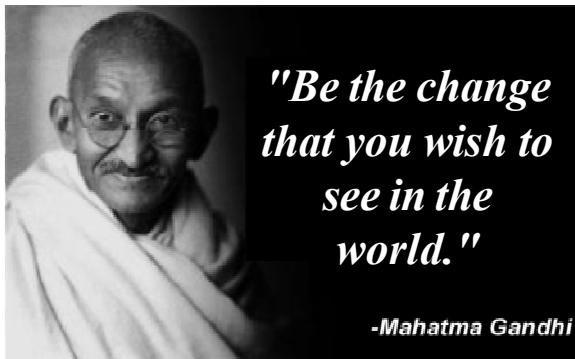

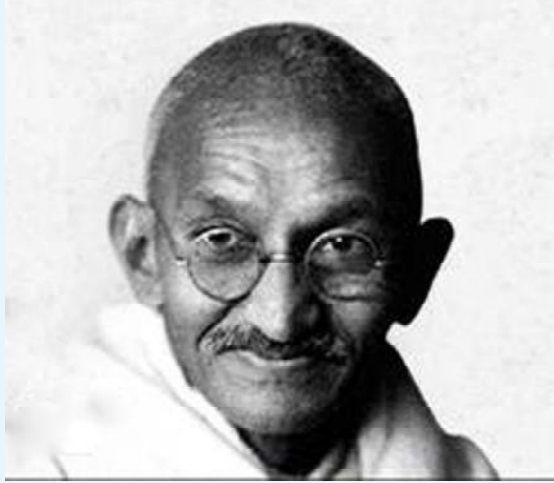

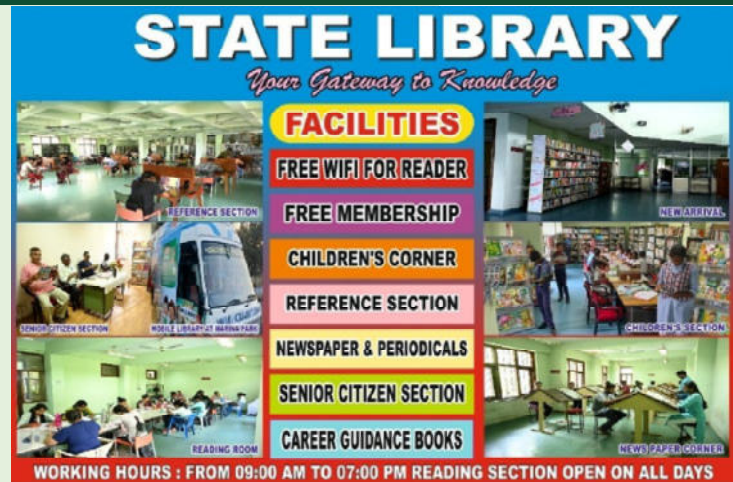

Deptt. of AH&VS initiates assessment for induction of Cattle from mainland

Sri Vijaya Puram, Oct. 1

The Department of AH&VS has been receiving several representations from livestock farmers and stakeholders requesting for supply of high yielding milk animals from mainland. The Department of AH&VS is actively considering a proposal to induct high-yielding cattle from the mainland to address the current shortage of fresh cow's milk in these Islands. In order to assess the requirement for Cattle, the department has initiated the process to assess the requirement of cattle by the farmers.

It is proposed that the department will procure good-quality animals from the mainland, as per the farmers' requirement, and supply on full cost basis. The overhead charges which includes feeding, transportation, Veterinary health care, quarantine and testing and transportation by cattle carrier is proposed to be borne by the Department. Beneficiaries of the scheme will be selected on the basis of their experience in dairy farming, membership in a Livestock Cooperative Society, sound knowledge of dairy practices and

sufficient land for fodder cultivation and / or adoption of proper feed management practices.

The above criteria are essential to ensure the genuineness of the farmer and to avoid situations where animals produce low milk due to poor management, thereby defeating the purpose of the schemes. Farmers may choose to either pay for the animals procured and transported by the department, or alternatively, they may purchase animals directly from the mainland at their own cost and hand them

over to the department at a designated sea port for free transportation to these Islands.

The notice of the proposal has been circulated to all the Gram Panchayat Pradhans with the request to convey this information to Livestock Farmers within their jurisdictions. All interested cattle farmers are therefore requested to submit their requirements and willingness to the Department through the Gram Panchayats, for enabling assessment of requirement, a press release from Deptt. of AH&VS said.

Financial assistance to farmers for strengthening farm mechanization in A&N Islands

Sri Vijaya Puram, Oct. 1

The Department of Agriculture, Andaman & Nicobar Administration is committed to strengthening the farming community by promoting farm mechanization for the overall benefit of farmers across the Islands.

As part of these efforts, the Department is implementing the PM-RKVY - SMAM Scheme (Sub-Mission on Agriculture Mechanization) to support and uplift the farming community across the Islands.

Under this scheme, financial assistance is provided with a 50% subsidy for SC/ST and women farmers, and a 40% subsidy for all other farmers on the cost of equipment, making modern farm machinery affordable and accessible. The scheme particularly

benefits small and marginal farmers, women farmers, and those seeking to adopt modern farming technologies.

Farmers can avail subsidies for a wide range of agricultural machinery and equipment such as: ♦ Tractors, Power Tillers, Seeders, Harvesters, Paddy Threshers. ♦ Chain Saw, Wheel Barrow, Self-propelled Horticulture Machinery. ♦ Tractor-driven Land Development and Tillage Equipment. ♦ Dehydration Units, Humidifiers (for horticulture, food grains & oilseed crops). ♦ Packing Machines (for horticulture, food grains & oilseed crops). ♦ Boilers, Steamers, Driers, Extractors (for horticulture, food grains & oilseed crops).

Another initiative of the Department is the

establishment of Custom Hiring Centres (CHCs), where eligible farmers can access financial assistance to set up centres providing modern agricultural machinery for rent. These centres enable farmers to use equipment such as tractors, harvesters, and seeders without having to purchase them individually, making modern farm technology accessible and affordable especially for small and marginal farmers.

Financial assistance for CHCs is provided at 40% of the project cost, as per the permissible subsidy limits.

Eligible Beneficiaries include: ♦ Rural Entrepreneurs (Rural youth and farmers as entrepreneurs). ♦ Cooperative Societies of Farmers. ♦ DAY-NRLM Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

♦ Registered Farmers' Societies. ♦ Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). ♦ Panchayats.

The initiative aims to establish CHCs equipped with modern farm machinery that can be rented at affordable rates, thereby reducing input costs, saving time, improving productivity, and strengthening farm mechanization in the Island.

Interested farmers/FPOs/ others have been requested to contact their nearest Agriculture Sub-Depot / Zonal Agriculture Office for details of eligibility, subsidy rates, and application procedures. Draft Beach Tourism Guidelines 2025 and Draft Beach Tourism Policy 2025 for A&N Islands prepared by Directorate of IP&T Suggestions/inputs/comments invited

The Directorate of Information, Publicity & Tourism, A&N Administration has prepared draft Beach Tourism Guidelines-2025 and draft Beach Tourism Policy-2025 for the pristine beaches and exceptional biodiversity. These fragile oceanic Islands host a rare mix of tropical rainforests, coral reefs, mangroves, and seagrass meadows. Out of a total of 836 Islands, only 31 are inhabited, leaving vast stretches of the archipelago in its natural state. With a 1,962-kilometre coastline, the Islands are home to some of the most ecologically sensitive and visually spectacular beaches in the world.

In recent years, the Islands have witnessed an unprecedented rise in tourism, particularly beach tourism, which has brought notable economic opportunities. However, this rapid growth has also resulted in mounting pressures on the environment and local communities. Unregulated tourism may lead to issues such as degradation of coastal and marine ecosystems. The rising footfall-both from domestic and international tourists-demands proactive and structured management to avoid long-term ecological damage.

The Beach Tourism Policy has been developed to respond to these

challenges by providing a framework for sustainable, inclusive, and regulated tourism. Given that majority of the Islands' area is forest and most of the beaches are in reserve forests and protected areas, it is crucial to safeguard their ecological integrity. The policy emphasizes conservation, community empowerment, and responsible tourism practices to ensure that the beaches of the A&N Islands remain vibrant and protected for future generations.

The draft Beach Tourism Policy and draft Beach Tourism Guidelines are being placed in the public domain i.e. official website of Directorate of IP&T https://www.andamantourism.gov.in/Ann_all.php seeking suggestions/comments/inputs from general public, tourism stakeholders, various Departments etc.

Indian Ocean Region, astride the major trade artery of the Malacca Straits.

Vice Admiral Kochhar was commissioned into the Indian Navy on July 1, 1988. An alumnus of the National Defence Academy Khadakvasla, Defence Services Staff College Wellington, Naval War College Mumbai and Royal College of Defence Studies United Kingdom, he is a Gunnery and Missile Specialist.

In a career spanning over 37 years, the Flag Officer has served extensively on frontline warships of the Eastern and Western Fleets. He has commanded IN Ships Nashak, Vibhuti, Kirpan and commissioned the frigate Trikanth in Russia. He also commanded aircraft carrier INS Vikramaditya as its third skipper, during which the carrier successfully integrated and operationalised its Air Wing.

His staff appointments at Naval Headquarters include key responsibilities in Budgeting and Weapon Procurement. On promotion to Flag Rank in 2018, he was appointed Assistant Controller of Carrier Projects (ACCP) and Assistant Controller of Warship Production and Acquisition (ACWP&A), steering Government approvals for critical shipbuilding projects and contributing significantly to capability development of the Navy.

As Flag Officer Commanding Western Fleet in 2021, he was instrumental in safeguarding national interests in the maritime domain during the challenging COVID-19 period. He subsequently served as Commandant, National Defence Academy in 2022, where he oversaw the induction of women cadets and focused on enhancing training standards and infrastructure. On 25 May, 2024, he assumed charge as Chief of Staff, Western Naval Command, and steered the Command response amidst the Israel-Hamas conflict and resurgence of piracy in the Gulf region.

The Flag Officer also conducted Naval operations in Western Coast during Op Sindoor, ensuring a resounding defeat to Pakistan. For his distinguished service, he has been awarded the Ati Vishisht Seva Medal and Nausena Medal.

On assuming charge as CINCAN, Vice Admiral Kochhar emphasised that the Andaman and Nicobar Command plays a pivotal role in safeguarding India's maritime frontiers and ensuring stability in the Indian Ocean Region.
