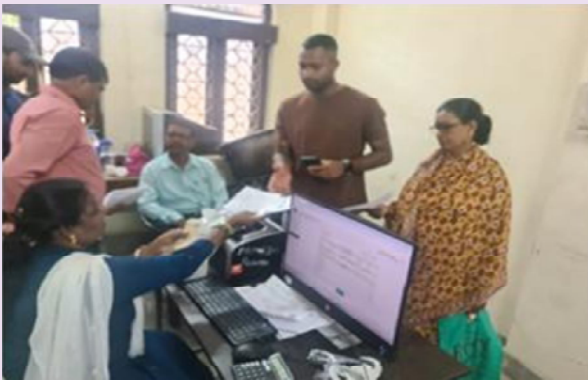

44 students volunteered to work as Animal Welfare Ambassadors. They were selected as 'Guardians of Voiceless' to spread the message of kindness and compassion for the animals. The awareness program aimed to educate the community about tuberculosis, its prevention, and treatment options, emphasizing the importance of early detection and adherence to treatment.

Dr. Alice Bwa, Medical Officer, provided an insightful



overview of TB, detailing its transmission, symptoms, and the distinction between latent and active TB. The session aimed to clear up common myths and misconceptions surrounding the disease. Shri Madhava Rao, District Programme Coordinator for N&MA, also spoke about the Nikshay Poshan Yojna and the Nikshay Mitra initiative, informing the participants about

the resources available for those affected by TB.

The participants were made aware of the critical role of early diagnosis and the availability of screening and testing services. Preventive measures were also discussed, including the importance of vaccination, maintaining a healthy lifestyle, and ensuring proper ventilation in living spaces to help prevent the spread of TB, a press release from DTO, N & M Andaman said.

house, who has time for anything else?

Farida: That's exactly why we're here. It's about cleanliness.

Kamla (yawning): Alright, tell me.

Jenny: From now on, the Nagar Palika's Safai Mitras will go house-to-house with three large sacks to collect garbage.

Blue Sack: For dry waste - paper, glass, thermocol, styrofoam, rubber, metal, cloth, empty bottles, stationery, etc.

Green Sack: For organic waste - food scraps, dirty food wrappers, tissues, hygiene products, and any other dirty items that could contaminate recyclables.

Red Sack: For hazardous waste - bio-medical waste, chemicals, batteries, diapers, sanitary napkins, etc.

Kamla: Uff, now who will bother with separating all the garbage? And convincing my family to follow this - that's another headache!

Farida smiled reassuringly.

Farida: Don't worry so much. You only have to do two things:

1. Buy three color-coded bins - **blue**, **green**, and **red**. They're affordable and won't strain the household budget.

2. Gather the family and explain what goes into each bin. Simple, right?

Kamla (frowning): But isn't this the municipality's job? We give them all our household garbage - they should separate it!

Jenny: Think about it - for us, separating waste takes just a few moments. But for our sanitation workers, they have to collect garbage from hundreds of houses, often in the scorching heat, and sometimes we even make them wait at the door! Helping them is the least we can do. After all, it's our responsibility to keep our homes and surroundings clean. One small step from us makes a huge difference in waste management.

Farida: Kamla, Andaman and Nicobar is a small island, and managing waste here is a big challenge. The municipality is trying to solve the problem, but it all starts with us. If we don't segregate our waste, their job becomes ten times harder. That's why we came to talk to you, sister. Kamla thought for a moment, realizing the truth in their words.

Kamla: You're right. Cleanliness starts at home. If this small step can help our island, then I'm in. Let's go to the market and get those bins right away! The three women walked off with a newfound sense of purpose, ready to make a change, one bin at a time. (Source: SVPMC)

Training-cum -Orientation Session on 'Prevention and Control of Tobacco Uses' held at CHC Bambooflat

A training-cum-orientation session on 'Prevention and Control of Tobacco Uses' was held on March 13 in the Conference Hall, CHC Bambooflat. The session was organized by the National Tobacco Control Programme (NTCP) in coordination with National Oral health Programme (NOHP) under the State Health Society, Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

Shri Abdul Salam, Health Educator, CHC Bambooflat welcomed the gathering. The programme featured three technical sessions, including 'Tobacco Control - An Overview' by Dr. Satayjit Halder, State Nodal Officer (NTCP), who emphasized the importance of tobacco control and the role of healthcare professionals in preventing and controlling tobacco use.

Dr. Sanjeev Jaichand, Nodal Officer (NOHP), delivered a session on 'Tobacco and Oral Health', highlighting the link between tobacco use and oral health problems. Dr. Jaichand also conducted a special session on 'World Oral

Health Day', which is observed on March 20 every year. Dr. Rajiv Ghosh, District Public Health Officer, South Andaman, spoke on 'Tobacco Control Law', emphasizing the importance of enforcing tobacco control laws to prevent and control tobacco use.

The training session was attended by healthcare professionals, including Medical Officers, ANMs, Staff Nurses, PHNs, HEs, ASHAs and Anganwadi Workers, who played a crucial role in preventing and controlling tobacco use. The session aimed to equip healthcare professionals with the knowledge and skills necessary to provide effective tobacco cessation services and to promote tobacco control efforts in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

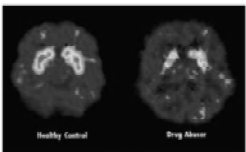

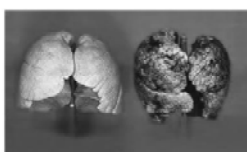
