Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan sworn in as the 15th Vice President of India and Chairman of Rajya Sabha



New Delhi, Sept. 12 (PIB)

Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan took oath today as the fifteenth Vice President of India and Chairman of the Rajya Sabha. Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan, was administered the oath by the President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, at a swearing-in ceremony held at Rashtrapati Bhavan. Shri Radhakrishnan was formerly the Governor of Maharashtra. Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, former President, Shri Ram Nath Kovind, Shri C P Radhakrishnan's predecessor Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, and Union Ministers including Shri Amit Shah, Shri Rajnath Singh, Shri J P Nadda, Shri Piyush Goyal, and Shri Nitin Gadkari were present on the occasion.

After the swearing-in, Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan visited Rajghat to pay homage to Mahatma Gandhi Ji. He also paid tributes to former Prime Minister, Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee at Sadaiv Atal, to Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya at his memorial at Deen Dayal Upadhyay Marg.

Brief Profile of Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan

Educational and Professional Background

Born on 4th May, 1957 in Tiruppur, Tamil Nadu, Shri Chandrapuram Ponnusami Radhakrishnan earned a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration. Starting as an RSS Swayamsevak, he became a State Executive Committee Member of the Bharatiya Janasangh in 1974. Before entering public life, Shri Radhakrishnan had a long and successful career as a garment exporter.

Parliamentary and Public Life

In 1996, Shri C.P. Radhakrishnan was appointed Secretary of the BJP in Tamil Nadu. He was elected to the Lok Sabha for the first time from Coimbatore in 1998 and re-elected in 1999. During his tenure as an MP, he served as Chairman of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Textiles. He was also a member of the Parliamentary Committee on Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and the Consultative Committee on Finance. Additionally, he was a member of the Parliamentary Special Committee investigating the Stock Exchange Scam.

In 2004, Shri Radhakrishnan addressed the UN General Assembly as part of the Parliamentary Delegation. He was also a member of the first Parliamentary Delegation to Taiwan.

Between 2004 and 2007, Shri Radhakrishnan served as the State President of the BJP in Tamil Nadu. In this role, he undertook a 19,000 km 'Ratha Yatra' that lasted 93 days. The Yatra was organised to highlight his demands for linking all Indian rivers, eradicating terrorism, implementing a uniform civil code, removing untouchability, and combating the menace of narcotic drugs. He also led two additional Padayatrass for different causes.

In 2016, Shri Radhakrishnan was appointed Chairman of the Coir Board, Kochi, a position he held for four years. Under his leadership, coir exports from India reached an all-time high of Rs. 2,532 crores. From 2020 to 2022, he was the All India In-Charge of the BJP for Kerala.

On 18th February 2023, Shri Radhakrishnan was appointed Governor of Jharkhand. Within his first

A project of strategic and national importance

The decision to develop Great Nicobar Island has been taken after due consideration of its ecological, social and strategic aspects

The Great Nicobar Island Project, envisaged by the Narendra Modi government, is an ambitious project with an integrated development plan that comprises an international container transshipment terminal (ICTT) with a capacity of 14.2 million TEU (Twenty-Foot Equivalent Unit), a greenfield international airport, a 450 MVA gas and solar-based power plant, and township of an area of 16,610 hectares.

The project, of strategic, defence and national importance, is designed to transform Great Nicobar into a major hub of maritime and air connectivity in the Indian Ocean Region. The project poses no threat to the island's tribal groups, does not come in the way of any species, and does not jeopardise the eco-sensitivity of the region.

Scrutiny at many levels

Before the project was given the green signal, detailed Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) studies were carried out and an Environmental Management Plan (EMP) was prepared which, inter alia, include mitigation measures to minimise the impact during the project's construction and operation phases. The

commitment to environment and wildlife conservation can be seen in the fact that while no construction has started, an amount of 281.55 crore has already been released to various research institutes and departments for initiating wildlife conservation plans.

The risk assessment study has been carried out based on the two sources anthropogenic and natural disasters and a vulnerability and disaster management plan have been prepared accordingly.

The measuring 166.10 square kilometres (35.35 sq. km revenue land and 130.75 sq. km forest land) has been conceived in three distinct phases, phase I (2025-35) 72.12 sq. km, phase II (2036-41) 45.27 sq. km and phase III (2042-



47) 48.71 sq. km.

The project has undergone an appraisal at multiple levels, including statutory scrutiny under the EIA Notification, 2006 (as amended), and clearance has been granted only after compliance with prescribed procedures.

The project will not displace the Nicobarese and the Shompen tribes. The only habitation of the Shompens or the Nicobarese in the project area is at New Chingen, Rajiv Nagar and the administration is not proposing the displacement of any tribal

habitations. A committee to oversee welfare and issues related to the Shompen and the Nicobarese has also been mandated in the EC's condition to address the issues of these tribes during the construction and the operation of the project.

Due consultation with tribal experts which includes the Anthropological Survey of India has been done in order to ensure the safety, protection, welfare and well-being of the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) in

the wake of Holistic Development of the Great Nicobar Island Project. The Andaman and Nicobar administration has also made adequate budgetary provisions for tribal welfare plans throughout the project period and beyond in compliance of EC and Coastal Regulation Zone clearances. At present, the Great Nicobar Island has a Tribal Reserve area measuring 751.070 sq. km. Out of the total area proposed for development, measuring 166.10 sq.km, only 84.10 sq. km falls within the

Tribal Reserve. Out of the 84.10 sq. km, an area of 11.032 sq. km is already under habitation since 1972 as it is part of revenue area. Thus, the effectively remaining area that measures 73.07 sq. km is being de-notified for the purpose of this project. To compensate the same, an area measuring 76.98 sq. km is being re-notified as tribal reserve. Effectively, there will be a net addition of an area of 3.912 sq. km in the tribal reserve area of the Great Nicobar Island. In Phase I, only 40.01 sq. km of the Tribal Area falls in the Great Nicobar Island project, out of which 11.032 sq. km is already under revenue since 1972. The provision in respect of the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes is provided for under Article 338A(9), which states: "The Union and every State Government shall consult the Commission on all major policy matters affecting Scheduled Tribes." It would be relevant to mention here that the Union Territory of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands has not undertaken any new policy measure affecting the Scheduled Tribes except that a development project is being implemented in Great Nicobar.

The relevant issues

The development plan is in sync with the Shompen Policy. The policy allows large-scale development proposals in Great Nicobar Island subject to consultation with the Ministry, Directorate of Tribal Welfare and the Andaman Adim Janjati Vikas Samiti. Necessary consultation with the Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs was also carried out and it is based on the recommendation of the Empowered Committee.

Two important policy documents the Jarawa Policy of 2004 and Shompen Policy of 2015-clearly specify the process of consultation. The Jarawa Policy of 2004 declares the AAJVS as the trustee of the PVTGs. The Shompen Policy of 2015 specifies, vide paragraph 6.3, that "With regard to large-scale development proposals in the future for Great Nicobar Island (such as trans-shipment/ container terminal, etc), the welfare and integrity of the Shompen community should be given priority and be reviewed in consultation with the Department of Tribal Welfare and Andaman Adim Janjati Vikas Samiti (AAJVS) and the

"We are dedicated to improving the lives of our citizens, and these projects are a testament to that commitment. Ministry of Tribal Affairs". This is being followed in letter and spirit.

In its observations, the Empowered Committee has clearly stated that the interests of tribal population will not be affected adversely and that the displacement of tribals would not be allowed. The decision to develop Great Nicobar Island has been taken after a comprehensive consideration of its ecological, social, and strategic aspects. The project is of national and strategic importance, is expected to accelerate holistic development, will generate employment, and will position the Islands not only from strategic and defence point of view but also from economic point of view.

This is about only 2% of the total area of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. Further, 130.75 sq. km of forest area is proposed to be diverted for the project which is only approximately 1.82% of the total forest area of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. As in the guidelines of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, the States/Union Territories with forest land of more than 75% of their respective total geographical area, shall not be insisted upon for providing non-forest land for raising compensatory afforestation and the same may be taken up in any other State/Union Territory having deficient forest land/cover and having land bank for compensatory afforestation. The Andaman and Nicobar Islands have a recorded forest cover of more than 75% of their geographical area, and the compensatory afforestation is proposed to be raised in other States in conformity with the aforesaid guideline formulated by the Ministry for Environment, Forest and Climate Change and in view of the fact that sufficient non-forest land for the purpose is not available in this Union Territory. Land measuring 97.30 sq. km has been identified in Haryana for diversion of phase I of forest land measuring 48.65 sq. km.

The total estimated number of trees in 130.75 sq.km of forest land to be diverted is 18.65 lakh. However, the maximum estimated number of trees to be felled in forest area measuring 49.86 sq. km is 7.11 lakh. As per the Environmental and Forest Clearance condition, an area measuring 65.99 sq. km shall be retained as green area wherein no tree felling is envisaged.

Studies by institutions of standing

All the institutions engaged in conducting various environmental studies for the project - including the Zoological Survey of India, the Botanical Survey of India, the Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural History (SACON), and the Wildlife Institute of India are reputed government organisations with a long-standing presence and institutional capacity in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. These institutes possess extensive historical datasets and a deep understanding of the local ecological context, having conducted research and data collection in the region over several decades.

For facilitating movement of wildlife between forest and the sea shore and for the crossing of arboreal animals as well as for passage of snakes, crabs and crocodiles, safe wildlife corridors at eight locations along the eastern side of the island (connecting forest and seashore through viaducts in the north south arterial road) have been proposed and incorporated in the master plan.

The Narendra Modi government remains committed to the welfare of tribal groups, environmental safeguards, and sustainable development. Comprehensive safeguards have been prescribed to ensure the long-term protection of the Shompen and the Nicobarese communities.

The Great Nicobar Project is a significant example of economy and ecology complementing each other. It combines the objectives of economic growth, infrastructure development and employment generation with critical national security imperatives, thereby contributing to India's long-term strategic and developmental interests in the Indian Ocean Region while also protecting the environment. The three-day workshop on Holistic Progress Card (HPC) implementation and PARAKH Rashtriya Sarvekshan 2024-2025 results dissemination concluded today. Organized jointly by PARAKH, NCERT New Delhi, and the State Institute of Education (SIE), Andaman & Nicobar Islands, the workshop marked a significant milestone in advancing NEP-aligned assessment reforms.

The comprehensive training

sessions, expertly conducted by NCERT faculty members along with PARAKH master trainers from SIE, equipped participants with practical implementation strategies for the Holistic Progress Card across Foundational, Preparatory, and Middle stages, including learning decoding PRS results. Altogether, 100 teachers across all educational zones, with 50 attending in-person and 50 joined virtually in the training.

The workshop successfully achieved its objectives of enhancing teacher capacity and institutional readiness for implementing HPC initiatives. Notably, the HPC has already been implemented across all grades from Balvatika to Grade 12 in Andaman and Nicobar Islands, with hard copies supplied to all schools. This training aimed at ensuring better implementation and realizing the vision of NEP, a press release from SIE said.

Government's first-of-its-kind AI-based weather forecasting program for agriculture, reaching 3.8 crore farmers

New Delhi, Sept. 12 (PIB)

Crores of farmers across India depend on rainfall for Kharif farming-their main source of income and livelihood. If farmers receive advance forecasts about the monsoon, it can help them make better decisions about what to plant, how much, and when. This is now possible, thanks to a revolution in weather forecasting driven by artificial intelligence (AI).

The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare (MoAFW) is harnessing the power of AI for farmers. In a novel public initiative, MoAFW sent AI-based monsoon forecasts via SMS (m-Kisan) to nearly 3.8 crore farmers across 13 states this year. This forecast was available earlier than ever before-up to four weeks ahead of the rain. AI-based models made it possible to design forecasts specifically for farmers' needs, giving farmers a critical tool for planning their Kharif agricultural decisions. This is the first-of-its-kind targeted dissemination of AI weather forecasts to date, marking MoAFW as a world-leader in applying AI weather forecasting to directly benefit farmers.

In a program review meeting held at Krishi Bhavan on September 8, the Additional Secretary Dr. Pramod Kumar Meherda, and Joint Secretary Shri Sanjay Kumar Agarwal met with Nobel Laureate

and University of Chicago Professor Michael Kremer to discuss the groundbreaking initiative by the Ministry and the expansion of the program. Additional Secretary Dr. Meherda remarked, "This program harnesses the revolution in AI-based weather forecasting to predict the arrival of continuous rains, empowering farmers to plan agricultural activities with greater confidence and manage risks. We look forward to continuing to improve this effort in future years."

This year, the monsoon arrived early but there was a pause in the northward progression-stalling rains mid-season for 20 days. The AI-based forecasts distributed by the MoAFW correctly identified this pause in monsoon progression. The government sent updated information to farmers every week until continuous rains arrived in their area. "As climate change increases weather variability, forecasts are a useful tool to help farmers adapt " , said Joint Secretary Shri Sanjay Kumar Agarwal.

AI Revolution in Weather Forecasting

Since 2022, an AI-driven revolution has transformed the science of weather forecasting, delivering more accurate predictions in many settings. These models can be tailored to meet user needs and are enhancing our ability to predict complex phenomena, such as the Indian monsoon, weeks in advance. MoAFW has taken a

major step forward in applying this revolution to benefit crores of farmers.

The forecasts used by MoAFW were a blend of two open-access models-Google's Neural GCM and ECMWF's Artificial Intelligence Forecasting Systems (AIFS). In rigorous evaluations, these models were shown to clearly outperform other available forecasts at predicting the start of the monsoon locally for farmers.

Professor Ramesh Chand, Member of Niti Aayog stressed that focusing on the needs of farmers when providing weather information is essential. "This initiative is tremendously valuable because it centers specifically on the needs of farmers by providing tailored weather forecasts in easy to understand language and helps them make informed farming decisions."

Working with teams from Development Innovation Lab - India and Precision Development, the Ministry worked directly with farmers to ensure that the messages were understood and actionable.

"This is a huge achievement by the Ministry of Agriculture, benefiting millions of farmers and putting India at the cutting edge of addressing the needs of farmers," said Nobel laureate Michael Kremer."The Ministry's program is a model for how to put people first in the age of AI."
