Hon'ble Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation attends Fifth Akhil Bhartiya Rajbhasha Sammelan held in Gandhinagar on the occasion of Hindi Diwas 2025

Hon'ble Prime Minister lays special emphasis on preservation, promotion, and development of all Indian languages, including Hindi as the Official Language: Hon'ble HM

Sarathi translation system facilitates easy translation from Hindi to all recognized Indian languages

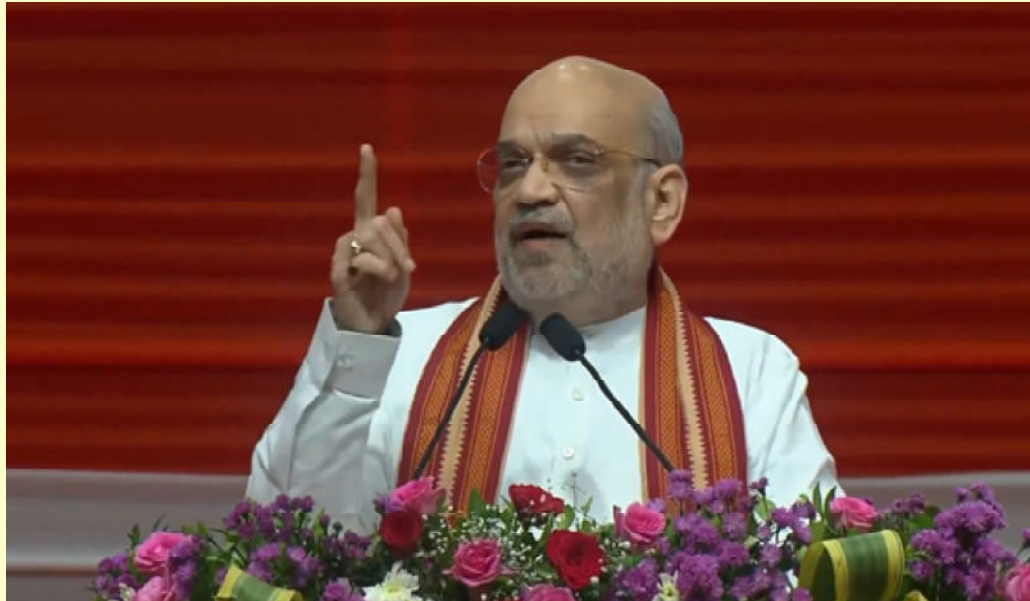
New Delhi, Sept. 14 (PIB)

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Shri Amit Shah attended 5th Akhil Bhartiya Rajbhasha Sammelan in Gandhinagar, the capital of Gujarat, on the occasion of Hindi Diwas 2025 as the Chief Guest. Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation also released several publications.

While addressing the conference, the Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation said that Hindi is the companion of Indian languages and that there is no conflict between Hindi and other Indian languages. Shri Shah said that the biggest example of this is Gujarat. In Gujarat, scholars like Swami Dayanand Saraswati, Mahatma Gandhi, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, and K.M. Munshi accepted Hindi and also promoted it. He said that the coexistence of Gujarati and Hindi made Gujarat an excellent example of the development of both languages. Shri Shah said that Hindi is a part of education system of Gujarat, and because of this, the reach of Gujarat's children has expanded greatly across the country. He added that many visionary leaders taught Indian languages to communicate with each other and urged the promotion of Hindi in every state, as a result of which a person from Gujarat can go anywhere in the country and easily conduct business as well as gain acceptance.

Shri Amit Shah said that for the last five years, the Akhil Bhartiya Rajbhasha Sammelan has been held outside Delhi in different parts of the country, which has provided a very good opportunity to strengthen dialogue between Hindi and other Indian languages. He said that the experience of the past four conferences has been that such conferences provide new perspectives, energy, and inspiration. Shri Shah added that Hindi should not remain just a language of conversation and administration, but should also become the language of science, technology, justice, and policing. He added that when all work is done in Indian languages, the bonding with the people automatically deepens.

Union Home Minister said that the Sarathi translation



system facilitates easy translation from Hindi to all recognized Indian languages. Shri Shah urged all state Chief Ministers to send him letters in their respective languages, assuring that responses would be sent in the same language. He emphasized that the Sarathi system is equipped to translate in any language and also translate responses from Hindi into the recipient's language. He added that, in the coming days, communication through Sarathi will be in one's native language.

Shri Amit Shah said that Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj emphasized three key principles in the fight for Swaraj: Swaraj, Swadharma and Swabhasha, all of which are interconnected with national pride. He said that a country where the spoken language is not its own cannot truly experience freedom or pride. To foster pride in our languages, the Shabd Sindhu

dictionary was created, starting with 51,000 words and now exceeding 7 lakh words. Shri Shah expressed confidence that by 2029, it will become the largest dictionary in all languages of the world. He highlighted that this dictionary is making Hindi more flexible, which is essential to become a widely used spoken language. The use of Shabd Sindhu will make Hindi versatile, adaptable, and widely accepted.

Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation said that Mahatma Gandhi used to say that Hindi is the language that keeps the nation united. He said that Sanskrit gave us the river of knowledge, Hindi carried that knowledge into every home, and mother tongues spread it to every individual.

Shri Amit Shah said that Prime Minister Modi has done a lot through technology to strengthen our local languages. He mentioned that, inspired by Prime Minister Modi, the Ministry of Home Affairs has created the Bhartiya Bhasha Anubhag under the Department of Official Language. This division will not only strengthen Hindi but also support and promote all Indian languages. Shri Shah also said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Modi, the Department of Official Language has advanced many initiatives. Over the past four years, the Official Language Committee has presented three volumes, and the fourth volume has also been prepared. He noted that Official Language Committees have been established in nearly 539 cities across the country.

About 3 lakh 28 thousands government employees from other language backgrounds have been trained in Hindi. In addition, 40,000 employees have been trained in typing, 1,918 in shorthand, and 13,000 in translation. He added that Prime Minister Modi has introduced JEE, NEET, and UGC examinations in 12 languages, which has increased the chances of success for students who study in their mother tongue. Shri Shah said that examinations for the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) are now also conducted in 12 languages. He recalled that in the 1970s, people used to say that Hindi was becoming a thing of the past, but today we can proudly say that the official language and our Indian languages are the languages of the future, and they will also become the languages of technology, science, and justice.

Hon'ble MP urges Centre to formulate a Policy for Regularisation of long serving DRM workers in A&N Administration

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 14
Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, has urged the Government of India to take an early policy decision for the regularisation/absorption of Daily Rated Mazdoors (DRMs), Contractual and Outsourced employees working under the Andaman & Nicobar Administration for the past 5-25 years without any service security, pension, or financial benefits.

As per official records provided by the Administration, the Hon'ble MP stated that there are 12,268 workers currently engaged across various Departments in the Islands. These include 8,301 DRMs, 2,565 contractual employees, and 1,402 outsourced workers. While 8,301 DRMs have been granted 1/30th Pay + DA following Court directions, the remaining 3,967 workers continue to be deprived of similar benefits, despite performing identical

duties and duration of service and working hours per day similar to them.

In his appeal, the Hon'ble MP urged the Hon'ble Prime Minister and Hon'ble Home Minister to formulate a comprehensive regularisation/absorption scheme for DRMs, contractual and outsourced employees in A&N Islands as a welfare measure and recognise and count their past services for pension, retirement and social security benefits, a press release from MP Office said.

ANPCC extends deadline for industrial units to obtain direct CTO till Oct. 31

Sri Vijaya Puram, Sept. 14
The Andaman and Nicobar Pollution Control Committee (ANPCC) has extended the deadline for industrial units that were established without prior pollution clearance to regularize their operations. In its

XXXIV meeting held in May 2025, the Committee decided to allow such units to apply for Consent to Operate (CTO) directly without obtaining prior Consent to Establish (CTE)-till 31st October, 2025.

As per the Water

(Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, and the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981, no industry is permitted to be established or operated without obtaining CTE and CTO from the State Board. Furthermore, under the

Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, compliance with these regulations is mandatory.

The ANPCC has observed that several industrial units in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands have been set up

Minakshi Hooda, Jaismine Lamboria clinch Gold at World Boxing Championships 2025

New Delhi, Sept. 14

India's Minakshi Hooda and Jaismine Lamboria clinched gold medals at the World Boxing Championships 2025. Meenakshi Hooda defeated Nazym Kyzaibay in the 48 kg category today, and Jaismine Lamboria outclassed Paris Olympics silver medalist Julia Szeremeta of Poland in the 57kg final clash.

With their victories, Jaismine and Minakshi joined an illustrious list of Indian world champions featuring six-time winner Mary Kom, two-time champion Nikhat Zareen, Sarita Devi, Jenny RL, Lekha KC, Nitu Ghanghas, Lovlina Borgohain and



Saweety Boora. In the championship held at Liverpool in England, India ended with four medals, the best-ever in an overseas edition.

and are operational without acquiring the necessary pollution consents. This constitutes a violation of the aforementioned Acts. While a previous compliance window was provided to such units, the committee continues to receive CTO applications without prior CTE, prompting the extension. The CTO will be issued only if the industrial unit meets all applicable environmental norms. The ANPCC emphasized that no CTO applications will be entertained after October, 31, 2025 from units that failed to obtain CTE prior to establishment.

All stakeholders and industrial entrepreneurs are reminded that it is a statutory requirement to obtain CTE before establishing an industry and CTO before commencing operations. Applications for both consents must be submitted online via the portal: www.anocmms.nic.in. Failure to comply within the extended timeline will invite strict action under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, a press release from ANPCC said.

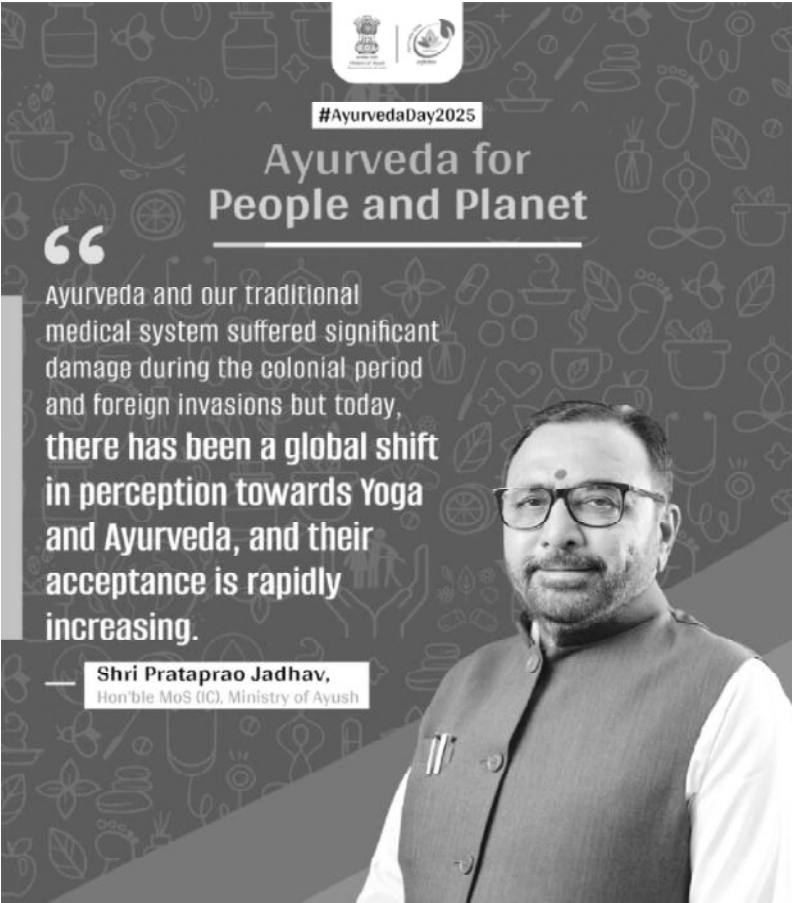
Ayurveda for People & Planet

NASA rover finds potential sign of ancient life in Martian rocks

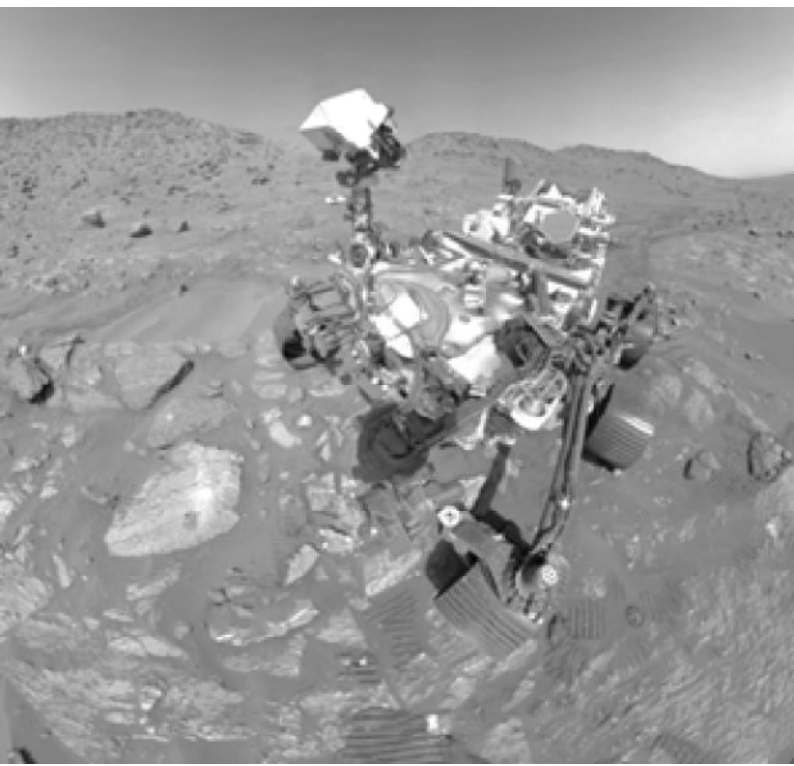
A sample obtained by NASA's Perseverance rover of reddish rock formed billions of years ago from sediment on the bottom of a lake contains potential signs of ancient microbial life on Mars, according to scientists, though the minerals spotted in the sample also can form through nonbiological processes.

The discovery by the six-wheeled rover in Jezero Crater represents one of the best pieces of evidence to date about the possibility that Earth's planetary neighbor once harbored life.

Perseverance scientist Joel Hurowitz of Stony Brook University, lead author of the study published in the journal Nature, said a "potential biosignature" was detected in rock that formed at a time when Jezero Crater was believed to have been a watery environment, between 3.2 and 3.8 billion years ago. Acting NASA Administrator Sean Duffy told a news conference that the U.S. space agency's scientists examined the data for a year and concluded that "we can't find another explanation, so this very well could be the clearest sign of life that we've ever found on Mars - which is incredibly exciting."

NASA released an image of the rock - a very fine-grained, rusty-red mudstone - bearing ring-shaped features resembling leopard spots and dark marks resembling poppy seeds. Those features may have been produced when the rock was forming by chemical reactions involving microbes, according to the researchers.

A potential biosignature is defined as a substance or structure that may have a biological origin but needs more data or further study before a conclusion can be made about the absence or



presence of life.

Mr. Nicky Fox, associate administrator for NASA's Science Mission Directorate, noted that the scientists were not announcing the discovery of a living organism. "It's not life itself," Fox told the news conference.

The rover since 2021 has been exploring Jezero Crater, an area in the planet's northern hemisphere that once was flooded with water and home to an ancient lake basin. Scientists believe river channels spilled over the crater wall and created a lake.

Perseverance has been analyzing rocks and loose material called regolith with its onboard instruments and then collecting samples and sealing them in tubes stored inside the rover.

It collected the sample named Sapphire Canyon in July 2024 from a rock called Cheyava Falls in a locale known as Bright Angel rock formation. The sample came from a set of rocky outcrops on the edges of Neretva Vallis, an ancient river valley about a quarter of a mile (400 meters) wide carved by water rushing into the crater.

TELLTALE MINERALS

Two minerals were detected that appear to have formed as a result of chemical reactions between the mud of the Bright Angel formation and organic matter present in that mud, Hurowitz said. They are: vivianite, a mineral bearing iron and phosphorus, and greigite, a mineral bearing iron and sulfur.

"These reactions appear to have taken place shortly after the mud was deposited on the lake bottom. On Earth, reactions like these, which combine organic matter and chemical compounds in mud to form new minerals like vivianite and greigite, are often driven by the activity of microbes," Hurowitz told Reuters.

"The microbes are consuming the organic matter in these settings and producing these new minerals as a byproduct of their metabolism," Hurowitz said.

The rover's instruments found that the rock was rich in organic carbon, sulfur, phosphorus and iron in its oxidized form, rust. This combination of chemical compounds could have

offered a rich source of energy for microbial metabolisms, Hurowitz said. But Hurowitz offered some words of caution.

"The reason, however, that we cannot claim this is more than a potential biosignature is that there are chemical processes that can cause similar reactions in the absence of biology, and we cannot rule those processes out completely on the basis of rover data alone," Hurowitz said.

Mars has not always been the inhospitable place it is today, with liquid water on its surface in the distant past. The sample collected and analyzed by Perseverance provides a new example of a type of potential biosignature that the research community can explore to try to understand whether or not these features were formed by life, Hurowitz said, "or alternatively, whether nature has conspired to present features that mimic the activity of life."

"We can make a lot of progress on this question with laboratory experiments and fieldwork here on Earth to try to understand the various pathways that might create features like the ones we observe in the Bright Angel formation. But the ultimate tests can only be performed on the Sapphire Canyon core sample if and when it is brought back to Earth for study," Hurowitz added.

Duffy said NASA is examining various ways for potential sample retrieval or even sending equipment to Mars to do further analysis there. "We're going to look at our budgets and we're going to look at our timing, and how we spend money better and what technology do we have to get samples back more quickly," Duffy said. Scientists discover 'tug of war' in gold nanoparticles, opening path for advanced biosensors



New Delhi, Sept. 14

Indian scientists have discovered how everyday molecules like amino acids and salts influence the behaviour of gold nanoparticles, a finding that could pave the way for more reliable biosensors, improved diagnostic tools and advanced drug delivery systems.

Gold nanoparticles are widely used in optical technologies because of their unique interaction with light. Their colour and optical properties change depending on whether they remain isolated or form clusters. While this makes them useful in biosensors and imaging, uncontrolled clustering has posed a longstanding challenge for researchers.

A team from the S N Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences, Kolkata - an autonomous institution under the Department of Science and Technology (DST) - has now identified how to regulate this process.

Led by Prof. Manik Pradhan, the scientists experimented with two molecules: Guanidine Hydrochloride (GdnHCl), a strong salt commonly used in labs, and L-Tryptophan (L-Trp), an amino acid naturally found in proteins and linked

with relaxation and sleep.

When GdnHCl was introduced, gold nanoparticles rapidly clumped together into dense clusters. However, the presence of L-Trp alongside GdnHCl disrupted this process, resulting instead in looser, branched structures - a phenomenon the researchers termed "frustrated aggregation."

"This is like the nanoparticles want to stick together tightly, but the amino acid keeps interfering," the study noted.

The team - comprising Soumyadipta Chakraborty, Dr Jayeta Banerjee, Indrayani Patra, Dr Puspendu Barik, and Prof. Pradhan - employed Evanescent Wave Cavity Ringdown Spectroscopy (EW-CRDS), a cutting-edge optical technique, to monitor the changes in real time. The method revealed that L-Trp stabilises guanidinium ions, slowing aggregation and allowing more open, stable structures to form.

The study, published in the journal Analytical Chemistry, offers fresh insights into fundamental nanoscience and demonstrates how advanced optical tools can probe delicate processes with unprecedented sensitivity. (Source: DD NEWS)
