.
➤ Light vehicle should be permitted below 5 MT is allowed for transportation of essential goods with the speed of less than 20KM/h. These restrictions shall remain in force until an alternate temporary bridge is made available. All concerned Departments, enforcement agencies, and transport operators have been directed to ensure strict compliance with this notification in the interest of public safety, a notification issued by ADM for District Magistrate South Andaman District said.

new additions such as the Coconut Festival and a Book Fair organised in collaboration with the National Book Trust are broadening the region's cultural appeal." "We want tourists to experience not just our scenic beauty and history, but also our rich cuisine, traditions and cultural diversity," the Chief Secretary added. On the new airport at Diglipur in North Andaman, Dr. Kumar said, "We aim to operate it for tourists by the next season. This enhanced connectivity will also help open access to Great Nicobar, the southernmost part of the territory in the future." In terms of sustainability, the administration is pushing for cleanliness and environmental stewardship. "Under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, solid waste collection is being managed in collaboration with local panchayats. A complete ban on small plastic bottles (below 2 litres) has also been implemented. A massive marine clean-up drive, led by the forest department, has already collected over 50,000 kg of marine plastic waste," he said. On the energy front, the administration is shifting toward clean power solutions. "A 50 MW LNG plant is currently under development, led by the National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC). A grid-based energy link between South and North Andaman is also in the pipeline, being executed in collaboration with the Power Grid Corporation. MoS, S&T Hails Successful Docking of Dragon Spacecraft Carrying Indian Astronaut to ISS

Seven 'Made-in-India' Experiments a Giant Leap in Space Sustainability: Dr. Jitendra Singh

New Delhi, June 27 (PIB)

In a proud and historic moment for the nation, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, Dr. Jitendra Singh, today lauded the successful docking of the Dragon spacecraft with the International Space Station (ISS), carrying aboard Indian astronaut Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla along with three other crew members.

Living up to the spirit of "Atmanirbhar Bharat" and "Vishwabandhu Bharat" envisaged by Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, Dr Jitendra Singh said, all the experiments to be carried out by Shubhanshu Shukla have been indigenously developed by Indian institutes and the results obtained from these experiments will be shared with the rest of the world. Dr. Jitendra Singh, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, Earth Sciences, and MoS in the Prime Minister Office, Dept. of Space and Atomic Energy who has been closely monitoring the developments of the Axiom-4 mission, stated, "India's role in space exploration is no longer limited to the launchpad. We are now shaping the future of life and science in space." He added that Group Captain Shubhanshu

Shukla carries India's scientific dreams to the frontiers of microgravity.

Highlighting India's robust scientific contribution, Dr. Jitendra Singh announced that seven fully indigenous microgravity experiments, designed and developed entirely in India, are set to be conducted by Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla aboard the ISS.

"These space-borne experiments are a living embodiment of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat and Vishwabandhu Bharat. The knowledge gained will benefit not just India but serve as a gift to the global scientific community and humanity," Dr. Jitendra Singh affirmed.

Dr. Jitendra Singh noted that the first experiment involves the study of edible microalgae, led

by ICgeb and BRIC-NIPGR New Delhi. This project focuses on observing the growth and metabolism of three selected varieties of edible microalgae in microgravity. The outcomes of this study hold significant potential for enhancing crew nutrition, enabling wastewater recycling, and supporting carbon dioxide to oxygen conversion, all of which are critical for long-term space habitation.

The second experiment, conducted by UAS Dharwad and IIT Dharwad, investigates the germination and nutritional properties of sprouting seeds, specifically moong and methi, under space conditions. The findings are expected to contribute to the development of nutritious food supplements for astronauts and explore the medicinal benefits of these sprouts in a microgravity environment.

The third experiment, developed by BRIC-InStem, Bengaluru, addresses the critical issue of muscle loss in space. By mimicking muscle regeneration in microgravity, the study aims to understand the biological mechanisms behind muscle degradation and identify potential interventions for astronaut health. These insights could also lead to new rehabilitation therapies for muscle-related disorders on Earth.

In the fourth experiment, researchers from IISc Bengaluru will examine the survival, revival, and reproduction of tardigrades, famously resilient microscopic organisms, under space conditions. This study is poised to offer valuable data on human adaptability and survival strategies in extreme environments, both in space

and potentially on Earth.

The fifth experiment, also by IISc Bengaluru, focuses on the interaction between humans and electronic displays in microgravity. The goal is to understand how astronauts perceive and interact with digital interfaces in space, which will inform the design of safer and more efficient spacecraft control systems and crew consoles.

In the sixth experiment, ICgeb, New Delhi, explores the growth of cyanobacteria using urea as a nitrogen source in microgravity. The findings could support the development of sustainable systems for carbon and nitrogen recycling in space and highlight cyanobacteria's potential as a superfood for long-duration missions.

Finally, the seventh experiment involves seed

resilience trials, testing rice, cowpea, sesame, brinjal, and tomato seeds that have been exposed to microgravity. The objective is to assess the impact of space conditions on these seeds, with the goal of advancing space agriculture and developing climate-resilient plant varieties suitable for cultivation on Earth and beyond.

Dr. Jitendra Singh emphasized that these pioneering efforts represent India's emergence as a global leader in space biosciences, echoing the country's evolving role from spacefaring nation to space science innovator.

"India is no longer a follower; we are leading missions of planetary relevance. These experiments will open new frontiers for sustainable life in space and resilient ecosystems on Earth," he said.



Scientists uncovers an exciting use of Teak leaf which offers a natural, biodegradable laser shield towards protecting delicate optical devices and human eyes from high-power laser radiation

New Delhi, June 27 (PIB)

Teak leaf extract could offer possible protection to our eyes and sensitize sensors that can be critically affected by accidental exposure to rays from cutting-edge lasers-used everywhere from medical equipment to military devices.

In an era of rapid development of laser technology, there is a need to protect delicate optical devices and human eyes from high-power laser radiation in medical, military and industrial settings.

Scientists at the Raman Research Institute (RRI), an autonomous institute funded by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, have uncovered an exciting use for the otherwise discarded leaves of the teak tree (*Tectona grandis* L.f). While these leaves are usually agricultural waste, they are rich in anthocyanins, natural pigments that give them a reddish-brown hue.

The scientists have spotted an extraordinary power called nonlinear optical (NLO) properties in these pigments when they interact with light. This property of the dye makes the teak leaf a suitable candidate for optical power-limiting applications. This discovery, published in the Journal of Photochemistry and Photobiology A: Chemistry, avoids the use of synthetic optical materials, which are costly and damaging to the environment.

"Teak leaves are a rich source of natural pigments, such as anthocyanin, which imparts a characteristic reddish-brown color when

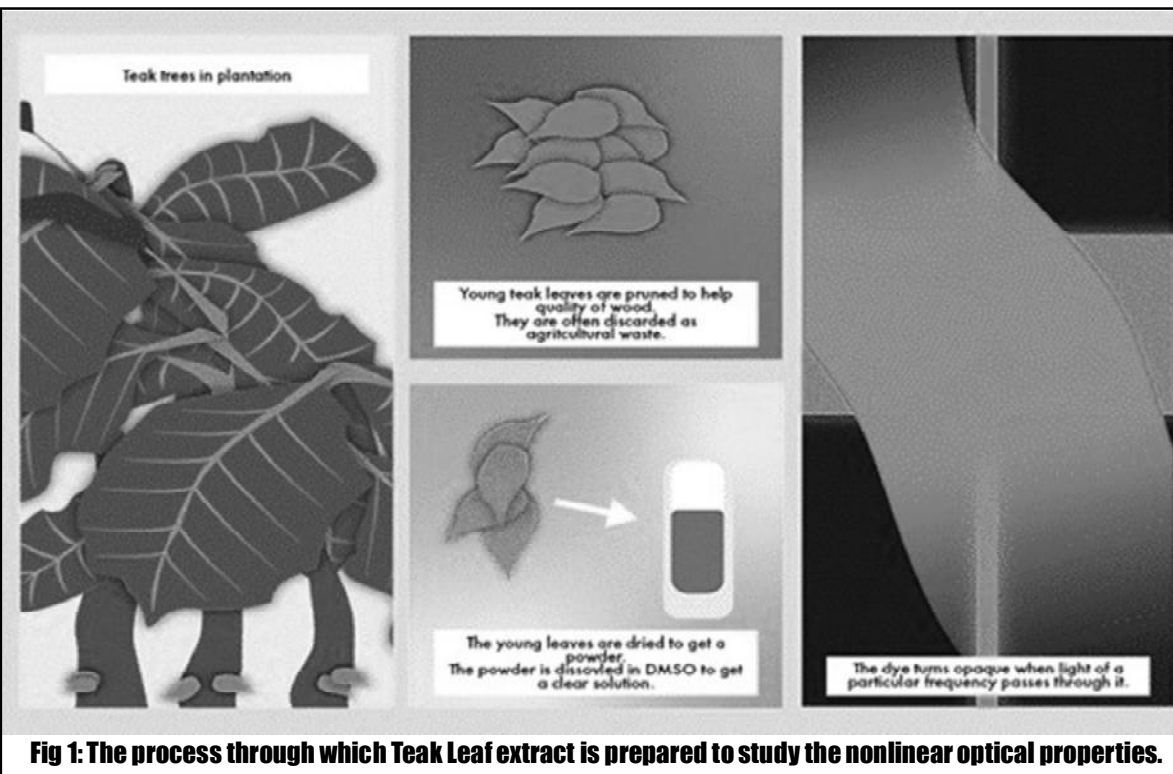


Fig 1: The process through which Teak Leaf extract is prepared to study the nonlinear optical properties.

extracted using suitable solvents. Recognizing this, we aimed to explore the potential of teak leaf extract as a non-toxic, biodegradable, eco-friendly and economically viable alternative to synthetic dyes in the field of nonlinear optics. By utilizing this underexploited natural

resource, we not only contributed to value-added waste utilization but also promoted the development of sustainable photonic materials with properties comparable to conventional synthetic counterparts," said Beryl C, DST Women Scientist at the Light and Matter Physics theme at RRI.

To harness the optical potential of teak leaves, the RRI team dried and powdered the leaves, soaked the powder in solvents, and purified the extract through ultrasonication and centrifugation. They were able to extract a vibrant, reddish-brown liquid dye and shot green laser light

through it at two levels of power: one steady (continuous wave), the other pulsing. The dye absorbed the light and adapted to it.

Through sophisticated experiments like Z-Scan and Spatial Self-Phase Modulation (SSPM), they found that the dye showed reverse saturable absorption (RSA). This means the more intense the light, the more the dye absorbed-exactly the behaviour needed for laser safety gear.

The discovery of natural, eco-friendly optical materials which are inexpensive, compostable and biodegradable is of very high importance regarding the future demands of photonic technologies. Traditional optical limiters rely on expensive materials such as graphene, fullerenes, and metal nanoparticles, which can be harmful to the environment due to their sophisticated methods of synthesis. In comparison, teak leaf dye is simple to obtain from nature and therefore provides a sustainable solution.

This research opens up new possibilities for the manufacture of modern, eco-friendly laser protective equipment, such as safety goggles, shields for optical sensors, and laser-resistant coatings, making use of the natural teak leaf extract. Future studies could focus on ways to make the dye more stable for long-term use and utilize it in commercial photonic devices. With continued advancements, this natural dye may be used extensively in green optical technologies to reduce the risk of laser-induced damage, making the technological world a less dangerous and more environment-friendly place.
