ORDER

Whereas, it has been made to appear to me that there is an apprehension that anti-social elements may make their hideous clandestinely in the residential / commercial areas of the South Andaman District. If suitable measures to prevent the same are not taken, the unlawful activities of these people can cause breach of peace and tranquility besides posing grave danger to human life and safety and injury to public property.

Now, therefore, I, Arjun Sharma, IAS, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, am of the opinion that some check vigil is necessary on landlords / owners / managers of the residential / commercial establishments while renting out or sub-letting the premises so that anti-social elements in the guise of ordinary tenants, domestic servants & Paying Guest may not cause harm to the citizen and that immediate action is necessary for prevention of the same.

Now, therefore, I, Arjun Sharma, IAS, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by virtue of Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023, do hereby order as an emergency measure that no landlord / owner / manager of the residential / commercial etc. establishment shall let / sublet / rent out any accommodation to any person unless and until he / she has furnished the particulars of the said tenant(s) or Paying Guest to the local Police Station concerned. Similarly, no landlord / owner / manager or the residential / commercial etc. establishment shall employ any servants / house help / unless and until he /she has furnished the particulars of the said servants (s) to the local Police Station. All the persons who intend to offer accommodation on rent or employ any servant / house help shall inform in writing the particulars of tenants, Paying Guests & Servants to the Station Officers concerned in whose jurisdiction the premises falls. Any breach of this order would invite action Under Section 208 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS)-2023.

In view of above the emergent nature of the order, it is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general.

This order shall come into force w.e.f. zero hours of 29.05.2025 and shall be effective for a period of sixty days and is applicable to those also who already have domestic servants /maids and has not informed the Police yet when order is in force.

This order shall be promulgated by affixing copy thereof at the notice board of the office of the undersigned as well as the District Court, Port Blair and publication in Newspaper having circulation in the areas through office of the Information & Publicity, A&N Administration.

Only those candidates who qualify in NEET-UG-2025 as per the Qualifying criteria described in the Information Bulletin of NEET-UG 2025 will be considered for admission to MBBS (Malayalee Origin) course.

(p) BAMS (Malayalee Origin)  
Candidates who have passed in the subjects of Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English individually at the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Kerala or examinations recognised equivalent thereto and obtained a minimum of 50% marks taken together in Physics, Chemistry and Biology are eligible. Only those candidates who qualify in NEET-UG-2025 as per the Qualifying criteria described in the Information Bulletin of NEET-UG 2025 will be considered for admission to BAMS (Malayalee Origin) course.

(q) B.Sc. Agriculture (Malayalee Origin)  
Candidates who have passed in the subjects Physics, Chemistry and Biology at the Higher Secondary Examination of the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Kerala or examinations recognized equivalent thereto, with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology put together are eligible.

NB:- 1. Eligibility criteria for some courses as defined above are based on the last year allocation (2024-25) the same is subject to change as per revised criteria of the Institutions/Colleges, if any.

2. The marks obtained by the student in +2 practical examinations will not be counted while preparing Merit list for allotment of reserved seats in professional, technical and non-technical courses on the mainland institutions/colleges.

contractor within the quoted price. Moreover, the successful bidder will have to handle insurance, logistics, and any damage during the project independently. Underground cabling, if needed, will also be part of the bidder's responsibility. Electricity and water usage during installation and O&M will be managed by the bidder.

To qualify for the tender, companies must have experience in installing solar PV projects of at least 400 kWp cumulatively, with at least one project of 40 kWp or more, which must have been operational for six months. Alternatively, companies with experience in industrial EPC projects worth Rs. 4 crore or more, and experience in installing electrical substations of 11 kV or higher, can also qualify. Financially, the average annual turnover should be at least Rs. 28.73 crore in the last three financial years, and the net worth should be 100% of the bidder's paid-up share capital.

The performance bank guarantee (PBG) amount is not explicitly stated but typically follows standard norms, often around 3% to 5% of the total contract value. Also, bidders must pay Project Management Charges (PMC) to NVVN equal to 5% of the awarded value, including a portion to be paid upfront within 30 days of receiving the letter of award.

Only Indian suppliers under Class-I and Class-II local supplier categories are allowed to participate, in line with the government's preference for Make in India. Bidders from countries sharing a land border with India must be registered with the competent authority to be eligible. (Source: <https://solarquarter.com>)

(xxiii) Candidates allotted with Degree Level Engineering or Architecture seat in National Institute of Technology (NIT) under Home State Quota shall not be eligible for Administration seats i.e. they will be eligible for any one seat either NIT Home State Quota or Administration seat. (xxiv) The seats will be finally allotted to the eligible candidates only after the receipt of confirmation to UT Administration from the Govt. of India/State Govts/ concerned Institutions. (xxv) Any candidates of this UT Islands once allotted and accepted any of the seat through counselling by A & N Administration or ONLINE by JOSAA/CSAB NEUT, but not utilized/continued the course for any of the reason thereof will not be eligible for allotment of any other seat further from Administration quota. (xxvi) Further details in this regard, if any, can be obtained from the Assistant Secretary (Hr. Edn.) either in person or <b>over telephone No. 03192-231023.</b> (5) <b>ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR THE COURSES :</b> (a) <b>B.D.S, BAMS &amp; BHMS</b> Candidates should have appeared and qualified National Eligibility cum Entrance Test-UG (NEET UG)-2025 for allotment of Central Pool BDS, BAMS & BHMS seats reserved for the students of A&N Islands. The said seats under Central Pool quota will be allotted category-wise to only those candidates who qualify in NEET (UG)-2025 as per the Qualifying criteria described in the Information Bulletin of NEET (UG)-2025 will be considered for admission to BDS, BAMS & BHMS course.			

(b) **B.Sc (Hospitality & Hotel Administration)**  
Candidates should have appeared National Council for Hotel Management Joint Entrance Examination (NCHM JEE-2025) for allotment of B.Sc (Hospitality & Hotel Administration) seats reserved for the students of A&N Islands. The said seats will be allotted category-wise to only those students who have appeared NCHM JEE-2025. Candidate should have passed 10+2 system of Senior Secondary Examination or its equivalent with English as one of the subjects, from a recognized Educational Board. Candidate must have passed English as a subject of study (core/elective/functional) in the qualifying examination. There is no age bar for all categories.

(c) **Printing Technology/ Photography**  
Candidates must have passed 10th Std/ SSC examination with at least 35% marks at the qualifying examination and candidate should not be born after 01.01.2010.

(d) (i) **Diploma - 1 (Textile Process and Cinematography)**  
XII<sup>th</sup> pass (AISSCE) with 50% marks in Maths separately and 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Maths put together.

(ii) **Diploma - 2 (Diploma Pharmacy)**  
XII<sup>th</sup> Passed (AISSCE) with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology (aggregate).

(iii) **Diploma - 3 (Production, Electronics & Communication, Man-made Fibre Technology, Electronics & Telecommunication and Architecture)**  
Xth pass with 50% marks in Maths and 50% marks in General Science and Maths put together on the basis of marks obtained/Grade Points.

(e) **B.Sc. B.Ed.**  
For B.Sc B.Ed course, the candidates should have registered as well as appeared in the Common Entrance Examamination-2025 (CEE-2025) conducted by Regional Institute of Education (NCERT). Candidates seeking admission to Physical Science Group must have passed with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM) (M stands for Mathematics or Statistics) and those seeking admission to Biological Science Group (CBZ) must have passed Physics, Chemistry, and Biology (PCB) (B stands for Biology or Biotechnology) at +2 level. Candidates must have passed +2/Hr. Sec. /Sr. Sec. or any equivalent examination recognized by University/Board with at least 50% marks in overall aggregate of qualifying examination (relaxation of 5% marks for ST/PwD candidates). The qualifying examination should be recognized by the affiliating universities of the RIEs. Candidates who have passed +2/Hr. Sec./Sr. Sec. or any equivalent examination in 2023, 2024 and appearing/appeared in 2025 only will be considered. **The copy of score card of CEE-2025 being conducted by Regional Institute of Education (NCERT) is to be submitted in the Development-IV Section (D-IV Section), Secretariat within 3 days after declaration of result.**

(f) **B.A.L.L.B Course**  
For the above course, the Candidates should have passed the qualifying examination in (10+2) courses for schooling and have secured not less than 45% marks in the aggregate in case of General candidates (40% in case of ST candidates). The candidate who has obtained 10+2 through the Open University/Open Schooling system directly without having any basic qualification for pursuing such studies are NOT ELIGIBLE for admission in this course. There is no age limit.

(g) **General Nursing (Female)**  
(i) The eligibility requirement in Bangalore, the candidate must be 10+2 passed preferably science (PCB) and English with aggregate of 40% (for ST 35%). Arts and Commerce students are also eligible for the course. The candidate should have completed 17 years as on 01.09.2025 and not exceed 35 years.  
(ii) The eligibility requirement in Kolkata, the candidate should have passed 10+2 examination with 40% marks in aggregate and must pass in English. Candidate age must be at least 17 years as on 31.12.2025 and maximum age will be 35 years as on 31.12.2025.  
(iii) The eligibility requirement in Kerala, candidate must have passed 10+2 or equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry and Biology as optional subjects and English with 40% aggregate marks. (h) **B.Sc. (Nursing) (Female unmarried)**  
(i) Kolkata – Candidates should have passed 10+2 examination from a recognized board, and must have aggregate 45% marks in the subjects Physics, Chemistry & Biology (PCB) in case of General Candidate (40% in case of ST candidates). The candidate must have pass marks in English. The minimum age of the candidates should be completed 17 years as on 31/12/2025 and maximum age limit is 35 years.  
(ii) Kerala – Candidates should have passed 10+2 examination from a recognized board with 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Biology (PCB) put together. The ST candidates need only a pass in the qualifying examination. Candidate should have completed 17 years of age as on 31/12/2025 and maximum age limit is 35 years.

(i) **Paramedical Diploma Courses (Medical Lab Technology, Radio diagnosis & Radiotherapy Technology, Ophthalmic Assistant, Dental Mechanic and Diploma Pharmacy)**  
The candidates who have passed Higher Secondary examination of the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Kerala or examinations recognized equivalent thereto, with 40% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology put together are eligible. Relaxation of 5% marks will be allowed to ST candidates. Applicant should have completed 17 years of age as on 31.12.2025 and the upper age limit is 35 years.

(j) **B.Sc (Agriculture)**  
The candidates should have passed in the Higher Secondary Course in 10+2 (State Board/CBSE/any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with 55% aggregate marks for General candidates and 50% for OBC candidates in any of the combination of four subjects :-  
(i) Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology  
(ii) Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any one of the fourth (elective) subjects viz., Biotechnology/Microbiology/Biochemistry/Computer Science/Information Technology /Informatics Practices/Home Science/Agriculture/Horticulture/Horticulture/Environmental Science.  
(iii) Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology  
For ST candidates, a pass in the qualifying examination with four required subjects.  
**NB:-** Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years as on 01.07.2025. For ST candidates, there is no age limit. 05 years of age relaxation for differently abled candidates.

(k) **B.Sc (Horticulture)**  
The candidates should have passed in the Higher Secondary Course in 10+2 (State Board/CBSE/any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with 55% aggregate marks for General candidates and 50% for OBC candidates in any of the combination of four subjects:-  
(i) Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology  
(ii) Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any one of the fourth (elective) subjects viz., Biotechnology/Microbiology/Biochemistry/Computer Science/Information Technology /Informatics Practices/Home Science/Agriculture/Horticulture/Horticulture/Environmental Science.  
(iii) Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology  
For ST candidates, a pass in the qualifying examination with four required subjects  
**NB:-** Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years as on 01.07.2025. For ST candidates, there is no age limit. 05 years of age relaxation for differently abled candidates.

(l) (i) **B.F.Sc. and B.Tech (Biotechnology)**  
The candidates should have passed in the Higher Secondary Course in 10+2 (State Board/CBSE/any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with 55% aggregate marks for General candidates and 50% for OBC candidates in any of the combination of four subjects :-  
(i) Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology  
(ii) Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any one of the fourth (elective) subjects viz., Biotechnology/Microbiology/Biochemistry/Computer Science/Home Science/ Agriculture/Horticulture/Informatics Practices/Informatics Practices/Environmental Science.  
(iii) Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology  
For ST candidates, a pass in the qualifying examination with four required subjects.  
**NB:-** Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years as on 01.07.2025. For ST candidates, there is no age limit. 05 years of age relaxation for differently abled candidates.


(ii) **B.Tech (Fisheries Engineering) and B.Tech (Food Technology)**  
The candidates should have passed in the Higher Secondary Course in 10+2 (State Board/CBSE/any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with 55% aggregate marks for General candidates and 50% for OBC candidates in any of the combination of four subjects :-  
(i) Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology  
(ii) Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science/Informatics Practices.  
For ST candidates, a pass in the qualifying examination with four required subjects.  
**NB:-** Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years as on 01.07.2025. For ST candidates, there is no age limit. 05 years of age relaxation for differently abled candidates.

(m) **B.Ed**  
(i) The candidates should have passed B.A./B.Sc./M.Com examination with 50% aggregate from a recognized University and has offered subject relating to school education at the first or second degree level. 55% marks in Engineering/Technical courses (Specialisation in Science and Maths).  
(ii) Equal preference will be given to the candidates who have acquired degree from the colleges of A&N Islands as well as at Mainland subject to the condition that the candidates are belong to one of the five categories laid down in the Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs order No. U-14040/5/96/ANL dated 30/5/1996.  
(iii) The Administration will not be responsible, in case any candidature is rejected by the host Institute on account of change of eligibility criteria /requirement or policy or late reporting to the Institution.

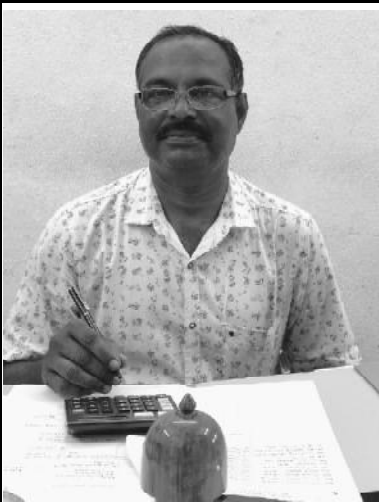

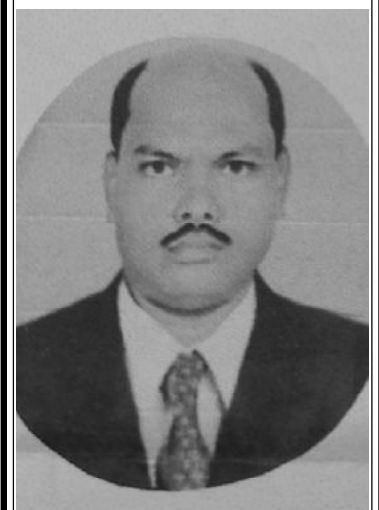
