At present, the operation of outlet has started through the SHGs of Prothrapur and Ferrargunj Blocks of South Andaman District and later will be extended to the SHGs of other Blocks. The ANIRLM has tie-up with NABARD to provide financial assistance to the SHGs under their Financial Inclusion Fund to pay nominal rent to the Airport Authority of India along with the courier/ transportation charges for the products of the SHG members, a press release received here said.

Four cases registered against one travel agent by South Andaman District Police for cheating tourists

Based on the complaints received from various complainants, a total of 04 cases were registered at Police Station Aberdeen against one Satyaki Maiti, S/o Sajal Maiti (29) yrs, Owner of Scintillating Andamans, R/o Dairy Farm near Shiv Mandir for cheating in the year 2023 and 2024.

The accused had claimed himself as a travel agent in the name and style of Scintillating Andaman by luring tourists, he uploaded fake tour details on his website and circulated them via Facebook, Instagram and

other social media platforms. He took advance amount from tourists who were willing to visit Andaman by giving fake price quotes to the tourist, which tends to be the lowest rate compared in the market and promised them satisfactory services at Andaman. But after reaching Andaman, the tourists faced issues related to booking of rooms (accommodation) and transport (ferry and cab services) etc. during their stay at Andaman.

Later on, he created another website in the name and style "Happy Journey Andaman" and

circulated them in social media platforms. In these 04 cases, around Rs. 5,36,000/- have been cheated by the accused.

On the matter, accused Satyaki Maiti has been arrested and presently he is in Judicial Custody. Investigation of all the cases are in progress.

Meanwhile, the general public have been requested to share information pertaining to illegal activities and other crime to Police at 112, 03192-232100, 03192-236641 & 03192-232400. The identity of the informant will be kept secret, a press release from SP (SA) said.




