Great Nicobar Project: A crucial peg in the Viksit Bharat vision

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 13

Great Nicobar Island is the largest among the main islands in the Nicobar Islands. Campbell Bay and Indira Point are known tourist places. Indira Point, originally called Pygmalion Point, but renamed after the former Prime Minister who visited that place in 1984, is the southernmost point of India. It is just 145 km (about 80 nautical miles) from the Aceh Province of Indonesia.

The proposed mega development project is expected to come up in the southern part. It includes the development of an international container terminal, an international greenfield airport, a solar power plant and two greenfield cities. Once completed, it has the potential to compete with port cities like

Singapore.

It is important to understand why such a mega project is being contemplated by the government. India's dependence on the Indian Ocean for its developmental and security needs cannot be overstated. Almost 80 per cent of its external trade and 100 per cent of energy imports happen through this region. Moreover, the Indian Ocean Region has emerged as the most influential sea route for global commerce and connectivity. Home to some of the world's most populous countries and fastest growing economies, along with massive militaries, this region has emerged as the "21st century global power axis".

American naval officer and historian, Admiral Alfred T Mahan, insisted a century ago that "whoever attains maritime



supremacy in the Indian Ocean would be a prominent player on the international scene". Diplomat and historian K M Panikkar, too, warned, "It should be remembered that the peninsular character of the country and the essential dependence of its trade on maritime traffic give the sea a preponderant influence on its destiny." Panikkar

called for understanding India's "peninsular character. For several decades, the Indian Navy remained a "brown water navy" capable only of tackling littoral challenges. In the early 2000s, there was finally the realisation that power projection in the IOR is critical to our future as well as for maintaining peace in the region.

The Indian Ocean neighbourhood is a crowded space today with vessels from all major countries crisscrossing its waters. Next-generation undersea cable communication networks proliferate. India is expected to face maritime challenges not only from other navies but also from piracy, seaborne terrorism, climate challenges, human and contraband trafficking, illegal and unregulated fishing, arms running, poaching, and humanitarian challenges like evacuations and disaster management and relief. Nearby are security hotspots like Iran, Afghanistan and Pakistan and maritime chokepoints like the Strait of Hormuz, Malacca Strait and Sunda Strait.

The Nicobar Islands are an important linchpin in this

region. Developing maritime infrastructure is critical to India's security and development. However, the government took all those aspects into consideration before announcing the project. It involved not just government agencies but also academic ones like IIT, NIOT, NCCR and NIO for assessing the environmental impact and suggesting remedies. Only 166 sq km has been allocated for the project. While a couple of villages will be relocated, not a single habitation of the tribes will be touched. For the remaining acquired land, "compensatory afforestation" is being adopted by choosing the Aravalli mountain range ecosystem, the oldest in India but also among the most degraded. New conservation plans are prepared for the

Relentless Anti-Poaching Operation in N&M Andaman leads to apprehension of 7 Myanmarese poachers

As part of the ongoing anti-poaching operations in North & Middle Andaman District, a significant breakthrough has been achieved on 09/09/2025 when a suspicious Myanmarese dinghy was sighted near Landfall Island. Acting swiftly, the Indian Coast Guard Ship Aruna Asaf Ali intercepted the vessel, leading to the immediate apprehension of 3 Myanmarese poachers. The remaining individuals managed to flee towards the shores of Landfall Island.

An anti-poaching team consisting of personnel of PS Diglipur and IRBn was mobilized to conduct a thorough search across Landfall and East Islands. Simultaneously, intelligence inputs were relayed to LOP East Island. Acting swiftly, the team apprehended 4 more Myanmarese poachers,



after sustained jungle search. The operation showcased effective coordination and prompt response by the enforcement agencies.

The operation remains in progress, with search efforts intensified to locate and apprehend the remaining intruders attempting to evade capture. This coordinated initiative between the Andaman & Nicobar Command and the Andaman & Nicobar Police highlights the steadfast commitment of enforcement agencies to

combat illegal poaching, safeguard the region's rich marine biodiversity, and protect the fragile ecosystem of the North and Middle Andaman Islands.

Centre pushes for humane management of stray dogs through new ABC rules

New Delhi, Sept. 13

The Central Government has reiterated its commitment to addressing the growing menace of stray dogs through a humane and scientific approach. While the issue primarily falls under the purview of State Governments and local bodies, the Centre has framed the Animal Birth Control (ABC) Rules, 2023 under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960.

The Rules are in line with global standards set by the World Organisation for Animal Health and promote the Capture-Neuter-Vaccinate-Release method of population management.

Local bodies have been mandated to implement sterilisation and vaccination programmes in collaboration with animal welfare organisations. In this regard, advisories have been repeatedly issued to States and Union Territories. Most recently, on July 16, 2025, the Secretaries of Animal Husbandry, Housing and Urban Affairs, and Panchayati Raj jointly urged States to establish dedicated Animal Birth Control units and ensure that at least 70 per cent of stray dogs are covered under sterilisation drives.

To strengthen this effort, the Central Government has revised its scheme for Birth Control and Immunisation of stray dogs and cats, being implemented through the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI) from the current financial year. Under the scheme, financial assistance of up to Rs. 800 per dog and Rs. 600 per cat has been earmarked for sterilisation. Veterinary hospitals run by States will also receive one-time grants of Rs. 2 crore for developing facilities such as surgical theatres, kennels and



recovery units. Further, support of up to Rs. 15 lakh for small animal shelters and Rs. 27 lakh for large shelters will be made available to urban local bodies and recognised animal welfare organisations.

The AWBI has also issued several advisories and circulars to aid in proper implementation of the Rules. These include standard protocols for adoption of community animals, guidelines for Resident Welfare Associations and Apartment Owner Associations, and instructions for maintaining separate dog-bite data. The revised ABC module launched on August 11, 2025, seeks to comprehensively address street dog population management, rabies eradication, and man-dog conflict reduction.

In addition to these measures, States are receiving support under the Livestock Health and Disease Control Programme for procurement of anti-rabies vaccines. The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare is implementing the National Rabies Control Programme and the National Action Plan for Dog-Mediated Rabies Elimination, launched in 2021, with the aim of eradicating rabies from the country.

Union Minister of State for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Prof. S.P. Singh Baghel, informed the Lok Sabha today that these coordinated efforts underscore the government's resolve to address the challenge of stray dog management in a humane, effective and sustainable manner.

Meanwhile, the Supreme Court has clarified its recent directive to authorities in Delhi-NCR to remove stray dogs from all localities. The apex court said the order was not a "momentary impulse" but the result of careful deliberation after consistent failure of the authorities for over two decades to address an issue impacting public safety.

A bench of Justice J.B. Pardiwala and Justice R. Mahadevan stated that the judiciary's role is not to echo popular sentiments but to uphold principles of justice, conscience and equity. The Court stressed that its directions are in the interest of both humans and dogs.

On August 11, the Court ordered that localities in Delhi, Noida, Ghaziabad, Gurugram and Faridabad must be made free of stray dogs, clarifying that no captured animal will be released back on the streets. (Source: DD News)

AI-guided cameras make solo surgery possible in step towards surgical automation

Ricardo Funke, the chief of surgery at Clinica Las Condes in Santiago, Chile, had a new assistant during a laparoscopic surgery recently - an autonomous artificial intelligence-guided camera that allowed him to carry out a gallbladder removal alone.

The procedure combined magnetic surgical instruments with software that autonomously directs the surgical camera, tracking the surgeon's tools and adjusting angles without a human assistant.

"The camera was following me wherever I moved my hands and the whole process was excellent," Funke told Reuters after the surgery. "This camera lets us do the surgery alone, I did it alone with the robot."

Companies, universities and research centers across the world have been developing AI-assisted tools to perform or assist in surgery.

According to Precedence Research, the global surgical robot market was estimated to be \$15.6 billion in 2024 and is



expected to reach \$64.4 billion by 2034.

In July, researchers at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore in the U.S. reported on an AI-guided robot that carried out a complicated surgical procedure on pig livers and gallbladders.

Researchers said July's surgery hailed a major step towards automated medical

procedures, an expectation echoed by Alberto Rodriguez, CEO of Levita Magnetics who provided the technology for the surgery in Santiago.

"This is the first step in surgical automation with a real patient in the operating room where we showed that AI can help the surgeon," Rodriguez said. (Source: DD News quoting Reuters)

Astronomers get best view yet of two merging black holes

The merger of two black holes is a momentous event, revealing the wildest and most extreme configurations of space, time and gravity known to science.

Researchers have now gotten their best look yet at such an event based on the detection of ripples in space-time called gravitational waves in an observation that lends strong support to hypotheses from eminent physicists Albert Einstein and Stephen Hawking.

The collision occurred 1.3 billion light-years from Earth in a galaxy beyond our Milky Way, and involved two black holes - one about 34 times the mass of the sun and the other about 32 times the sun's mass. They merged in a fraction of a second after orbiting each other at nearly the speed of light, and left behind a single black hole around 63 times the mass of the sun that was spinning at approximately 100 revolutions per second.

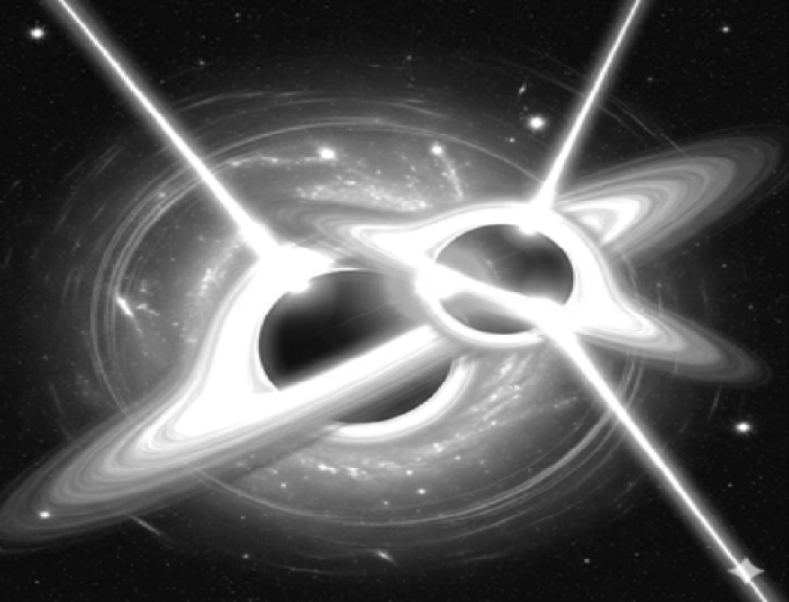
A light-year is the distance light travels in a year, 5.9 trillion miles (9.5 trillion km). Black holes are extraordinarily dense objects with a gravitational pull so strong not even light can escape.

The merger unleashed a tremendous amount of energy that radiated outward as gravitational waves, an amount equivalent to pulverizing three sun-sized stars. These waves were detected on January 14 at research sites in Hanford, Washington and Livingston, Louisiana that are part of the U.S. National Science Foundation's Laser Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory, or LIGO.

These observations came about a decade after the groundbreaking first detection of gravitational waves, which were produced by a similar merger. Technological improvements since 2015 meant this merger was observed with four times better resolution than the prior one.

Gravitational waves propagate outward from a source like ripples in a pond. In this case, the pond is space-time, the four-dimensional fabric that combines the three dimensions of space - height, width and length - with the dimension of time.

Thanks to Albert Einstein, we know that space and time are



intertwined and are best thought of as facets of a single entity, space-time," said astrophysicist Maximiliano Isi of Columbia University and the Flatiron Institute, one of the leaders of the study published on Wednesday in the journal Physical Review Letters.

"This manifests, for example, in that time flows at different rates depending on where you are: close to a heavy object, like a black hole, time flows more slowly compared to someone farther away, so that someone close to a black hole would age more slowly," Isi said.

The researchers analyzed the frequencies of the detected gravitational waves to discern fundamental qualities of the black holes immediately before and after the merger. While these frequencies were not sound waves, the researchers compared them to the ringing of a bell.

"This is just like trying to figure out what a bell is made out of from the ringing sound it makes when struck," Isi said.

A large iron bell, for instance, makes a different sound than a small aluminum bell.

What the researchers learned based on the frequency of gravitational waves offered validation for a basic tenet of scientific understanding of black holes advanced by Hawking, who died in 2018.

Hawking hypothesized that the total surface area of black holes - specifically the surface area of the event horizon, the boundary beyond which nothing can escape - should never decrease. His hypothesis implies that the surface area of the single

black hole produced in a merger should exceed the combined surface areas of the two black holes that merged.

This merger met that expectation. Before colliding, the black holes together had a total surface area of about 93,000 square miles (240,000 square km). The single black hole produced by the merger had a surface area of about 155,000 square miles (400,000 square km).

"This is the first time that we have been able to make this measurement so precisely, and it's exciting to have direct experimental confirmation of such an important idea about the behavior of black holes," said astrophysicist Will Farr of Stony Brook University and the Flatiron Institute, one of the study leaders.

The observations also provided the most direct evidence yet that black holes are the paradoxically simple objects foreseen in Einstein's theory of general relativity, which holds that gravity results from the curvature of space-time caused by mass and energy.

The findings validated Einstein's proposed simplicity of black holes - that they can be fully understood based exclusively on their mass and spin - as worked out by mathematician Roy Kerr in 1963.

The gravitational wave measurements were obtained in a remarkably short time. Caltech astrophysicist Katerina Chatziioannou said the black holes were observed spiraling inward toward each other for about 200 milliseconds, and the signal from the merged black hole was measured for about 10 milliseconds. 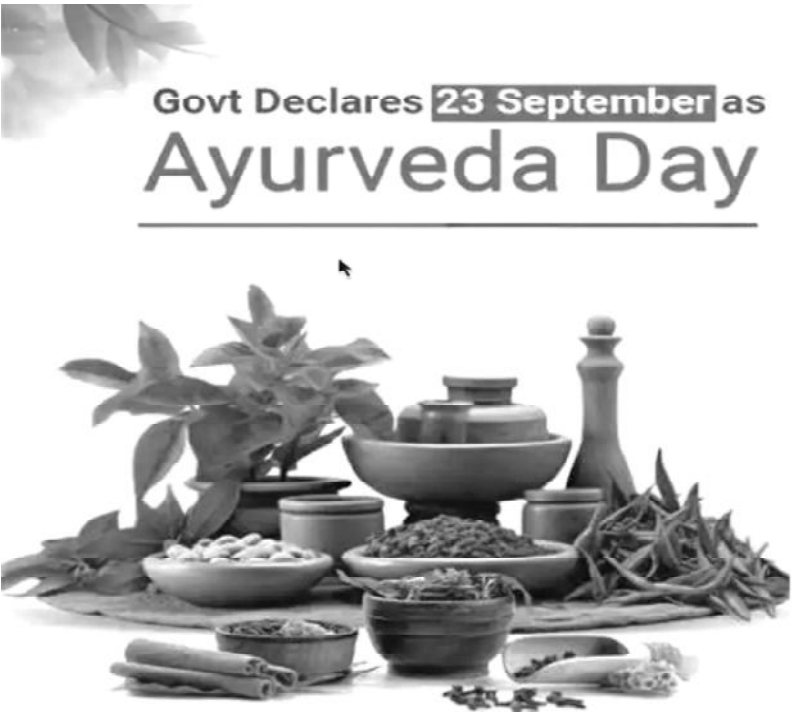
Goa to host 10th Ayurveda Day on September 23, with global focus on 'Ayurveda for People & Planet'

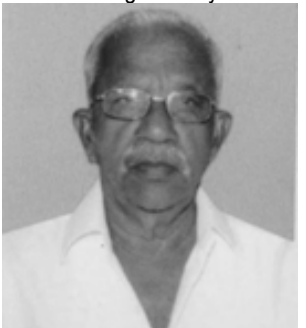
