

Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman conducts recce for augmentation of more water resources

Port Blair, May 11

The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman, Shri Arjun Sharma, IAS along with Engineering Wing of APWD/PRI and elected representatives conducted extensive exploration for augmentation of more water resources to meet the challenge of scarcity of water during summer seasons in South Andaman District.

The Deputy Commissioner explored various villages and issued directions to Engineering Wing to carry out the de-silting of Jinga Nallah at Mile Tilak.

The proposal for construction of Dam at Manjeri was explored which could be utilised for continuous supply of



clean water to the residents of Ferrargunj and Port Blair. The ongoing water Project at Guptapara was inspected and directions were issued for de-silting the catchment area for more quantity of fresh water. The EE, PHED, APWD was directed

to carry out the works on war footing on the projects which includes Vasundara Dam and all check weirs within N a y a s h a h a r , D h a n i k h a r i , M a n g l u t a n , Guptapara & Manjeri villages. The Vasundara Check Weir shall be de-silted

by the use of excavators. The EE, PHED, APWD was directed to carry out the works within two days. The project at Bada Nallah is nearing completion and once functional it will connect with the village of Brindaban, Namunaghar and

Mithakhari to provide clean water within these villages. The abandoned Water Pump at Mathura village was explored and a meeting has been fixed with the PRIs, APWD and Revenue Administration to resolve the issue.

District Administration, South Andaman continues eviction drive

8500 sq. mtrs of land restored to Govt. Khata in past few days

Port Blair, May 11

The District Administration, South Andaman continues its unwavering commitment to reclaim public spaces through determined encroachment drives. The encroachment drives which are continuing for the past 15 days has gained significant momentum and many unauthorized structures were evicted. Fresh encroachment in the shape of asbestos sheets over Government revenue land bearing situated at Teylorabad village (Macca Pahad) has been removed by the Revenue Officials and an area of 300 sqmts has been restored to Govt. Khata.

Strict vigil and monitoring is being done by the Revenue Authorities and in its continuous efforts,



8500 sq. mtrs of land has been restored back from encroachment by unscrupulous elements in past few days in South Andaman District. The Deputy

Commissioner, South Andaman cautioned the general public to refrain from encroaching on Government land and that the District

The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman directed that the proposed Pond at Chouldari requires immediate cleaning and the Tehsildar, Ferrargunj has been directed to explore an area of suitable land for setting up a Water Pump. Instructions were given to APWD to develop the Check Weir at Rubber Board Plantation with proper planning and further to issue water through Tankers to the residents of Hobdypur, Tushnabad and Ograbraj. The Check Weir and Ring Well at Mannarghat shall be immediately instated for use in providing clean water to the residents. The Bore Well situated at the Bus Terminus Bambooflat shall be made into operational. Necessary unfinished works shall be initiated without fail.

During the inspection of Sona Pahad Check Weir Dam, it was suggested that the catchment area should be widened for construction to cover larger area so that rainwater could be stored. The extension of the area of the Check Weir will supply continuous water during the dry season.

The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman directed the EE, APWD to make arrangements for continuous supply of water through trucks till an alternative arrangement is made available at the areas of Mithakhari and Tushnabad where villagers are getting water after 7 days.

Directions were also issued to the EE, APWD & EE, PHED to construct overhead Tanks wherever necessary so that proper water distribution through gravity is made easy.

The Deputy Commissioner, South Andaman directed the Engineering Wing that there should be more Ponds /Check Weirs constructed at areas with water scarcity and to ensure that all the ponds are cleaned and maintained in good condition so that rainwater could be stored and used by the public. Further, instructions were issued for replacement of the damaged pipelines at Manglutan, Guptapara and Manjeri villages immediately, a press release from DC, SA said.

Do's & Don'ts during Earthquake

Port Blair, May 11

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to geological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts (Zone -V) of the world and several great earthquakes have occurred in the past. The severe earthquake that occurred on December 26, 2004 caused horizontal and vertical shift of land mass in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which caused the loss of lives and property of this UT.

Considering the above, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has urged the general public of A&N Islands to adhere to the Do's & Don'ts of Earthquake to mitigate the impact of earthquake and save their precious lives.

Before Earthquake

⇒ Consult a structural engineer to make your house earthquake resilient.
⇒ Fasten shelves securely to walls; place heavy/ large objects on lower shelves. Provide strong support to power and gas appliances.
⇒ Prepare an emergency kit with essential items for safety and survival.
⇒ Develop an emergency communication and evacuation plan for your family and community.
⇒ Learn the technique of 'Duck-Cover-Hold.'

⇒ Educate yourself and family members about earthquake risk by participating in earthquake safety programmes.

During Earthquake

⇒ Stay calm do not panic.

If you're indoors, stay inside.

If you're outside, stay outside.

⇒ Don't use matches, candles, or any flame. Broken gas lines and fire don't mix.

⇒ If you are in a car, stop the car and stay inside until the earthquake stops.

⇒ Duck under a table; Cover your head with one hand and hold the table till the tremors last.

⇒ Stay away from mirrors and windows. Do not exit the building while the earth is still shaking.

⇒ Move outside as soon as the tremors stop. Do not use a lift.

⇒ When outside, move away from buildings, trees, walls and poles/electric lines.

⇒ When inside a vehicle, pull over in an open place and remain inside, avoid bridges.

After Earthquake

⇒ Do not enter damaged buildings.

⇒ If trapped in rubble:

Do not light a matchstick

Cover your mouth with a cloth

Tap on a pipe or a wall

Sound a whistle

⇒ Use stairs and not lifts or elevators.

⇒ Move cautiously and check for unstable objects and other hazards above and around you. Check yourself for injuries.

⇒ Stay away from beaches. Tsunamis and seiches sometimes hit after the ground stops shaking.

⇒ Do not spread and/or believe in rumours.

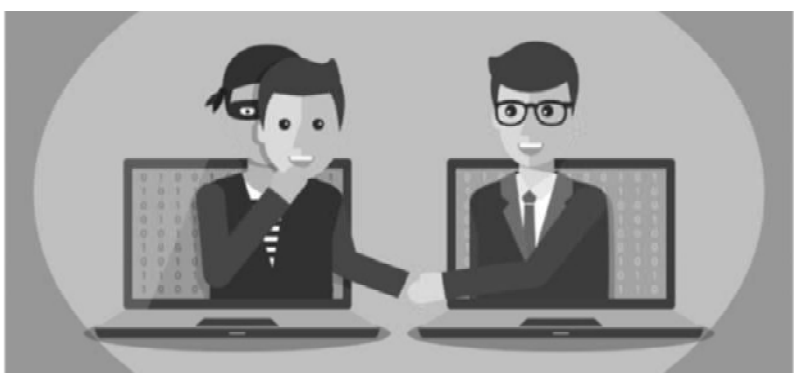
A&N Police issues public advisory on how fraudsters using armed forces personnel details to perpetrate financial cyber frauds

A new trend in financial cyber fraud has been observed where fraudsters impersonate Indian army personnel to exploit the goodwill associated with the armed forces to siphon off money from innocent victims who have advertised to put their property (House, Flat, Rooms, etc. on rent) on the popular house renting websites/apps, real estate database website or social media websites, etc.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police issues the following advisory to safeguard yourself:

Always remember that entering OTP is a requirement for sending money, not for receiving it. ● If an unknown person makes contact for renting your house, flat, or rooms,



etc., try to confirm his/her identity from other available methods/sources.

● Fraudsters typically show urgency in their requests. Scrutinize, if a request seems too urgent.

● Avoid relying on conversations and identity details provided by unknown people on messaging apps, house renting platforms, etc.

● Scrutinize every transaction request made to you from people unknown to you.

● Captiously perform transactions on various online transaction platforms, aware yourself with all the features a payment gateway.

Precautionary measures during Tsunami

Port Blair, May 11

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to Geological and Hydro-meteorological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts of the world and vulnerable to earthquake and tsunami disasters. Tsunamis are powerful and dangerous natural disasters that can cause devastating damage and loss of life. The Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has requested the general public of A&N Islands to follow the Do's & Don'ts of Tsunami, if it occurs.

DO'S:

► Pay attention to tsunami warnings: If you live in a coastal area or are visiting one, make sure to be aware of any tsunami warnings issued by the authorities.

► Move to higher ground: If

a tsunami warning is issued, move to higher ground immediately. Do not wait for official instructions or for the wave to arrive.

► Follow evacuation orders: If authorities issue an evacuation order, follow it immediately. Do not delay or hesitate.

► Stay tuned to local news: Stay tuned to local news and radio stations for updates on the situation.

► Be prepared: Have an emergency kit ready, including food, water, medications, and important documents.

DON'Ts:

► Don't stay in low-lying areas: If you are in a low-lying area and a tsunami warning is issued, do not stay there. Move to higher ground immediately.

► Don't go to the coast to watch the wave: Tsunamis are not a spectator sport. Stay

away from the coast and do not go there to watch the wave.

► Don't use the beach as a shelter: Do not use the beach or shoreline as a shelter during a tsunami. The wave can be much higher than the normal tide level and can quickly flood the area.

► Don't use elevators: If you are in a building during a tsunami, do not use the elevators. Use the stairs instead.

► Don't return to the area until it is safe: After a tsunami, do not return to the area until authorities declare it safe to do so.

Agromet Advisory Bulletin : Medium Range Weather Forecast

Port Blair, May 11

The forecast for the next five days indicates generally cloudy weather and thunder very likely with light to moderate rainfall is expected in Andaman and Nicobar Islands during this period. The maximum temperature is projected to range between 33.0 and 34.0 degrees Celsius, while the minimum temperature is expected to be within the range of 27.0 to 29.0 degrees Celsius.

Additionally, the forecast suggests that the maximum relative humidity will fall between 67 % and 72 %, and the minimum relative

humidity will be in the range of 62 % to 68 % in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Wind speeds are expected to range from 4.0 to 9.0 kmph, predominantly from the South Easterly direction.

Weather based agro advisories

For Andaman and Nicobar Islands

⇒ Provide temporary shed to the vegetable nursery to avoid losses as rainfall is expected during next five days.

⇒ Remove the weeds and prepare small basin around the plant/tree for rain water harvesting in cucurbits and drumstick.

⇒ Select good variety nuts of arecanut and coconut and prepare nursery bed with proper drainage.

⇒ Take up the crown cleaning of coconut palms before fertilizer application.

⇒ Close the bunds of firm pond to harvest rain water as rainfall is expected.

⇒ Provide lighting for egg laying poultry birds by using electric bulbs as cloudy weather will prevails.

⇒ Provide clean and hygienic water treated with potassium permanganate (1 ppm) to the poultry and local chickens to avoid gastrointestinal infection. (Source: CIARI, Port Blair)
