Addressing the gathering, the Chief Secretary congratulated the people of Campbell Bay for getting a very architecturally designed spacious infrastructure in the form of a Mini Bus Terminus and also appreciated all the officers of the Transport and PWD Departments for devising the plan and timely execution of the project. 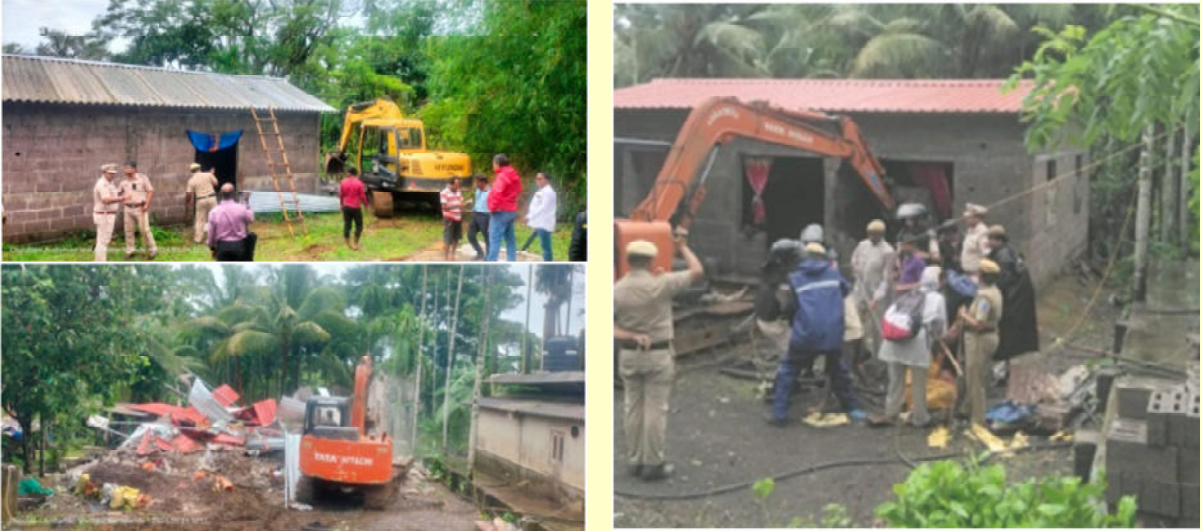

Earlier, welcoming the Chief Secretary and others present on the occasion, the Secretary (Transport), Shri Vishwendra said that STS Campbell Bay is having a fleet strength of 11 buses operating in 6 routes with an average daily ridership of 710 passengers. Bus Terminus, Campbell Bay is a vital element of multimodal transport that would contribute to people's accessibility to places with the modes of travel. It would interconnect, particularly for pedestrians, ship bound passengers and automobiles critical to enhancing people's overall accessibility to the bus network, people's transferability within the bus network, key modes connecting bus service network to other mobility networks and ultimately people's ability to reach their desired destination, he said.

The Secretary further said that for the construction of Bus Terminus with waiting hall and transit accommodation at STS Unit Campbell Bay, an amount of Rs.2.38 Crs. has been incurred. The new Terminal Building has a provision of waiting hall for 100 passengers and two Bus Parking Bays, Oil Room, Office Room, Garage, Enquiry Counter in the ground floor and RTO Office in the first floor. Apart from this, it has also provision for Officers Room, Transit Accommodation in the form of dormitory having ten beds with kitchen and Store Room, he added.

The Director, Transport, Dr. Jatinder Sohal proposed the vote of thanks on the occasion.

The completion and inauguration of Mini Bus Terminus would promote the holistic development in this far flung Island which would make the Public Transport System organized, fully integrated and inter-modal allowing travellers and freight to



switch seamlessly between modes and across the Island. It would ensure convenient, economic, reliant and safe mobility to local populace such as school children, office staff and patient for health purpose. It would improve the living standards of the citizens, reduce logistic cost, create avenues for employment and catalyze economic development by boosting travel & trade.

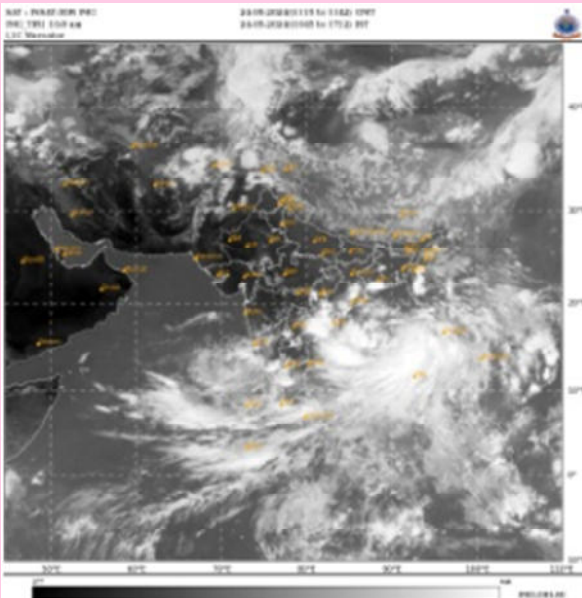
Range, PTS, Prothrapur on 25th May and 26th May, 2024 from 0500 hrs to 1400 hrs.

Directorate of Disaster Management issues monsoon preparedness tips for Cyclone, heavy rain, water logging, flash flood

Andaman and Nicobar Islands are vulnerable to hydro-meteorological disasters which fall in cyclogenesis zone and cyclones form in the Andaman Sea in each year. Heavy monsoon rains cause localized flooding, which occurs regularly in low-lying locations.

Considering that the Southwest monsoon has already advanced into the A&N Islands, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has requested the general public to be prepared to save themselves from heavy rain, strong winds and probable flooding. The monsoon season can cause substantial damage to buildings, property, and

infrastructure, but a few essential precautions can help reduce the impact. Here are some important tips to help preparing for the monsoon season:

- **Clear gutters and drains:** Clogged gutters and drains can lead to water logging, so make sure to clear any debris from these areas before the monsoon season begins.
- **Inspect roof:** Check roof for any damage or leaks, and make necessary repairs before the monsoon season arrives.
- **Secure outdoor items:** High winds can turn outdoor furniture, grills, and other items into dangerous projectiles. Store these items in a safe, secure location or tie them down to prevent them from being blown

away.

- **Have emergency supplies on hand:** Make sure to have plenty of water, non-perishable food, flashlights, batteries, and other emergency supplies on hand in case of power outages or flooding.

Do's & Don'ts during Earthquake

Port Blair, May 24

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to geological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts (Zone -V) of the world and several great earthquakes have occurred in the past. The severe earthquake that occurred on December 26, 2004 caused horizontal and vertical shift of land mass in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, which caused the loss of lives and property of this UT.

Considering the above, the Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has urged the general public of A&N Islands to adhere to the Do's & Don'ts of Earthquake to mitigate the impact of earthquake and save their precious lives.

Before Earthquake

- Consult a structural engineer to make your house earthquake resilient.
- Fasten shelves securely to walls; place heavy/ large objects on lower shelves. Provide strong support to power and gas appliances.
- Prepare an emergency kit with essential items for safety and survival.
- Develop an emergency communication and evacuation plan for your family and community.
- Learn the technique of 'Duck-Cover-Hold.
- Educate yourself and family members about earthquake risk by participating in earthquake safety programmes.

During Earthquake

If you're indoors, stay inside. If you're outside, stay outside.

- Don't use matches, candles, or any flame. Broken gas lines and fire don't mix.
- If you are in a car, stop the car and stay inside until the earthquake stops.
- Duck under a table; Cover your head with one hand and hold the table till the tremors last.
- Stay away from mirrors and windows. Do not exit the building while the earth is still shaking.
- Move outside as soon as the tremors stop. Do not use a lift.
- When outside, move away from buildings, trees, walls and poles/electric lines.
- When inside a vehicle, pull over in an open place and remain inside, avoid bridges.

After Earthquake

- Do not enter damaged buildings.
- If trapped in rubble: Do not light a matchstick Cover your mouth with a cloth Tap on a pipe or a wall Sound a whistle
- Use stairs and not lifts or elevators.
- Move cautiously and check for unstable objects and other hazards above and around you. Check yourself for injuries.
- Stay away from beaches. Tsunamis and seiches sometimes hit after the ground stops shaking.
- Do not spread and/ or believe in rumours.

Precautionary measures during Tsunami

The Andaman & Nicobar Islands are prone to Geological and Hydro-meteorological disasters and located in one of the most seismically active parts of the world and vulnerable to earthquake and tsunami disasters. Tsunamis are powerful and dangerous natural disasters that can cause devastating damage and loss of life. The Directorate of Disaster Management, A&N Administration has requested the general public of A&N Islands to follow the Do's & Don'ts of Tsunami, if it occurs.

DO's:

- **Pay attention to tsunami warnings:** If you live in a coastal area or are visiting one, make sure to be aware of any tsunami warnings issued by the authorities.

a tsunami warning is issued, move to higher ground immediately. Do not wait for official instructions or for the wave to arrive.

- **Follow evacuation orders:** If authorities issue an evacuation order, follow it immediately. Do not delay or hesitate.
- **Stay tuned to local news:** Stay tuned to local news and radio stations for updates on the situation.
- **Be prepared:** Have an emergency kit ready, including food, water, medications, and important documents.

DON'Ts:

- **Don't stay in low-lying areas:** If you are in a low-lying area and a tsunami warning is issued, do not stay there. Move to higher ground immediately.
- **Don't go to the coast to watch the wave:** Tsunamis are not a

spectator sport. Stay away from the coast and do not go there to watch the wave.

- **Don't use the beach as a shelter:** Do not use the beach or shoreline as a shelter during a tsunami. The wave can be much higher than the normal tide level and can quickly flood the area.
- **Don't use elevators:** If you are in a building during a tsunami, do not use the elevators. Use the stairs instead.
- **Don't return to the area until it is safe:** After a tsunami, do not return to the area until authorities declare it safe to do so.

A&N Police issues advisory regarding fake delivery parcel scam to get OTPs from targeted victims

Port Blair, May 24

As people become more aware about the methods used by cybercriminals, they are getting creative, developing new methods for fraud. Cybercriminals are perpetrating a new scam targeting many people to get OTPs (One Time Passwords) for making fraudulent bank transactions and getting access to the victims' email addresses/ smart phones by manipulating them with Fake Delivery Parcel Scam. These scams are often carried out by people who work closely with delivery agents or delivery agencies. When they find out that a particular person receives a lot of packages from various e-commerce companies, then they plan to target him.

In this regard, Andaman and Nicobar Police has issued the following advisory to safeguard the



citizens:

- Confirm your order history and the potential delivery dates before accepting / cancelling any package.
- Avoid clicking on any link received in an SMS when dealing with such package deliveries.
- Scrutinize all the URLs (links) before opening and filling in any information/ OTP.
- Avoid sharing your personal details such as address, email id, phone

number, etc. if not required.

- Avoid clicking on a link or calling back the number from an unexpected delivery notice via a SMS or email.

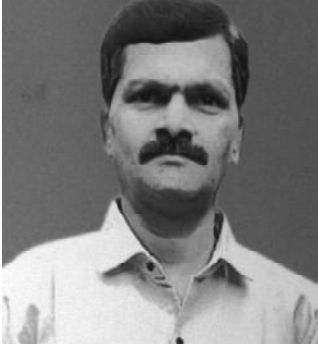
