Essential Medicines and Diagnostics to be provided free of cost in all Government Health Facilities

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 6

In a landmark step towards achieving Universal Health Coverage, Andaman & Nicobar Administration has initiated steps to notify the Essential Medicines List (EML) and Essential Diagnostics List (EDL) in all public health facilities across the Union Territory.

This initiative aligns with the guidelines of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, and is aimed at making essential healthcare services accessible, affordable, and equitable for all residents of A&N Islands.

The essential medicines and diagnostic services listed under the notified EML and EDL will be available free of cost at the following Government Health Institutions:

- District Hospitals (DHs)
- Community Health Centres (CHCs)
- Primary Health Centres (PHCs) / Urban PHCs (UPHCs)
- Sub-Health Centres (SHCs)

**Key Objectives of the Initiative:**

- Ensure the uninterrupted availability of essential medicines and diagnostic tests.
- Promote the rational use of medicines and diagnostics in line with standard treatment protocols.
- Reduce out-of-pocket expenditure (OOPE)

NDRF conducts training on CSSR & MFR for Fire Service personnel

In a significant step towards strengthening disaster preparedness, a five-day intensive training programme on Collapse Structure Search and Rescue (CSSR) and Medical First Responder (MFR) was successfully conducted from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> June, 2025 in the Conference Hall of A&N Fire and Emergency Services Training Centre, Sri Vijaya Puram. The training was organized for the personnel of the Fire and Emergency Services Department, who are the first responders during any disaster or emergency in the Islands.

The specialized training sessions were delivered by an expert team from the Regional Response Centre, Fourth Battalion, National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), Port Mout and aimed to enhance the preparedness and response capabilities of Fire Service personnel in dealing with structural collapses and providing essential medical aid in the immediate aftermath of disasters.

More than 80 personnel from Fire and Emergency Services actively participated in the programme through offline and virtual modes, ensuring maximum outreach and engagement. The training focused on essential life-saving techniques, latest search and rescue methods, including locating and extricating victims from collapsed

PS Humfrygunj solves double robbery case; three accused arrested

Sri Vijaya Puram, June 6 With the unwavering commitment towards zero tolerance against crime, the dedicated team of Police Station H u m f r y g u n j successfully solved two serious cases of assault, snatching and robbery within 48 hours.

On 02/06/2025, Shri John Peter came to Police Station and informed that Naman Kumar @ Bittu, Babar Ali Mallick both R/o Atlanta Point and Manoj @ Babla, R/o Nayasahar had manhandled Shri Nipen Sardar near White Coral Bar. Upon this, he intervened to neutralize the situation but he also got beaten by them. Later on, they robbed his and Shri Nipen Sardar's gold chains.

Upon this, cases were promptly registered at Police Station Humfrygunj and a team was swiftly constituted led by SI Gaurav Banerjee, SHO, PS Humfrygunj to conduct search of offenders. On the same day, accused persons Naman Kumar and Babar Ali Mallick were arrested from Atlanta Point, Aberdeen Bazaar and another accused Manoj was arrested from Nayasahar after observing all codal formalities. The robbed two gold chain, total weighing 27 gms worth Rs. 3 lakh approx. were also recovered.

The entire operation was conducted under the supervision of Shri Brij Mohan Meena, SDPO Bambooflat and overall supervision of Shri Manoj Kumar Meena, IPS, Sr. Superintendent of Police, South Andaman District, a press release from SSP(SA) said.

The drill commenced with a simulated earthquake and fire scenario, following which the Department teams carried out safe evacuation, head counted, communicate with State Emergency Operation Center (SEOC-1070), District Emergency Operation Center (DEOC-S/A-1077), and Emergency Response Support System (ERSS-112) for emergency supports, search and rescued missing persons and provided first aid to the injured. Fire tenders and ambulances arrived swiftly to manage the incident situation.

After the drill concluded, a debriefing session was conducted to discuss observations and identify areas for improvement. Officials from the Disaster Management and Fire Departments highlighted the importance of providing basic disaster management training to Departmental staff. Shri Gaurang Mishra, Director of Economics & Statistics, acknowledged the shortcomings identified and assured that they would be addressed in the next drill, a press release from Directorate of Disaster Management said.
