Hon'ble Prime Minister launches two major schemes
PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana and Dalhan
Atmanirbharta Mission in Agriculture Sector
Animal Husbandry, Fish Farming and Beekeeping have
empowered small farmers and landless families: PM

New Delhi, Oct. 11

Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi participated in a special Krishi programme at the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) in New Delhi, today. The Hon'ble Prime Minister also interacted with farmers before participating in the public programme. The Hon'ble Prime Minister launched two major schemes in the agriculture sector, with an outlay of Rs 35,440 crore. He launched the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana which has an outlay of Rs.24,000 crore. He also launched the Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses with an outlay of Rs. 11,440 crore. The Hon'ble Prime Minister also inaugurated and dedicated to the nation projects valued at over Rs. 5,450 crore in the agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries, and food processing sectors, while laying the foundation stone for additional projects worth around Rs. 815 crore.

Addressing the nation, Hon'ble Prime Minister remarked, "Today is a historic day that marks the birth anniversaries of two of Maa Bharati's illustrious sons who redefined India's democratic fabric and rural development. Jayaprakash Narayan ji and Nanaji Deshmukh ji were the voices of rural Bharat and dedicated their lives to the empowerment of farmers and the underprivileged."

Marking the significant occasion, the Hon'ble Prime Minister underscored that the Pradhan Mantri Dhan-Dhaanya Krishi Yojana and Dalhan Atmanirbharta Mission (Pulse Self-Reliance Mission) are designed to usher in a new era of self-reliance, rural empowerment, and agricultural innovation, directly benefiting crores of farmers across the nation. "The Government of India will invest over Rs.35,000 crore in these initiatives, reflecting its unwavering commitment to doubling farmers' incomes and achieving food and nutritional security for the country", Shri Modi said.

The Hon'ble Prime Minister emphasized the central role that agriculture and farming have always played in India's development journey. The Prime Minister stated that in the last eleven years, India's agricultural exports have nearly doubled. Foodgrain production has increased by approximately 90 million metric tonnes. Fruit and vegetable production has grown by more than 64



farmer cooperation and market access. The Prime Minister shared that he had spent time interacting with farmers, fishermen, and women working in the agriculture

sector. He listened to their experiences and insights and noted that such interactions reflect the true transformation taking place in Indian agriculture.

Emphasizing the Government's commitment to increasing farmers' income by expanding opportunities beyond traditional agriculture, Shri Narendra Modi stated that sectors like animal husbandry, fisheries, and beekeeping are being actively promoted to provide additional income sources, particularly for small and landless farmers.

Highlighting the honey production sector as a success story, the Prime Minister noted that India's honey output has nearly doubled in the last eleven years. He further shared that while honey exports stood at around Rs.450 crore six to seven years ago, they have now surged to over Rs.1,500 crore. This dramatic rise in exports, he said, represents three times more income flowing directly to farmers, demonstrating the tangible benefits of agricultural diversification and value addition.

Concluding his address, Shri Modi urged farmers to not only work towards self-sufficiency but also to target the global market by growing export-oriented crops that can reduce imports and boost India's agricultural exports. He stated that the PM Dhan-Dhaanya Krishi Yojana and the Dalhan Atmanirbharta Mission will play vital roles in this journey and extended his heartfelt congratulations and best wishes to farmers across the nation.

Central team of Agricultural Scientists
deployed to A & N Islands; Hon'ble MP
expresses gratitude to Central Govt.

In a significant move to safeguard the interests of farmers in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands whose livelihoods have been severely affected by recurring infestations of mealybug and whitefly diseases on various crops across A&N Islands, the Central Government has deputed an expert team of agricultural scientists to the islands to conduct a comprehensive field assessment. The team



has arrived and commenced its inspection in most affected areas of VK Pur, Rabindra Nagar, and RK Pur in Little Andaman, and some villages in Car Nicobar. The scientists are interacting directly with local farmers and tribal people, examining the extent of crop damage, and collecting samples for detailed laboratory analysis to determine the causes of infestation and to recommend effective preventive and control measures, a press release from MP Office said.

The release further stated that the Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray has also proposed the visit of said team to a few locations in South Andaman to assess the situation firsthand and to join the central scientific team during their field studies. He is also expected to interact

Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, interacted with farmers before participating in a special Krishi programme held at the Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI), New Delhi today.

Shri Durai Selvam, a fisherman from the Andaman & Nicobar Islands deputed by the Department of Fisheries, A&N Administration, to attend the special Krishi programme at the National Agricultural Science Complex (NASC), Pusa, New Delhi, also had the rare opportunity to interact with the Hon'ble Prime Minister.

He was nominated by the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying as one among eight fishermen selected from across the States and Union Territories of India for this special interaction. Shri Durai Selvam, an active fisherman based at the Fish Landing Centre, Junglighat, engages in mechanised fishing operations targeting large pelagic and demersal resources. His sustained efforts, along with those of his fellow fishermen, have significantly contributed to the increase in fish



production in the Islands, meeting local consumption needs and enhancing the quantity of fish transported to mainland India.

During the interaction, Shri Durai extended gratitude to Hon'ble Prime Minister for extending support to him in establishment of cold chain infrastructure and fish transport facilities under PMMSY which supports in hygienic transport and marketing of fish catch.

The Hon'ble Prime Minister advised him to focus on harvesting tuna and tuna-like species from the Andaman waters, noting that this could become a potential game-changer for the Islands' seafood export industry, a press release from the Directorate of Fisheries said.

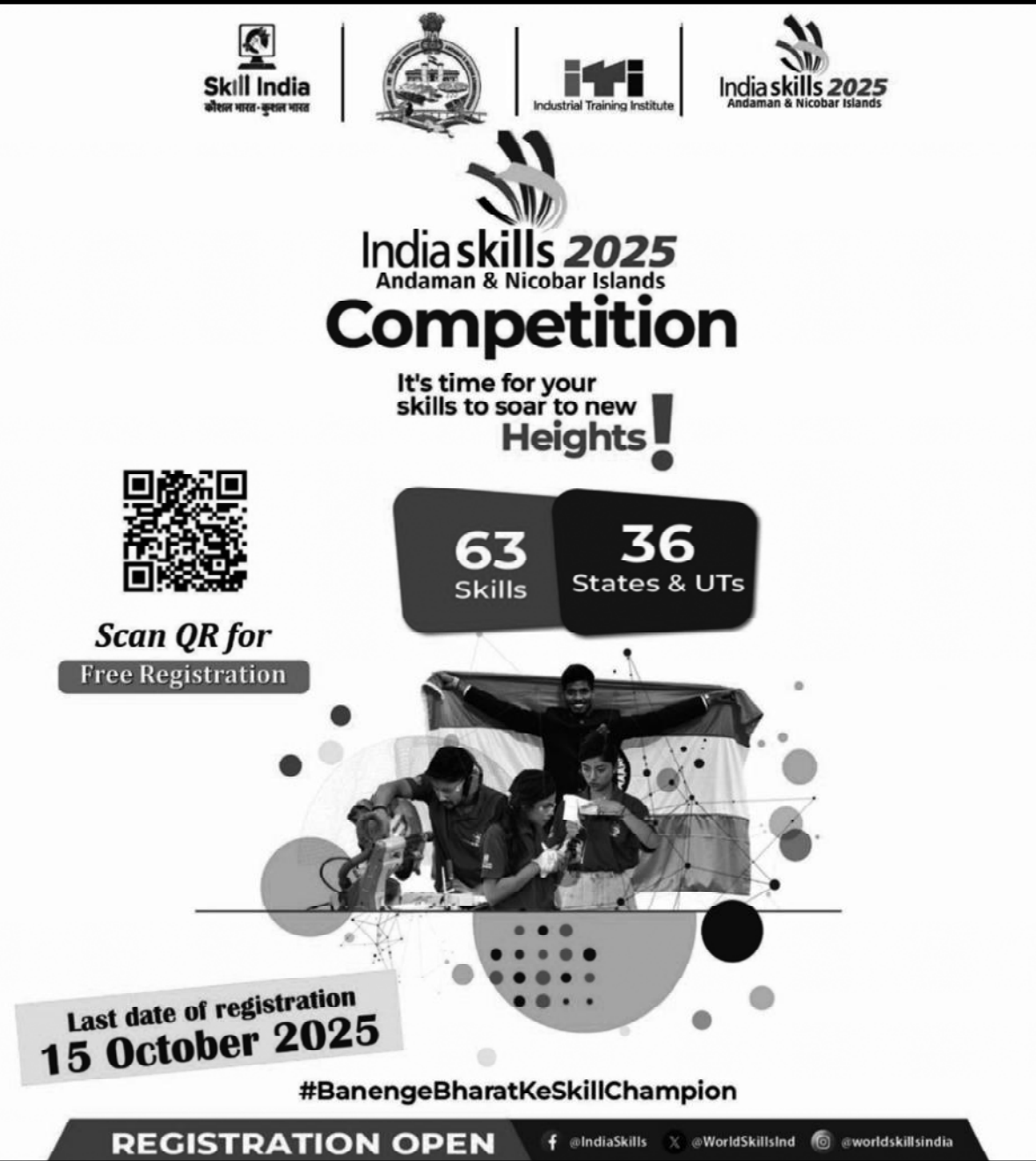
